STEWARDSHIP
I believe everything I am and everything I own belongs to God.

Psalm 24:1-2

Believe: Stewardship

Key Idea: I believe everything I am and everything I own belongs to God.

Key Scripture: The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it;

the world, and all who live in it. for he founded it on the seas and

established it on the waters. Psalm 24:1-2

Our key Scripture is praising God as the owner of the earth and everything in it. If God is creator and owner of the world, then this makes us, in turn, the stewards of the world and its resources. A steward is defined as "a person who manages another's property or financial affairs; one who administers anything as the agent of another or others."

Someone once said that "Biblical stewardship recognizes that God's resources are to be deployed through God's people to accomplish God's mission." Being a good steward implies that the way I manage my time, my talents, my material possessions, or my wealth should all be done in consideration of God.

In regards to time, Ephesians 5:15 – 16 tells us "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity." As a good steward, am I using my time wisely? Often our time is delegated by others, but even then we can still use our time wisely.

In regards to talents (or our gifts), we need to use them to improve the world around us. The Apostle Paul in the Book of Romans tells us basically to just use them (see Romans 12:3-8). Whatever your spiritual gift is or whatever your job is, do it to the best of your ability so that ultimately God is honored.

In 1 Chronicles 29:14, King David (considered to be Israel's greatest king) is talking to the people regarding the building of the Temple and during this talk he prays the following: "But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand." Like King David we need to recognize that everything has been given to us or entrusted to us by God and therefore be able to give generously because it belonged to God's to begin with.

Stewardship defines our practical obedience in the administration of everything under our control, everything entrusted to us. Stewardship acknowledges in practice that we do not have the right of control over ourselves (time, talents) or our property (material possessions or wealth)—God has that control. It means as stewards of God, we are managers of that which belongs to God, and we are under His constant authority as we administer His affairs. Faithful stewardship means that we fully acknowledge we are not our own but belong to Christ, the Lord, who gave Himself for us.

Life Application: God is the owner; I am the steward or manager of what belongs to God. Prayer:

> God, you are the Creator and Owner of all that has been entrusted to me. Help me realize this fact day in and day out. Let me always give generously because of this fact. Amen.
