Continuing The Ministry of Small Groups: Spiritual Formation and Building Relationships

“Passionate worship” is an important way to encounter with God and to experience the love and grace of God, but Sunday worship on its own doesn’t offer enough opportunity for growth and depth in our spiritual formation in Christ and in our relationships with one another. John Wesley understood that Christianity is a social religion. Participating in a community that promises to watch over one another in love is necessary for Christians. Wesley knew that from Scripture, tradition, reason, and experience that holiness is both a gift and a process of character formation that requires participation in relationships of love and trust in small groups.

I want thank Pastor Kelly for her ground work in small groups at Fair Oaks. I heard that there were 21 people who participated in two groups (day and evening) last year. I would like to continue on with the ministry of small groups in our Fair Oaks faith community beginning this fall. We will offer two different groups this fall: A new group for *Blueprint for Discipleship* (Pastor Kelly used *A Blueprint for Discipleship* by Kevin Watson for this small group class last year) and another group using the *Companions in Christ* series from The Upper Room for those who have completed *Blueprint*. The *Companions in Christ* group will meet together on Wednesday evenings from 7:00-8:30 p.m beginning September 28th. The *Blueprint* class will be held on Thursday nights from 7:00-8:30pm beginning September 29th. As Pastor Kelly has done in the past, the groups will be limited to 10 participants; however, if more people are interested, I would be delighted to offer more than one group and will find another day to do this.

The ministry of small group is not a strange, new thing to Methodist churches. In John Wesley’s time, the Methodists were known as the people who knew that Christian formation took place in small groups known as “classes,” “bands” and “select societies.” Methodists meant to form small groups that “watched over one another in love” to help each other grow in holiness of heart and life. The Rev. Steven W. Manskar, a director of Wesleyan leadership at the General Board of Discipleship, reminds us of the effectiveness of small group ministry: “As human beings created in the image of God, we are made for relationship, and we have capacity and need to give and receive love. We become fully the persons God created us to be only through a matrix of relationships God provides by grace. Loving relationships are as important to our life and health as food water and air. The relationships God provides through small groups are as essential to Christian formation as worship, Scripture and prayer” (*Interpreter* March/April 2011). I believe that small groups provide the compass and support for the journey toward holiness of heart and life.

I hope and pray that the ministry of small groups will continue to offer us a great opportunity to build up one another through sharing the depth of relationship, vulnerability and care which help us in our spiritual growth.

I am excited to have an opportunity to meet you and to grow together in Christ. I hope you’ll join me!

When a new family moved into the community, they were welcomed with gifts from people's pantry such as a pound of flour or sugar or butter, hence the term a pounding. Let's open our pantry and look around our homes to share with Pastor Jeong and his family. Let's show them how happy we are that they are joining our church family/community. Here is a list of items that the Park family would find useful:

The funds are invested in a manner that stresses social justice and social usefulness as well as financial return and financial security. The CANVUMF funds seek to:

- Screen out companies with substantial interests in tobacco, alcohol, gambling, armaments, and pornographic materials.
- Invest whenever possible in companies that make a positive contribution to society, such as in employee relations, community relations or environmental responsibility.
- Follow the ethical mandates of the United Methodist Book of Discipline in all investments.

We are confirming our beliefs and principles in our investments.

Church Council Financial Report By Bria Stevens

Hello Fair Oaks UMC Friends & Family,

We wanted to update everyone on the financial situation discussed at Tuesday's Church Council meeting. As many of you know, we are in the process of re-doing our budget due to a deficit incurred through our transition between pastors. On Tuesday night, we were able to reach a consensus about how to reduce our deficit by around \$4,000.

As a result of Tuesday's brainstorming, at this moment, we are facing a \$6,000 deficit between now and the end of the year. We have an immediate need for \$3,900 due to a few large bills that we will be receiving in the next few months. Renee Meyer, our finance chair, recently distributed 6 month statements. If you have not received one from her in worship, you should be receiving one in the mail. **Council has decided to reconvene in a few weeks (August 11th at 6:30pm in Spencer) in hopes that many of us who are behind in pledges can catch up so that we have a stronger sense of where we are before we proceed further. Please prayerfully consider ways that you can help us with this deficit whether it is through catching up on missed pledges, increasing your pledges, organizing and assisting with fundraisers, praying daily for the needs of the church, coming to future Council meetings, joining Renee on the Finance Team, etc. Any and all help is needed.**

Money is never a comfortable issue for churches or families to address - it's personal and emotional - and in this economy, money is a particularly stressful topic. I am proud to be a member of a church that is handling these financial issues in such an honorable, compassionate and sensitive way. Pastor Jeong recently spoke about his desire for Fair Oaks UMC to be God's kingdom where the love of Christ prevails in us so that we can transform the world. He said that we are like small seeds when we are separate and on our own, but when we work together, we become fruitful trees. He called this a miracle. That's what you all are to me - I have faith that together we'll make it through this difficult time.

From the Finance Corner

Greetings and peace in the name of Jesus! After July's Council meeting, I am finally breathing a little easier. As you know, I sent an email out in early July stating that I was putting a temporary spending freeze on all aspects of FOUMC. That was a tough decision for me, and I took a little heat for it, but the Council Meeting was attended by several others than Committee Heads, and I appreciated that SO much. Since my original email, I was able to revise some aspects of the budget and bring it down to just under \$10,000.00. That is where we started at the Council Meeting.

Fifteen heads were obviously better than one. In three hours of discussion, primarily about money, almost \$4,000.00 got shaved off the budget and a lot of creative ideas came to light. It was a very productive meeting, and all of the attendees at Council were able to see the "real picture." The result of that meeting gave us a little breathing space, but we have to keep moving forward and figure out how to make up the \$6,000 deficit that remains. **There will be an emergency additional Council Meeting on Thursday, August 11 at 6:30 pm.** The people that were at the July meeting know the seriousness of where FOUMC is financially, and that is why I would like to invite everyone to attend that meeting. We are ALL ministers of FOUMC, and all of us play a part with our various gifts; EVERY idea needs to be heard!

A motion was made and passed to change the Calendar Fiscal Year (January to December) to a mid-year Fiscal Year (July to June). This will be incredibly beneficial in that the District UMC's fiscal year also runs July to June. LMS will be better able to manage finances with this plan as their school year runs August through June. Finally, mid-year budget revisions will no longer be necessary. The way that we will transition into this schedule will be for Council to meet in August, update the budget for the remainder of this year and then do a Six-Month budget from January to June, then plan a new annual budget. This will also mean that there will be two pledge drives over a six-month period as income projections cannot be made without a Stewardship Program. All of these details will be worked out along the way.

Right now, the BIGGEST matter at hand is figuring out how to make ends meet through the remainder of 2011. One hundred heads will be better than 15. That said, I would like to re-extend my invitation to attend the emergency Council Meeting on Thurs, Aug 11 at 630 pm. The love people feel when being the "new kid" on the block at FOUMC cannot be matched. I've said it before, and I'll say it over and over: When we get backed up against a wall, all of you are there ready to help out in whatever way is needed to get the job done. I look forward to our meeting in August, where, I predict that the now \$6,000 deficit will meet its match! May the peace which passes ALL understanding keep your hearts and minds on Christ Jesus!

St Mark's Welcomes Jennifer Knapp & Bishop Gene Robinson to the Moon Lecture Series Friday, August 12th at 7:30pm

Bishop Gene Robinson is widely known for being the first openly gay, non-celibate priest to be ordained a bishop in a major Christian denomination believing in the historic episcopate. After his election, some theologically conservative parishes have aligned themselves with bishops outside the Episcopal Church in the United States, a process called the Anglican realignment. His story has appeared in print and film. In April 2009, Robinson made the *Out Magazine* Third Annual Power 50 list of the most influential gay men and women in the USA, landing at number 7.

Jennifer Knapp is best known for her first hit single "Undo Me" from her debut album *Kansas* (1998), and the song "A Little More" from her Grammy Award-nominated album *Lay It Down* (2000). *The Way I Am* (2001), was also nominated for a Grammy. In total, the three albums have sold approximately 1 million copies. After taking a 7-year hiatus, Knapp announced in September 2009 that she was returning to music. On May 11, 2010 she released her newest album *Letting Go* with the hit single "Dive In." The album debuted at #73 on the Billboard Hot 200 chart. In several interviews published in April 2010, Knapp announced that she is a lesbian and has been in a same-sex relationship since 2002. Despite her sexual orientation, Knapp says that she not only still holds to her Christian faith, but feels that by being honest about her sexuality, her faith is actually enhanced.
