Pastor Graham Baird to Speak at CARP

Annual Carpinteria Retreat, Sept. 12-14

The Reverend Graham Baird, who recently pub-▲ lished his first book, One Hundred Years of Ministry: A Practical Guide for Pastors and Church Leaders, which discusses the leadership legacy of his family and of which he is the fourth generation to become a pastor, will lead the Carpinteria retreat this year. Most recently, Baird was senior pastor at First Presbyterian Church of Colorado Springs, but his passion is for spreading God's love and meeting people where they are at through church planting.

Prior to moving to Colorado, Baird founded Highlands Church in Paso Robles, CA, where he met Pastor Dan Stevens, who was living there at the time. Pastor Dan said that some of the things he appreciates about Baird are that "He always made me think. He was always challenging, but he was always gracious." Baird and his wife, Star, are currently planting a new church in Camarillo, called Mission Street Church, which will begin services this fall.

Baird is a graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary and is currently earning his Doctorate from Fuller Seminary. A dynamic speaker, he is a widely soughtafter nationally and in 1990 won the National Oratory

Championship.

A Sacred Space

Recently, I read a book called Listening to Children on the Spiritual Journey- A Guide for Those Who Teach and Nurture, by Catherine Stonehouse and Scottie May. This book emphasized the importance of guiding our children into knowing God, and experiencing his love, rather than simply learning about Him.

This past year, the goal of our Early Childhood Ministry has been to teach children about their heavenly father, the kind, gentle, perfect God who created everything, including each of them, who cares for each of them and loves them unconditionally. We have been teaching simple lessons each week, singing songs together, making crafts and doing activities to drive home this message. It has been a great time of joy and growth in the lives of the children. However, the fast, fun pace of it all leaves little time for children to reflect and wonder about this amazing God.

The authors argue that children also need a quiet place to be with God- whatever that looks like for them. They also reasoned that children are capable of having authentic faith and a growing relationship with Jesus. I agree with them, after all, Jesus said "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to those who are like these children" (Matthew 19:14).

So, I am working on creating a space within the Early Childhood Education Area that will allow children to take part in what has been called Reflective Engagement. Reflective Engagement starts with "creating a calm, quiet yet engaging place—free from most distrac-



tions—where children can be with God. The purpose of the space is regularly articulated to the children, planting in their hearts and minds the fact that God desires to be with them and that they can talk to God who will listen and will speak to them". Following the lesson, "children have time and opportunity to choose how they want to respond". Our job is to set the stage, and "God's presence will be real and the Spirit will be the teacher, revealing to each child what he or she most needs to hear from God" (Stonehouse & May).

To create this space, I will be transforming an extra room that is within the Nursery into a "Sacred Space". It will be a cozy environment with deep indigo walls, twinkle lights and couches. There will be soft worship music, easels to paint or draw on, and even ribbons for dancing. We will allow children to go into this space following the lesson if they want to, and they will be able to reflect on the story however they choose.

I am eager to see the ways that God moves in the hearts of our children, and I am looking forward to learning from their questions and their faith! It is such a privilege to be able to teach children about our wonderful God! Thank you to all of our volunteers and donors who make our program run so smoothly, your contributions are greatly appreciated.
