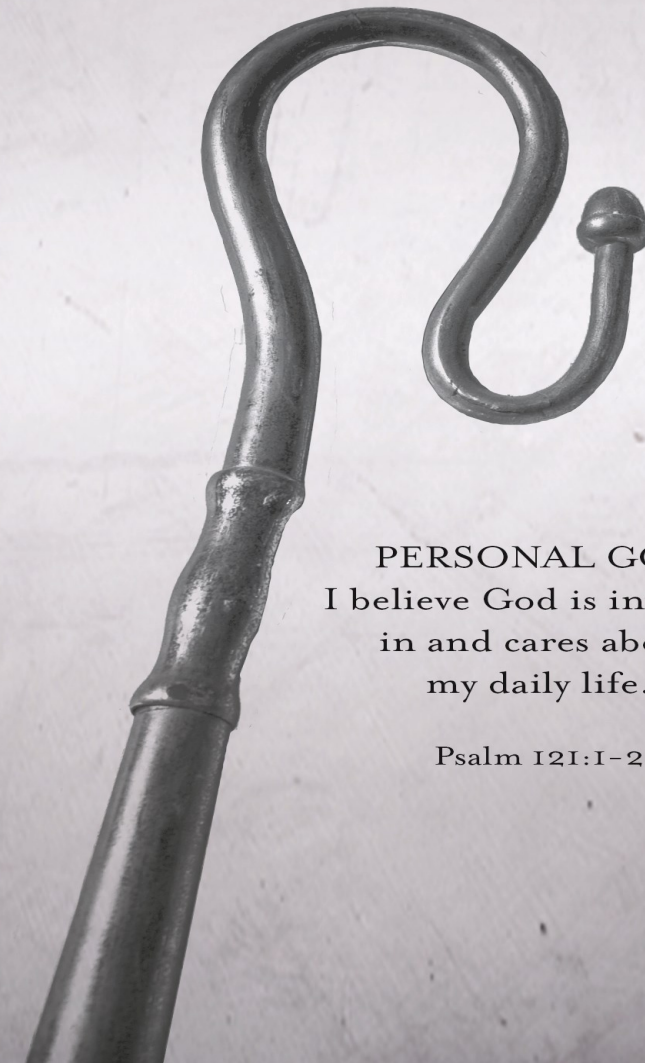


To Our Guests This Morning!

Think Believe: Persona God

Key Idea:
I believe God is involved in and cares about my daily life.

Key Scripture:
I lift up my eyes to the mountains—
where does my help come from?
² My help comes from the LORD,
the Maker of heaven and earth.
Psalm 121:1-2

We are very fortunate to live in Knoxville, TN right next to the Smoky Mountains. Have you ever gazed at the mountains and wondered how God could create something so majestic? Consider the sunrise coming over the mountains how it is bathed in beautiful pinks and purples. Or have you ever seen the mountains as the sun is setting and the color of the mountains turn to red. Looking at the mountains is a wonderful way to reflect on God’s glory. Aren’t you just amazed that God would create something so majestic and allow me to gaze upon it.

The practice of lifting up our eyes is an important aspect of the Christian life. Think about it for just a moment. There really is no place on this journey of faith for looking down, or even back. In our Christian journey, we are looking forward to eternity with God or looking up in praise and wonderment. When we talk about looking down, it typically carries a negative connotation. We look down upon the things that we don’t like, or that cause us great discomfort. It would seem that there are a lot of reasons in our present day that would cause us to look down or to even feel down.

But when we think of God we should, as the Psalmist has written, think of lifting up our eyes, our heads, and our hearts. Looking up is a positive, and hopeful thing. As believers we look to God, who is seated in the heavens.

When we look up, we remember that we can’t and even don’t control all of the things that swirl around us. Instead, we lift up our eyes and remember and give thanks to our God who is in control, and whose love and care are constant in our lives.

So lift up your eyes to the mountains, no matter how far away they may be, and remember the incredible faithfulness of the God who loves you! In doing so, you will be able to see all of the ways that God is blessing your life.

Life Application:
Looking up is a way of remembering and giving thanks to God for the blessings he has bestowed upon me.

Prayer:
Father, thank you for allowing me to lift up my eyes to the mountains on a daily basis. You love me and you care for me. You continually bless me so let me be a blessing to those I meet. Amen.
