# Prison Ministry News

Emmanuel's Prison Ministry was invited to participate in the Mission Expo at Moorpark Presbyterian Church on October 6.

Bob and Mo Fitch represented Emmanuel and set up a comprehensive display of Get On The Bus photos, Pen Pal applications, a Fire Camp 13 Christmas gift bag and an assortment of handouts related to prison ministry, its mission and outreach. These included a program to provide textbooks for incarcerated ladies taking college courses; a page of Biblical references titled "What Jesus and the writer of Hebrews say" in relation to prisoners and the Christian's need to remember those in prison; facts about incarcerated women; the Spiritual Daily Dozen, an encouragement to trust God in all circumstances. One of the more interesting "drop bys" was a retired sheriff's deputy who is a member at Moorpark Presbyterian. Two contacts were made with other groups that may lead to a further expansion of Emmanuel's Prison Ministry.



This was the second year of taking part in Moorpark's Mission Expo. 12 Emmanuelites comprise the Prison Ministry and everyone is welcome to be part of this outreach to help the forgotten and lonely in prison.
