THE ADVENT WREATH

Over the centuries many traditions and observances have developed throughout the Church to help us celebrate the nativity of Christ. The lighting of the candles in the Advent Wreath on the four Sundays before Christmas in anticipation of the coming of Christ can add renewed joy and meaning to our worship.

The circle of the wreath represents God's eternity- Who was, and is, and ever will be.

The evergreen symbolizes God's gift of eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The pink candle represents joy.

The three purple candles represent hope, faith, and peace.

The center white candle represents Jesus Christ, the Light of the World.
