INFORMATIONAL MEETING By Church Council Sunday, May 6, Wesley Hall, after worship service

All church members and attendees are urged to attend an important presentation by the Finance Committee and FOUMC Board of Trustees following services May 6, 2012 regarding a recently negotiated agreement with Unison Site Management, LLC, to take over management of the FOUMC cell tower leases. This presentation will include a brief history regarding the cell towers and the new contract. Also the Finance Committee will discuss their recommendations regarding the utilization of the funds received:

- Pay off existing loan from the Board of Missions. (\$42,501) DONE
- Set aside the majority of funds received to offset the loss in monthly revenue currently received.
- Designate a portion of funds to maintenance and upkeep projects overseen by Trustees.

A list of the proposed Trustees Projects will be presented categorized by Safety, Maintenance, Disability Access, and Improvements.

Our Prayer for General Conference By Pastor Jeong Park

The United Methodist Church's top legislative body, the General Conference, will gather April 24 to May 4, 2012, in Tampa, Florida. Structurally speaking, our church (Fair Oaks United Methodist Church) is a part of Bridge District local churches and Bridge District has a link to the Cal-Nevada Annual Conference (one of 59 annual conferences in the U.S. and one of eight annual conferences in the Western Jurisdiction). Every four years, annual conference delegates (equal numbers of lay and clergy, 988 this year) from around the world come to the General Conference and they work together to revise the Book of Discipline, set policy and direction for the church. According to the Book of Discipline, General Conference is the only entity that speaks for The United Methodist Church.

By the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the 2012 General Conference will deal with some important legislations: One of our great hopes is that we can create more "vital congregations" in our denomination. This will be the central focus of our United Methodist Church for the next ten years. The whole body will prayerfully work on this matter and make strategies. I hear that the General Conference will work on "apportionment" issues as well. Traditionally, United Methodists are generous and passionate givers for "missions". They will pray and work for the mission and the connectional church with a reflective question, "What will inspire United Methodists to give generously and joyfully to the denomination?" I also hear another big topic regards the pastor's appointment system. The General Conference will revisit our current appointment system and whether it can still value vital congregations or not. They will explore a new possibility of whether they can make a better and more effective system for the future of the United Methodist Church. The General Conference will revisit problems of the language and laws about homosexuality in the Book of Discipline for debate once more.

I hope and pray that the General Conference will make good decisions for the future of our denomination and for God's mission for the world. I also ask for your prayer and support to the General Conference.

From the Finance Corner By Renee Meyer

"Be sure you know the condition of your flocks, give careful attention to your herds."

Proverbs 27:23 NIV

Greetings and peace in the name of our Risen Savior! I had to stop and do a double-take when I read this verse that is supposed to be related to budgeting. I wondered what do flocks and herds have to do with budgeting? Perhaps they could be likened to coins and dollars? Does one represent income and is one a symbol for expenses? A portion of the next verse helped me make better sense of it: "for riches do not endure forever."

As we begin planning our first non-calendar fiscal year, I find this verse important in helping all of us reach the best possible budget. Maybe the flocks are LMS and the herd is FOUMC. Whatever the case, we need to strive to make the budget work for everyone involved. That said, as important as it is for each department and committee to receive a portion of planned expenses, it is just as, if not more vital, that we have a good projection of what we can expect for income. Most of the committees that represent the largest portion of expenses are currently working on their budgets. The Finance Committee is creating pledge sheets for the 2012/13 year and will be handing those out to all of you in the next couple of weeks. Income from pledges will be the largest area of revenue for the church so it is crucial that we be as accurate as possible in planning income. The best target of money coming into the church we get, the more realistically we can plan expenses.

I'm hoping that you all have some knowledge by now that Council voted to allow Trustees to sell the leases on the cell towers. This has been accomplished and the church has received a sum of approximately \$384,000 after first paying off the remaining \$45,000 from the original loan from the Conference. There will be a meeting following the church service on Sunday May 6, 2012 in Wesley Hall to discuss the sale, as well as the Finance Committee's recommendations on how to utilize the money we received. All ministers of FOUMC have a voice on how this money should best be utilized and I invite you to attend the very important meeting.

Long story short, we have a lot of action happening over the next several weeks at FOUMC. Please remain involved in the budgeting/pledging process and mark your calendars to attend the meeting on the 6th of May for an opportunity to better understand where we stand with the income from the cell tower lease sale. Little Methodist Preschool Year-End Recap By Elizabeth Avery-Hammond, director

Little Methodist School is nearing the end of another school year. It has been a good year, and we have made a lot of progress. Each year our enrollment has steadily gone up. We have had very successful fundraisers all year and are hoping to install air conditioning in both Rice buildings this summer. Thank you to everyone who participated in our fundraisers!

As I write this, we have 20 children enrolled for the fall of 2012 and we haven't even finished our school year yet! This is the highest enrollment we have had for fall so early in the year. On average, I give about two tours a week and have had more calls from the community about fall 2012 than ever. We are so excited and grateful to already be half way to our goal of having 40 children enrolled for the fall. If you know of anyone who might be interested in checking out LMS, there are flyers in the Narthex that you can hand out. We are also having Summer Day Camp from June 4th-June 29th. It is Monday thru Thursday and not parent participation. If you or anyone you know is interested in signing up for Summer Day Camp, give me a call at 961-0368.

As many of you know, we are fortunate enough to have Florence Perrin come back to teach our toddler class. Florence has been with LMS for over 20 years. Her vast knowledge about LMS and her teaching experience has been invaluable. We are so blessed to have her back with us. Sue Jas, who taught at LMS for 10 years, decided to spend more time with her family and pursue other interests. We were sad to say goodbye to her but are so glad that she has made herself available to us as a substitute teacher. It is so great to have such a wonderful sub who knows our school and families so well.

We have made some changes to the structure of our classes. The toddlers have two classes; the Monday/Wednesday class is for the younger toddlers (starting at 18 months) and the Tuesday/ Thursday class is for the older toddlers (starting around 24 months). Our three-year-old class and our four-year-old class are combining and will be taught by Kim White. This will mean that some of our four-year-olds will spend two years with Mrs. White. That will put our four-year-olds and Mrs. White at a great advantage because they will already be familiar and bonded with each other and this will allow Mrs. White to focus more on their academics. Debbi Oliver is teaching our Prekindergarten class. This class is designed for children who will be going into Kindergarten the following fall. The goal is to make sure each of our students are taught the skills and academics they need to be successful in Kindergarten.



I want to take this opportunity to share my deepest gratitude to the members of the LMS Study Group. I am so grateful for all the support and input that each member has given us. I truly enjoy working with each and every one of you and am so thankful to have you as a resource and to help LMS be the best school it can be!

We are looking forward to our continuous growth in the following years. We are especially excited about celebrating our 50th anniversary in 2014! Ideas are already being bounced around about how we can celebrate this momentous occasion and are looking forward to the church celebrating with us!




PASTOR JEONG'S SUMMER SCHEDULE

The John Wesley Society Comes to Fair Oaks UMC



The Endowment Committee of Fair Oaks United Methodist Church announces the establishment of a chapter of the John Wesley Society at Fair Oaks UMC. The society was established by the California-Nevada United Methodist Foundation to honor United Methodists who have remembered their United Methodist Church or any United Methodist ministry by naming the church in a planned gift. A planned gift can be defined simply as one that is given outside of the regular offering and is for a purpose beyond the day to day needs of the church. Planned gifts are often given from resources beyond one's check book (e.g. a will, trust, life insurance policy, pension plan, or an IRA.) They may be given during one's lifetime or be deferred until after the donor's death.

The society is named after John Wesley because he lived his life as a steward of the gospel in his ministry priorities, in his use of time, and in his use of money. He demonstrated what it meant to "Gain all you can, save all you can, give all you can" in a way that led to overflowing generosity to the poor and advocacy on their behalf.

The John Wesley Society makes no distinction about the amount of a planned gift. Anyone who has made a planned gift to the Methodist Church's ministry is eligible for membership. The Endowment Fund is a fund maintained to provide income in perpetuity for use by our Church. The undesignated gifts given to the FOUMC Endowment Fund are presently directed to support 4 areas in rotation: children, community, choir, and campus. These gifts have a lasting legacy for generations to come.

The Endowment Committee is planning a Fall event to recognize those charter members of the Fair Oaks United Methodist Church's John Wesley Society. We hope you strongly consider placing FOUMC in your Estate Plans and leave a legacy for future generations. Watch for more information.

Fair Oaks UMC a June Polling Place


