Greetings and peace in Jesus' name! I am so happy to report better news than I spoke of in church on July 15th! I took one last hard look at the books and found a couple of instances where Journal Entries had not been made! FOUMC finished the year with a positive balance of \$2,494.00 and LMS finished with a positive balance of \$1,873.00. This is exciting for me as it has been a couple of years since both entities have finished on a positive note! I really appreciate that spending was carefully watched throughout the short year, yet so many great and encouraging changes have happened on campus thus far in 2012. Those construction changes that have begun are helping to change the face of FOUMC and I am confident that passers-by will see those changes and take note of what a great place this church really is!



I want to continue on an optimistic note and report that more pledges have come in. However, we are still looking at a huge deficit for 2012-13. We will need to use money from the tower lease sale to help us get over the hump, and Council has authorized approximately \$44,000 for this fiscal year. That sum, additional pledges and other income projections have reduced the deficit to \$42,000.00. That is still a deep hole and we will need to continue to watch excess spending. It will be a huge discussion at the July 24, 2012 Council meeting.

I want to give a huge shout out to the organizers of the Red, White and Blue BBQ and Pie Auction, led by Kathy and David Glass and their kids Karenza Hatfield and Adriane Samcoff. A total of \$2,900.00 was raised due to the efforts of the event organizers and helpers. Special thanks to the pie bakers, for their labor and love in creating so many scrumptious pies. Four of the cakes sold for over \$100.00!! I regret missing the Red, White and Blue this year—I know it is one of FOUMC's major social/fundraising events each year. A lot of work and preparation goes into it, and the fun that comes out is soothing and rewarding!

“Centering Prayer” is one way of praying, using silence and a word to focus on (such as “peace,” “joy,” or “spirit”) as a way of “training” ourselves to be open and receptive to God’s presence. From 11:00-11:15, instruction in centering prayer is offered; from 11:15 until noon, we do a bit of talking about our own prayer practices at home, and then we join in the silent practice of centering prayer. The staff at Centeringprayer.com calls the practice an “experience of God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself” which is “both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship.”
