Eva is making dresses that will soon be packed in shoeboxes and distributed to little girls across the world who need to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. 'I love it,' she said. 'The Lord gave me hands with no arthritis. I'm doing what the Lord has asked me to do."

I wonder: what has the Lord asked you to do? Packing a shoebox for Operation Christmas Child is something that each one of us can do. It's a very simple but powerful way of demonstrating the love of Christ to impoverished children all around the world.
