The birth of new life is the core of Jesus' resurrection in our Christian faith. He brought light in the darkness and life in place of death. Every four years, the delegates of United Methodist Church (the 988 delegates and 4000 volunteers) come together as a General Conference (the legislative body of our denomination to set policies and pass resolutions in the church and society). This year, General Conference is on April 24-May 4 in Tampa, Fla. The theme of the 2012 gathering is "Make Disciples of Jesus Christ to Transform the World." Our denomination's leaders want to draw our attention to the reality and refocus us on our mission "to make disciples" in our church. We all are aware of the decline in our denomination in the U.S. There is research, saying: "If nothing changes, the United Methodist Church in the U.S. will have less than one million people within four decades (now eight million people), and we will also have closed at least 20,000-33,583 churches in the U.S."

How can we bring new life from death? During 2010, a team of clergy and laity from around the world studied and worked together to set the appropriate measures/goals that demonstrate a congregation's health and vitality. The group came up with the goals that must be about discipleship and what disciples do. They report that healthy congregations make and engage disciples. The council of Bishops in our denomination affirmed the necessity of doing this work for each local church beginning in 2012.

The group identifies five goals:

- Disciples worship-worship attendance
- Disciples make new disciples-number of new members
- Disciples engage in growing their faith- number of small groups to grow the faith of disciples
- Disciples engage in mission-number of members engaged through the church in community and world mission
- Disciples give to mission-amount of money given beyond the local church for community and world mission.

These goals are indicators of healthy ministry that is bearing fruit. Our Cal-Nevada Conference asked all local churches to participate in "checking our vital signs," and every local church was asked to make a report every week since January this year. In this season of new life and new beginnings, I want to ask myself and our congregation whether we are the disciples of Jesus Christ who are willing to "make disciples" or not before we want to "transform" the world. I hope that we can understand and join our denomination's new movement and our conference's vision to revitalize churches in the work of our ministries.

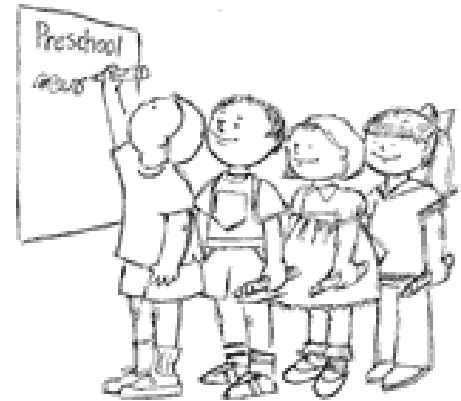




Preschool Study Committee Report

At the request of the Church Council, a group of interested church members spent 5 weeks studying the financial status of Little Methodist School and making recommendations to improve its financial forecast for the coming 2012/2013 school year. Discussions centered on improving income through increased enrollment, raising tuition and registration fees, and brainstorming various marketing strategies to implement.



Little Methodist School was first organized in 1964 as an outreach to the local community. From its modest beginning in what is now the tool shed behind Spencer Bldg., LMS grew to become a strong presence in the Fair Oaks Community during the 1970's, 1980's and 1990's. At one time, LMS employed more than seven teachers and a director, operating in 5 of the classrooms in Potter, Davidson, and Rice on the lower level of our campus. Today, the school employs 3 teachers and a director and serves children ages 2 to 5 in three classrooms. There are currently about 37 students enrolled.

The current philosophy statement for LMS follows: *Little Methodist School is a nonprofit, parent participation preschool and toddler program that is a ministry of Fair Oaks United Methodist Church. We uphold Christian values and provide a nurturing atmosphere for a child's spiritual, social, emotional, physical, and cognitive development. We believe that each child is a unique gift to be treasured. Little Methodist School strives to create a positive relationship between the church and the community.*

The Study Group researched current tuition fees charged by similar preschools in the community and established a new rate for tuition, increased registration fees, and calculated actual expenses for the school year 2012-2013. Assuming a projection of 41 students, (current number of attendees plus about one more per classroom), and the continued employment of 3 teachers and the director, expenses could be met. If enrollment warranted it, a classroom aide could be hired when needed. Tom Wold used a spreadsheet program to project how this could be achieved. In addition, this should generate enough income to cover the costs of maintenance, bookkeeping, liability insurance, and utilities that the church had previously paid and would now like to have assumed by LMS. In order to increase enrollment in LMS by next September, a number of marketing strategies were suggested. All were evaluated on cost and effectiveness factors:

Preschool Study Committee Report *cont.*

On the motion of the members of the Little Methodist Study Group, the Church Council voted on February 28, 2012, that LMS continue for the 2012-2013 year with implementation of the plan suggested to raise tuition and registration fees along with the use of marketing techniques with the goal that Little Methodist School meet all expenses. The Study Group will provide oversight, support and monitoring. The Chairman of the LMS Board will report to Church Council monthly regarding the current status of the school. A quarterly report will be made to the Church Council by the LMS Study Group after it meets with Finance Committee.

Through the support of LMS parents and staff, the LMS Study Group, the members of the church, and with the approval of FOUMC Church Council, it is forecast that LMS will be able to continue to serve the children of our local community, meet its positive financial forecast, and assume the expenses previously assumed by the church. We hope that LMS can once again become a strong influence in the community as it approaches its 50th Anniversary year in 2014.

Looking for New Liturgists By Bria Stevens

The word *liturgy* comes from the Greek word "leitourgia" meaning "service." If you are looking for a new way to serve God and our congregation, consider being a liturgist one Sunday. Something special happens when you prepare to read scripture aloud; you connect with it and with the congregation in new and meaningful ways. You become linked to the text all week, and the

congregation is enriched by hearing the ancient yet living words of scripture brought to life by your unique voice.

In her memoir, *Leaving Church*, Barbara Brown Taylor describes the experience of hearing scripture read by different voices in this way: "Although we could have sat quietly with Bibles on our laps and read these things to ourselves, we took turns reading them out loud to each other instead. The words sounded different when Kline read it than they did when Kathy read them. They sounded different from the mouth of a young mother than they did from the mouth of a widow. This was because the words did not come straight off the page. They percolated up through the silt and gravel of real people's lives so that the meaning in them was fluid, not fixed." Your life, your voice and your spirit are valuable to us in worship.

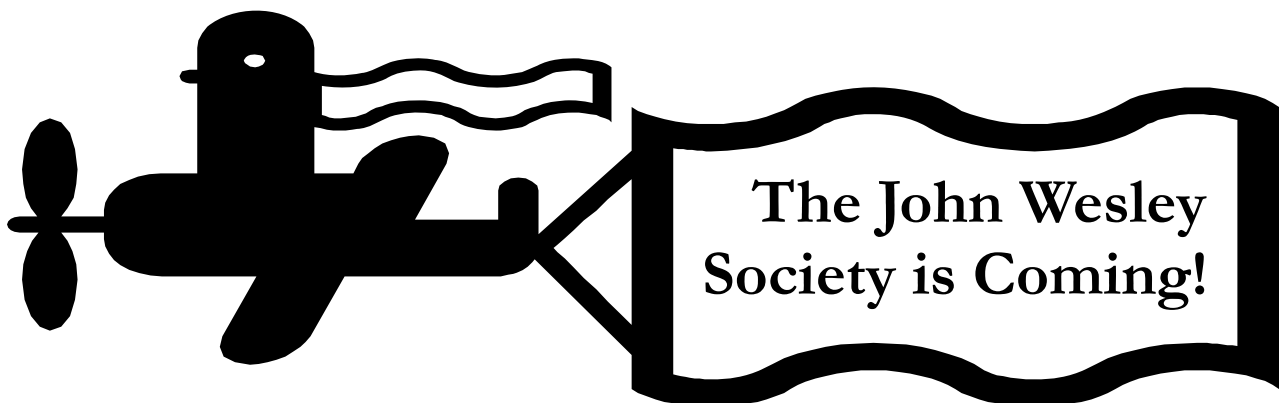

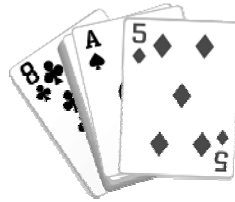
Book Club

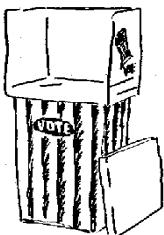
Pinochle

From the Finance Corner By Renee Meyer

Multitask – the performance of multiple tasks at one time.

Greetings and Peace in Jesus' name! This month I want to continue to explain a few more concepts involved in the accounting process at FOUMC. During the time that I have been the Finance Chair here, the number one rule has been to know how to multitask! I spend a few hours a week at the church looking at bills, reading reports, answering questions, preparing for meetings and trying to figure out the best methods to pursue in order to help the Council of FOUMC make the best decisions possible for the work of God's church. Because I work a full-time job, it is crucial for me to be able to get as much done in as little time as possible. I make sure that I have more than one thing to take care of when I'm working at church. Members of the Finance Committee are also often faced with the job of multitasking in order to get deposits made, bills paid, events organized and meetings completed.

FOUMC uses a **Cash Basis Accounting Method**. This method is much easier to use than the other method, known as the Accrual Method. Cash Based accounting consists of paying bills and recording income when received, while the Accrual Method will record a transaction when a service is completed, even if the invoice is not paid for several weeks. The Cash Basis Method is much less confusing and complicated. Income is received from Sunday Offerings, LMS Tuition, Facility Usage, and Tower Income just to name a few. Invoices are received for utilities, worker's compensation, and maintenance expenses, but we also have to pay salaries for everyone. Utilizing the Cash Based method allows us to pay any bill at any time using money that was deposited from all of the above sources. An **Accounting Period** is the portion of time where all transactions that occurred during that period are counted. Accounting Periods at FOUMC occur monthly. Every bit of money that is spent for expenses in a particular month is subtracted from the amount of income that is received that month. If there is more income than expenses in a given month, that total is known as **Net Income**. If there are more expenses than income received for a month, that difference is known as **Net Loss**. Each month the amount of Net Income or Loss changes because every month is different. Twelve Accounting Periods make up a **Fiscal Year**, and the fiscal year can be a calendar year (January to December) as it has been as long as FOUMC has been a church, or it can be any set of 12 months. Last year, the Church Council voted to change the fiscal year to July to June. This was done in part to help LMS better project income and expenses for their school year (August to June) rather than having to split up their school year over two separate fiscal years as they have done for many years.

And now I want to share a bit of Finance Committee business. Since April is the late middle of our short year, I want to let everyone know that the team will be conducting some inquiries to members and friends to help plan for the rest of the calendar year and to complete a budget for the first new fiscal year. Your help will be crucial to helping the team get all of the information together swiftly and accurately. Stand by for more info!!! See you next month!!!

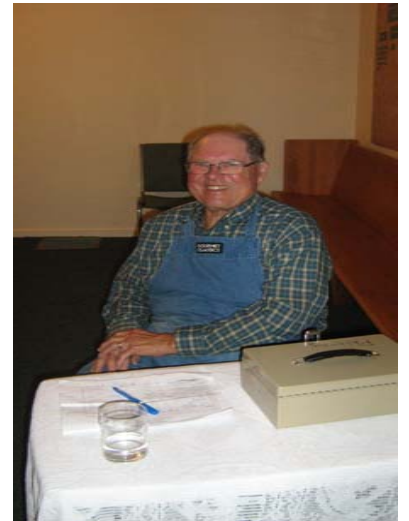




Endowment Chili Feed & Cake Auction A Success
