

You will not be surprised to learn that one of my favorite movies is the 2011 comedy, "The Big Year," starring Steve Martin, Owen Wilson, and Jack Black. The movie tells the story of three competitive birders who all seek to have a "big year": one calendar year in which they see a record number of different bird species. It is a funny film, and one that actually is grounded in truth. Funny as it sounds, there are people who compete to have a "big year." It's a real thing!



Without a doubt, Epiphany is finishing out a "big year"—indeed, one of the busiest years in its history. Within the span of eleven months, we'll have convened four congregational meetings (by contrast, in a typical year we have one), issued two new pastoral calls, and acquired a new piece of property. Those were the big occasions, perhaps, but a lot of work went on behind-the-scenes, too. A transition task force presented the results of its study and survey. Two different call committees assembled and completed their work. An *ad hoc* committee investigated the possibilities of purchasing that property at 7109 W. Grace Street, and a whole host of volunteers helped make that happen. As it turns out, it seems there was a sense of "divine timing" involved in all of this. Just as we claimed possession of the new house, we called an associate pastor who wants to live there temporarily. Perfect! Big Year!

While all of this transition was going on, the regular, day-to-day ministries of our congregation hummed along with remarkable consistency and vitality. The Spirit's wisdom has been present in this, too, for that consistency was helpful. It was comforting to know that programs like our music ministries, community service, faith formation, confirmation, and youth programs (just to name a few) would continue in much the same way they always had. Somewhere in the midst of this we raised money to purchase over 600 mosquito nets for the ELCA Malaria Campaign...the highest number in the Synod!

One might wonder if all this change and extra work has made us tired. I don't think so. Has it made us excited? You bet! I hear and sense from many of you an enthusiasm about our future. At our fellowship gatherings, team meetings, and Bible studies, I notice that you are not dwelling on the challenges of transition, but instead are thinking about our next big steps. This is inspiring to me. I am eager to get that process started. I am also looking forward to having Pastor Joseph and his family add to that enthusiasm and contribute their ideas for our ministry together.

There will certainly be challenges and additional transitions as we begin this joint collaboration and ideagenerating, but I am hopeful that God will be leading us. As we round out this big year, join me in giving thanks for the work of all of our ministries, including the call committees, the property team, our staff and other volunteers.

I also ask you to listen to the Stewardship Team in its build-up for Consecration Sunday on December 7 and consider how you might feel God calling you to be a part of our ministries in the coming year. It promises to be a big one, too!

OFFICIAL NOTICE OF THE ANNUAL MEETING AT EPIPHANY EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH

Sunday, November 16, 2014

The annual meeting of the congregation of Epiphany Evangelical Lutheran Church will be held on Sunday, November 16 with a congregational lunch in Price Hall immediately following the 11 am service.

Please signup in the Commons for the lunch.

The Rev. James F. Mauney, Bishop of the Virginia Synod of the ELCA, will be with us during worship on November 16.

Childcare will be available during the meeting.

A portion of the agenda will include:

- 1. The election of Congregational Council members.
- 2. The adoption of a 2015 operating budget.
- 3. The congregation will consider passing two proposed bylaws at the November Congregational Meeting:

Authorize Council to disburse at its discretion amounts in the dedicated Thanksgiving, Christmas, Lenten, and Easter Offering accounts; and Authorize the Council to expend at its discretion a contingency amount not to exceed \$10,000 of non-dedicated 2014 surplus (with any of such amount not disbursed by March 1, 2015 reverting to unrestricted surplus).

Please note: The Finance Ministry Team will host an informal question-and-answer session on the proposed budget on Sunday, November 9 during the Sunday school hour, in the Parlor, and on Wednesday, November 12 at 7 pm., in the Chapel.



The following nominees have been endorsed by the Nominating Committee and the council: Amy Boyle, Lyle Gleason and Ramona Schaeffer, are nominated for full terms (three years), Nominations from the floor during the annual congregational meeting will be entertained under the following conditions. (1) The nominee must have been contacted and agreed to serve; (2) The nominee must be present at the meeting; and (3) The nominee must be prepared to make a short biographical sketch similar to the written statements by the other nominees.





Why do we have a choir?

Music plays an integral part in our worship service. Can you imagine a Sunday morning worship service at Epiphany without any music at all? It would definitely be a different experience! To help with the musical parts of our worship, we are fortunate to have two chancel choirs (one for each service) to lead and guide us. Besides adding beauty to the service, they help to proclaim the Word. They help us to retell the Gospel story. Our choirs assist in proclaiming the gospel in worship:

- •The choirs supply rehearsed voices to help worshipers sing new or perhaps more difficult hymns.
- •The choir adds to the joy of hymn singing by offering special settings either of particular stanzas or as part of anthem offereings.
- •The choir assists the pastor, too. It shares our Scripture readings, often with a different take than we might hear fromwords alone. Choirs anthems are carefully chosen to reflect the theme of the day. In these anthems, the good news is again proclaimed in a different fashion than we might hear from the pulpit.

Wednesday Evening Offerings


