What is Taize?

The Taizé Community is an ecumenical monastic order in Taizé, Saône-et-Loire, Burgundy, France. It is composed of about 100 brothers who come from Protestant, Eastern Orthodox and Catholic traditions. The monastic order has a strong devotion to peace and justice through prayer and meditation. They are encouraged to live in the spirit of kindness, simplicity and reconciliation.



What is Taize Prayer?

Singing is one of the most essential elements of Taize worship. Short songs, repeated again and again, give it a meditative character. Using just a few words, they express a basic reality of faith, quickly grasped by the mind. As the words are sung over many times, this reality gradually penetrates the whole being. Meditative singing thus becomes a way of listening to God. It allows everyone to take part in a time of prayer together and to remain together in attentive waiting on God without having to fix the length of time too exactly. To open the gates of trust in God, nothing can replace the beauty of human voices united in song. This beauty can give us a glimpse of "heaven's joy on earth," as Eastern Christians put it. And an inner life begins to blossom within us. These songs also sustain personal prayer. Through them, little by little, our being finds an inner unity in God. They can continue in the silence of our hearts when we are at work, speaking with others or resting. In this way prayer and daily life are united. They allow us to keep on praying - even when we are unaware of it - in the silence of our hearts.

The John Wesley Society Comes to Fair Oaks UMC

The Endowment Committee of Fair Oaks United Methodist Church announces the establishment of a chapter of the John Wesley Society at Fair Oaks UMC. The society was established by the California-Nevada United Methodist Foundation to honor United Methodists who have remembered their United Methodist Church or any United Methodist ministry by naming the church in a planned gift. A planned gift can be defined simply as one that is given outside of the regular offering and is for a purpose beyond the day to day needs of the church. Planned gifts are often given from resources beyond one's check book (e.g. a will, trust, life insurance policy, pension plan, or an IRA.) They may be given during one's lifetime or be deferred until after the donor's death.

The society is named after John Wesley because he lived his life as a steward of the gospel in his ministry priorities, in his use of time, and in his use of money. He demonstrated what it meant to "Gain all you can, save all you can, give all you can" in a way that led to overflowing generosity to the poor and

advocacy on their behalf.

The John Wesley Society makes no distinction about the amount of a planned gift. Anyone who has made a planned gift to the Methodist Church's ministry is eligible for membership. The Endowment Fund is a fund maintained to provide income in perpetuity for use by our Church. The undesignated gifts given to the FOUMC Endowment Fund are presently directed to support 4 areas in rotation: children, community, choir, and campus. These gifts have a lasting legacy for generations to come.

The Endowment Committee is planning a Fall event to recognize those charter members of the Fair Oaks United Methodist Church's John Wesley Society. We hope you strongly consider placing FOUMC in your Estate Plans and leave a legacy for future generations. Watch for more information.

From the Finance Corner

Accounting:

Is the systematic recording, reporting, and analysis of financial transactions of a business. The person in charge of accounting is known as an accountant, and this individual is typically required to follow a set of rules and regulations, such as the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. Accounting allows a company to analyze the financial performance of the business, and look at statistics such as net profit.

Greeting and Peace in Jesus' name! I know that it is odd for my articles NOT to begin with Bible verses, but I've been thinking that perhaps it might be time to give some accounting definitions each month in an effort to help people that aren't number-gifted like me (there are MANY gifts I do not have--ask me to sing a solo at church some day, and I'll shriek you right out of the sanctuary!) I sometimes get so caught up in just getting things "done" that I don't take the time to explain why some things happen the way they do. So, above is the basic definition of Accounting, (but I'll need to make changes to it so it makes sense for the church), to get us started.

While the church is technically NOT a business, it must be run like a business, according to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. Businesses are run to make money; churches are operated as non-profit organizations. While we do sometimes make money, that is not our overall intent. The net income that a church makes is NEVER known as profit. FOUMC is not in business to make a profit but to be a charitable organization. The church will not close down because it loses money in a given year though a business may close because it does not earn enough profit to make it worthwhile.

I am not an accountant; however, I have had training in accounting in the course of obtaining my business degree. As the Finance Chair, it is my "job" to work with the members of the Finance Committee in an effort to make the best reports and suggestions that we as a team can make, and I present those ideas to Church Council every month. I have served as the Chair of Finance since January of 2009. I love serving the church in this capacity, and I'm so grateful that we have all been able to work together for the best interest of the church. So, in order to make the above definition make a little more sense in respect to what we do at the church, I would re-write it as follows:

Accounting is the systematic recording, reporting, and analysis of financial happenings at FOUMC. The people in charge of accounting are the Finance Committee who follow a set of rules and regulations known as Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. Accounting allows the committee to analyze the performance of the church and to look at statistics, such as net income.

Look for more definitions from the Accounting Process in the next few months and feel free to ask me questions at any time! See you next month!
