"Come, Lord Jesus, our guest to be, And bless these gifts bestowed by Thee."
-Moravian table blessing

As a child growing up in Moravian country, I prayed this with my family before many, many meals. In fact, I often thought of it as our "fancy" blessing, since we reserved its use for more important holiday meals when extended family members were present. At the time, the words struck me as slightly odd. Extra chairs were crowded around the dining room table, at the kitchen table, and at the card table set up for the kids in the family room. There were already guests everywhere. How would there be room for one more, even if it were Jesus?



Sometimes I wonder if we don't accidentally slip into the same mentality when we're at church. Could our familiar patterns of behavior while we're gathered for worship and faith formation—Sunday mornings especially—send the message that everyone we know and care about is already here? It seems there are so many of us! We stand around in groups and have a good time catching up with people we get to see only once a week. Some of us are busy, busy, setting up for Sunday School, music ministries, or worship. With so much activity and with such a sea of faces, it's easy to think that people who don't know us well or who are new to our community will figure out, much like we did, how to fit in.

Congregation Council and staff have been reading recent research which suggests that when we do this and adopt this view, even inadvertently, we end up treating people new to our community more like *visitors* than as *guests*. It may seem like a small difference in terminology, but it can lead to a big shift in mindset. After all, guests are invited; visitors just show up. "Guest" sounds like someone with whom you hope to deepen a relationship; "visitor" sounds like something you expect to be temporary. And when you have people to your house, you call them guests, not visitors, don't you? Should a church home be any different? Did you realize that 57 newcomers worship with us, on average, each month? What if we started thinking about these people who worship with us occasionally—be they here on vacation or new residents of the area looking for a congregation—as guests? What if we actually started calling them that?



Like many of you, I have long tried to extend a welcome each Sunday morning to our visitors, but now I'm going to try to be more intentional in thinking of them and referring to them as *guests*. Perhaps it will help me focus a little less on the things I'm doing at the moment and a little more on those who are new to Epiphany, and maybe even new to Christ. Perhaps it will shift the responsibility of hospitality back to me, rather than expecting new folks to find a way to fit in on their own. Can you join me in this? Maybe such a small change won't have an effect at all. Yet even if it doesn't, I do think that it may help remind me in some way what my family's "fancy" prayer was trying to communicate all along: that in receiving anyone in Christ's name, we are receiving Christ himself. One guest—or one visitor—is therefore enough to bless our gathering each morning.



## Special Concert Opportunity – We Still Need Help!

The premier choral ensemble at Muskingum University, the Muskingum Concert Choir, from New Concord, Ohio, will present a concert at **7:30 p.m. Friday evening, March 6, 2015 in our sanctuary**. The ensemble performs sacred and secular music from a variety of cultures and historical periods, from Renaissance pieces to contemporary choral works. Each year the Concert Choir presents numerous concerts on and off campus, both independently and in collaboration with the Muskingum Choral Society and the Southeastern Ohio Symphony Orchestra. Recent national and international tours have taken members of the choir to New York City, Philadelphia, St. Louis, Nashville, Salzburg, Vienna, and Lucerne. The concert is part of their 2015 concert tour.



Muskingum University (New Concord, Ohio) is a four-year liberal arts institution affiliated with the Presbyterian Church—USA. Founded in

1837 as Muskingum College, Muskingum University educates approximately 2,400 undergraduate and graduate students each year on its 215-acre campus, nestled in the scenic hills of southeastern Ohio.

Epiphany Youth Group is a ministry to and with youth in grades 7-12.



#### FIRST COMMUNION CLASSES

Do you have a 4th or 5th grader?

Epiphany Lutheran Church offers classes on Holy Communion to 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders. These classes will be held during the Sunday School time (beginning at 9:45am) on **March 15, 22,** and **29**. These classes, led by the pastors, are intended for children who will be receiving their first Holy Communion this year or who have previously been admitted to Holy Communion but have not yet received formal instruction from the church. First Communion will be held on Maundy Thursday, April 2, when we commemorate the institution of the Lord's Supper. Parents wanting their children to participate should contact the church office at 282-6066. All children who complete the instruction will receive a Holy Communion certificate on April 2.



Because our denomination's governing documents regarding sacramental practice, *The Use of the Means of Grace*, do not suggest or propose any particular age-limit or requirement for admittance to Holy Communion (other than baptism), parents may request for their children to receive Holy Communion prior to the 4<sup>th</sup> grade classes. Parents who wish to do so are asked to write a letter to the pastors and request a meeting for discussion.

#### SIMPLY GIVING

Since early times in Christianity, it has been the custom to present gifts to God at the altar. At first these gifts were a share of a harvest or livestock. Later, when currency was invented, the gifts were placed in a plate on the altar. In more modern times the churches began the use of offering envelopes for he gifts that would be collected in the passing of the plates and then presented at the altar.



This system has worked well for many years and is part of our weekly worship services. This, however, requires a lot of manpower to count, control for safekeeping, depositing at the bank, and the recording of individual records for taxes.

At present, with the power of the internet and electronic tools, one can transfer monetary funds immediately without the use of paper being exchanged. As you know, there are credit cards, debit cards, smart phones, apps, bank bill payment programs, and Bit coins.

In late 2013, the church initiated a program, SIMPLY GIVING, where funds are automatically transferred periodically from your bank account to the church bank account. Thus eliminating the writing of individual checks, having the proper change, and the use of envelopes. This will be less costly and more efficient for all parties involved. The system has internal controls and safeguards to protect your privacy. This arrangement can be adjusted or canceled at any time.

Approximately 40 church members are using this system at this time with no problems. Some members, however, have stated that they are uneasy when on Sunday the offering plate is passed and they have nothing to place in the plate. To feel a part of the service in presenting their gift for God's work, it is suggested that those who feel this way should place their empty offering envelopes in the plate with SG (Simply Giving) noted on the envelopes.

# Thrivent Financial Members – Don't Forget to Direct Thrivent Choice Dollars by March 31<sup>st</sup>!

**Here's how Thrivent Choice works:** If you are a Thrivent member, you may have Thrivent Choice Dollars allocated in your name. As a benefit of membership, you have the option of directing those dollars to an approved charitable organization, such as Epiphany. Your designations must be done annually, so if you have designated donation dollars to Epiphany in the past, you must do so again for 2015 for Epiphany to benefit. The deadline for designating Thrivent's charitable donation dollars is March 31<sup>st</sup>.

In 2013, Epiphany was the recipient of more than \$6,000 in donations from Thrivent, thanks to a matching campaign that year for member designations to churches and the designations of Thrivent members. While we don't know when another church matching campaign will take place, we do know that there are currently undesignated dollars available at Thrivent, which could help Epiphany fulfill its mission and support its programs, if these designations were made.

To find out how many Thrivent Choice Dollars a Thrivent member has and to direct those dollars, call **800-847-4836** and when prompted, say "**Thrivent Choice.**" **Then Press 1** to direct Choice Dollars or **2** to hear Thrivent Choice program terms and conditions. (If prompted, say or enter your phone number and date of birth.) **Note:** Please have your nine-digit Member Identification Number or contract number available. A representative will work with you to direct Choice Dollars.
