

Vacation Bible School—Two Different Opportunities this Summer

This summer we are offering two week long opportunities for children and adults to engage in faith learning and formation. Many of you remember the Vacation Bible School (VBS) or Vacation Church School (VCS) from your youth. You came to church over five or ten days during the summer learning different stories from the Bible. You sang songs, made crafts, played outdoors—if you were lucky, there was a mini-wading pool—ate a small snack, and drank the red "bug" juice. There were a lot of moms and a couple dads who helped out during the week making sure they shared God's story with all the kids. I remember fondly singings songs with the autoharp accompanying us, going from classroom to classroom, running around, and hearing stories of Jesus throughout the week.



We've been blessed here at Epiphany to continue the tradition of a daytime Vacation Bible school, typically held the third week in July. This year July 20-

24 from 8:45 –12 Noon, our church building with be filled with over 100 children and 50 or more volunteers. With the help of our wonderful VBS Directors, Kristy Anderson, Jennifer Baker and Sarah Bergh, plans are well underway. Many of you have volunteered to help, some even taking time off from work, and others have signed up children to participate. We are thankful for the many dads, grandparents, moms, and youth who volunteer to make this week a success each year.

We will have a great experience at *Camp Discovery* this year learning new songs at S'more Fun Music, creating neat crafts at Wilderness Crafts, eating scrumptious snacks at Campfire Snacks, playing fun games at Splash-n-Dash games, and hearing the awesome stories of God's love for us at Treetop Storytelling. Children ages 3 through rising 5th grade are welcome to join us a participants, and youth in rising 6th grade through high school are welcome to serve as youth guides and helpers. Adults of all ages are welcome to serve as site guides and age group guides. You can register online on the church website under the "forms" tab or you can fill out a form found in the Commons.

What is really exciting for Epiphany this summer, is the introduction of a **NEW WEEK of VBS**. This week will differ from our traditional week of VBS, because it will be a Family VBS over the course of five evenings. *Hometown Nazareth: Where Jesus was a Kid* is the theme for our second week, which will be August 2-6 from 5:30-7:30 pm. This week is open to families of all ages and sizes, whether you have children at home or no children, whether you are a family of 1 or 10. We will all gather each evening in Price Hall for a light supper and opening worship, and then move with our assigned Tribes to different areas of the church building to hear stories of Jesus, and engage in activities with the villagers of Nazareth. Registration for this week will begin in April.

Many of you have asked why this second week, and why a Family VBS? This second week offers another opportunity for us to gather and grow in relationship with each other and God. Some families have been unable to participate in our daytime week of VBS due to vacation or work schedules. It is a Family VBS, because adults are learning and growing in their faith alongside children. We do that every Sunday when we gather together for worship. As the people of God, our faith is continually formed and molded. I have as much to learn about God from a 60 year old, as I do from a 2 year old. We all want to experience the joy of belonging to God's people, and what better way than by learning together and being Church together.

A Note from Pastor Phillip

At its March meeting, Congregation Council voted to form a Long-range/Vision Team in order to help chart the congregation's mission strategy for the next 5-10 years. Council charged this Long-Range Team with several tasks: (1) to update the congregation's mission statement and logo, or "brand"; (2) to discern and suggest an overall mission and ministry outreach for next 5-10 years, looking at the results from the Transition Task Force and the most recent long-range planning that the congregation undertook (2009); and (3) to address necessary upgrades and additions to current physical facility. Understandably, all three of these tasks are inter-related. Council views them as all very important to the life and future of Christ's ministry in this place. Nine members of the congregation have been approached to serve on this team, and we are thankful that they have all responded enthusiastically. Those people are Rob McClintock, Richard Ashpole, Cathy DeLesDernier, Jeremy Schenk, Kim Greenshields, Caryn Palmgren, Katie Nelson, Caroline Wake, and Brendan Paget. Some of the current staff will also serve on the team.

The team will begin meeting very soon to begin listening to each other and to the call of the Holy Spirit in this time and place. Where will God lead us? How will we continue to serve our surrounding communities with the love of Christ? What are our challenges? What are our strengths? Now that you know who they are, feel free to "bend their ear" if you have thoughts or ideas about our congregation's ministries and areas of growth and potential. Most importantly, please remember them in your prayers as they take up these very important and exciting tasks on behalf of us all...and on behalf of the people who, through Christ, we may yet reach.



Week 2—Hometown Nazareth


All Ages are welcome to join us Sunday, August 2—August 6, 2015 5:30 pm—7:30 pm (dinner included)



March 3, 1955 - As a result of the sale of parcels of land at Three Chopt and Horsepen Roads and Grace Street and Horsepen Road, overall indebtedness of the Church was reduced by \$30,500 to \$24,000 for the Church and \$12,000 for the parsonage.


