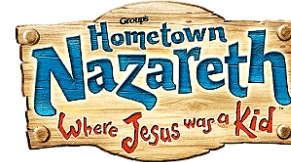


Olympic Sports & Bible Sorts

Did You Know?

Colorado homeowners age 65 and older who have lived in their homes at least 10 years will once again be able to take advantage of the senior homestead property-tax exemption on part of the 2012 property tax bills that'll be coming due in 2013.

Boulder and Weld counties assessors already have thousands of seniors who signed up in previous years for the partial tax break, which exempts qualified homeowners from having to pay taxes on up to 50 percent of the first \$200,000 of a home's actual value.

Eligible seniors who haven't already applied for the exemption must submit applications to their county assessors by July 16 to benefit from the exemption.

A homeowner must be at least 65 years old on Jan. 1 of the year in which he or she qualifies. In the case of 2012 property taxes payable in 2013, that person must have been 65 as of this past Jan. 1. The person must have been the owner of the home — and it must have been his or her primary residence — for at least 10 consecutive years before Jan.

Boulder County seniors with questions about the exemption can call the Boulder County Assessor's Office at 303-441-3530. They can view the application forms and instructions online at www.bouldercountyassessor.org. Application forms are available in the Boulder County assessor's second-floor Boulder County Courthouse offices at 1325 Pearl St., Boulder, Mondays through Fridays.

YOUR OUTREACH DOLLARS AT WORK

Amigos of Mexico: Elena de Porras, director of Teen Challenge Women's Center in Juarez, Mexico (Reto a la Juventud) has been a spiritual mother to more than 900 addicted women. The Lord captured her heart when she visited a juvenile court and saw children as young as 9 years old trapped in drugs, alcohol, and prostitution. In 1978 she started a program in a small apartment and through much prayer and a series of miracles, a beautiful facility with a capacity to house 50 women was dedicated in 2000. Elena's heart for every woman who enters the door is that she would be treated like a daughter of the King and know how much He loves her!

NOTE: *Elena told her story at our Outreach meeting in May. We were all captivated by her personal warmth and love for Jesus. At that time she presented us with a beautiful blue and green quilt which was sewn by the women at Reto a la Juventud using a large quilting machine they purchased in part with FCLC Outreach and Endowment dollars. You can see the quilt hanging in Room 232 where the O-Team meets each month.*

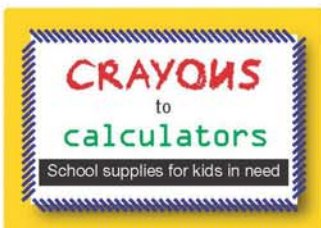
