“Renewing our Spirits in the New Year” By Pastor Jeong Park



Greetings to you in this New Year!
Do you have a New Year's Resolution?

Although it took some time for me to reformat and restart the computer, now it works perfectly. It really made me feel good to have a fresh start.

A brand new year is upon us! Did you make any New Year's Resolutions? New Year's gives us an opportunity to start again as I did with my computer.

If you made a New Year's resolution, how can you make it happen? I read these suggestions online for making resolutions: 1. Determine what went wrong. 2. Aim for one goal only. 3. Commit to change. 4. Imagine yourself meeting your goal. 5. Ask God's guidance.






Our Adult Education Team Presents A Lenten Journey By Mary McCollum

Happy New Year! The Education Committee looks forward to a new year and all it offers. We hope you will come along with us on a spiritual journey during the season of Lent (those 6 weeks between February 26th through April 7th.) We invite ALL in our church to read a chapter a week in a little book called *Wilderness Wanderings: A Lenten Pilgrimage*. Small groups are forming to offer the opportunity to join together and discuss the suggested

questions of faith each chapter presents. Our pastor will include insights each week in his pastoral message on Sunday mornings. If you want to journey alone, that's alright too, but everyone needs to sign up in the narthex in the month of January so that books for each household can be ordered. Being in a small group, meeting in homes scattered geographically across our membership, meeting at different times and days gives one the opportunity to find what fits each person's schedule. This should offer us

a real, concrete way of growing in our faith. John Wesley, our founder, believed in small group interaction as a way to grow in faith, and here we will begin a pilgrimage together to do just that. So think of the season of Lent as a growing time, not as a time of denial. Add this one dimension for a short course in finding our way forward - together.



Wilderness Wanderings

Cokesbury describes the experience of *Wilderness Wanderings* in this way: "Sometimes even the words associated with Lent - atonement, fasting, and paschal - seem foreign and intimidating. But in studying them, we become wanderers and pilgrims living out the meanings of these terms and Lenten scriptures. This insightful book leads to a clearer understanding of inward disciplines (simplicity, solitude, study and service)."



Communion Stewards & Servers Needed By Elaine Bach





Budget for the New Year

Greetings and peace in the name of Jesus! I liken this verse to a new year. Every January 1 seems to put a sense of a “new start” in not only my eyes, but in the eyes of many. Resolutions, goals, and new mindsets put a challenge in one’s heart. I look at this year’s end and next year with church budget numbers in my head (of course)! I sometimes feel like a broken record asking for pledge cards, talking about budget deficits, and writing about things that need to be done and things that can’t get done because of shortfalls.

Pastor Jeong told me, it was about this time last year that I was standing in front of the congregation asking for pledge cards and talking of a \$20,000 deficit and wondering how ends would eventually meet. What do you know? This year is the exact same story. I’m not so sure we can resolve next year’s potential deficit like we did last year. Trustees gave up HALF of their maintenance budget to help contribute to a balanced budget. In addition, several people turned in late pledges and that helped close the deficit.

Remember, this is a short year- January through June, 2012 and we have a long way to go to reach a balance. I am inviting all of you to attend the Council Meeting on January 24, 2012 at 6:30 pm. Decisions will be made at that meeting as to how to handle the deficit and to brainstorm ways to increase income for the church and LMS. ALL VOICES COUNT!

This year, I am amazed at where we stand with numbers after we had a rough June and July. Here are numbers for year-to-date January through November:


