



Grief Support Ministry: A Sacred Place for Healing

Eight years ago, I had an opportunity to work at UCSF hospital as a hospital chaplain for one year. One night I got a call from the front desk of the Cardiology Intensive Care Unit. They requested a chaplain visit a family whose loved one just died of a heart attack. When I entered the room, family members were sobbing and crying over the death of their loved one. The wife repeatedly said, "Don't go, honey..." Her deep sobbing came to my ears and penetrated into my soul. It was hard to put myself in her shoes. I didn't want to interrupt their grieving, so I stood in a corner and waited until they were ready to talk to me. After a while, they were about to leave. The wife turned towards me and said, "Thank you for being here." Family members deeply appreciated my presence in their difficult moment. Personally, this was a meaningful experience - the power of 'presence' for someone's life journey.

I believe that we are created to journey together on this earth until we are called to go back to God. That could be a reason why God created a partner for Adam and God gave us a church community for the world. Jesus Christ's love reminds us to support, encourage, and care for each other, not only for celebration of life but also for those who are suffering and grieving over the loss of their loved one's life. I am very thankful that we are beginning our new ministry of a Grief Support Group at Fair Oaks United Methodist Church in June. Health professionals teach us that grief occurs because of our attachment to and love for the person who died. There are a wide range of feelings, thoughts, and behaviors that are common after a loss. Grieving can be a lengthy and painful process. All people grieve when a loved one dies, but the most important thing is that if we are to heal, we need to mourn. Mourning is the process we go through in adapting to the loss of the person.

The purpose of our Grief Support Group is to be present with you when your life journey is hard to continue by yourself. If you need a friend or company, we are happy to be there for you and to journey together with you. We hope that we will create a new sacred place for listening to you, mourning with you and healing for you through this ministry. The essence of Christian faith is to love each other as God loves us. Love is not a static word, but a verb to actively feel for others and work for others. Empathy and compassion are important components of God's love. I am deeply grateful to our Grief Support Ministry members for their compassionate hearts and acts for making this ministry possible at our church.

The Grief Support Group will begin our ministry on Sunday, June 3rd (bi-monthly on the first and third Sundays, 2:00 p.m.-3:30 p.m. in the library). Each meeting, two facilitators will be present to share your thoughts and feelings. When you feel it is too hard to continue to journey alone, please remember that you are *not* alone. Our ministry team is ready to journey with you, especially in the hard times. The Bible says that God gave a son, whose name is Emmanuel (which means "God is with us"). I pray that God is with you through our Grief Support Ministry. I ask for your support and care for our new ministry, especially for those who are grieving over the loss of their loved ones on their life journeys. May the Spirit of God


Pinochle

From the Finance Corner

Grace and peace in Jesus name! With budgeting and the stewardship drive being at the forefront of my mind these days I wish to share the current status of where the budget stands from a very rough perspective at this point. As of May 21, 2012, we have received 28 pledges for a total of \$54,380.00. This is a significant increase in pledge amount per person and for that I am grateful to those of you that have turned in pledge cards to this point! If you have received a pledge card and have not returned it, please do so by May 27, 2012. If you need to have a pledge card mailed to you, please call Dedra in the Church Office at 916-961-6631 and she can get one for you.

The rough copy of the budget currently shows FOUMC with a deficit of **\$160,000** and LMS with a net income of \$4,400. LMS's budget contains some additional expenses for liability insurance and bookkeeping fees as well as maintenance costs, and is based on a student population of 40 kids for the year 2012-2013. As of May 16, 2012, there are 22 students enrolled thus far. FOUMC still has to collect additional pledges and figure additional income to help close its deficit gap but as this point I remain confident that a good balanced budget will prevail for our new fiscal year.

I am pleased to introduce Leah DeFord, FOUMC's new bookkeeper. Leah comes to FOUMC with a great deal of experience with church finances as well as a solid background in bookkeeping. She has great resources regarding CPA and legal advice when needed and has already made a big impact with her suggestions and ideas. We can all look forward to her contribution to FOUMC. Leah will work as an outside contractor for FOUMC and will be responsible for recording revenues, paying bills, processing payroll and generating reports for the Finance Committee. Welcome aboard the FOUMC train Leah!

Finally, I want to extend my huge thanks to everyone that attended the Congregational Meeting on May 6th to discuss the revenue from the Cell Tower Lease Sale and all of the input and ideas that were generated from the conversation. The Council will now be able to discuss the recommendations for the use of the money and move forward in putting plans into action. I was glad to see so many people there and to hear so many voices involved! That is how this church works together in the most productive ways.

May God bring you many blessings as we begin our summer season! See you next month!

Board of Trustees by Diana Bodner

This is our church home. It will take all of us, doing what we can, to improve our home.

What can you do, today? We meet on the second Tuesday of the month at 7pm.

We welcome anyone who would like to attend. We always welcome new volunteers!

May 5, 2012 was our spring work day and it was great! We had 11 from Little Methodist School and 16 from the congregation to complete some of the work needed on our church grounds. Two of the LMS dads replaced the framing around the swing set – it is wonderful and no more splinters! Wood chips were spread; the junipers were cut back; trees were trimmed; a concrete ramp was built for LMS; weeds were whacked; and we came together as a community of volunteers to work on our campus. We have **Joanne Cossairt to thank for a hearty, home cooked meal** complete with trimmings. With the tables set up to eat at, it was a true opportunity for fellowship. **Many thanks to everyone who participated in work day.** Take a look at the pictures in the Narthex. Our fall work day is October 13, 2012. Mark your calendars. There is a lot to be done (small, large, easy, and hard projects) ... something for everyone!

On May 6, 2012 we had an informal meeting to share information with anyone in the congregation that could attend, regarding the work the Trustees have been doing and what lies ahead of us.

First we presented a history of the cell towers and their use (previous/current leases). In 1992 we acquisitioned the site and in 1994, Nextel constructed a cell tower. In 2002 we acquisitioned the second site and cell tower #2 was constructed by West Coast PCS. We went through various acquisitions and leases as the carriers changed. To gain a maximum income from the towers, they must be managed and kept fully occupied (a full time, industry related position). The leases were also set to expire in 2015 & 2016. Given that we do not have the necessary staff or time to do this, the Trustees (after approval of Church Council) signed an agreement to lease the management of the cell towers to Unison Site Management, LLC. They paid \$442,874 to purchase a defined easement for the two cell sites. In turn, Unison will receive the currently scheduled rent stream (including escalators) for the term of the easement. For all rent over and above the current income, the site owner (FOUMC) will collect 50% and Unison will collect 50%. Unison's objective is to maximize the tower space, which we cannot do currently, ultimately yielding an increased profit for themselves and FOUMC. If the sites are not used for 5 years (we don't anticipate this), then the towers are deemed abandoned and revert to FOUMC. Part of the funds received paid off an FOUMC Loan (CA-NV UMC board of Missions Loan) of \$42,501. After escrow costs, the loan repayment, and additional withholdings, the church received a check of \$384,765. Trustees are recommending that \$100,000 be set aside to repave the parking lots and increase the size of the handicap parking area. Any funds remaining out of the \$100,000 would be used judiciously toward safety, maintenance, and improvement projects recommended by the Board of Trustees and approved by Church Council.

We continue to refine our project list focusing on safety, ADA compliancy, and maintenance (and appreciate your input). **Here is our current list of projects (in no particular order):**

- Parking Lot resurfacing, striping, and Handicap Parking Lot expansion (Safety, ADA, Maintenance) – awaiting funding
- Landscaping and retaining wall on Fair Oaks Blvd
- New sign on Fair Oaks - funded

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- Signage replacement for buildings / directional signage - funded
- Enlarge swinging door opening in Spencer (ADA) - underway
- Replace broken cement on front stairs (Safety)
- Replace water lines and gas lines
- Trees: removal of dead limbs and prune as necessary
- Replace Narthex windows (4)
- Ridge Vent on Rice Building
- French drain in front of Wesley & "Y" Building
- Doors to library and Wesley (ADA)
- Nursery Heating and AC
- Rice Heating and AC
- Davidson AC
- Davidson heater damper motor
- Preschool fence/gate
- Walking ramp from front parking to church (ADA)
- New chairs for sanctuary
- Ramp to Potter (ADA)
- Parsonage double pane windows
- Parsonage insulation
- Parsonage Heating and AC
- Deck in front of narthex to widen walking area (ADA/Safety/Improvement)
- Retaining wall – north end of west bank
- Retaining wall along west side steps

We have completed the following projects:

- Parsonage painting
- Removed diseased redwood trees and stumps
- West bank retaining wall
- Recoat Davidson Roof
- Map made of water lines
- Sanctuary mold abatement and painting
- Swing set frame replaced
- Painted the exterior of Spencer
- Fixed/replaced the phone lines from/to the Rice Building

Concerns which rose at the meeting included:

- Tower funds and how they will be used
- Water/irrigation for the Memorial Garden (this is funded)
- Grooving in the sidewalks causing difficulty for those using walkers, etc
- Size and number of parking spaces
- The need to do maintenance and not wait
