

# **Rusty's Ramblings**

At the time I'm writing this, it's about a week away from the beginning of school. In fact, there's been a mad dash around my house to get summer homework assignments completed (yeah, my rising second-grader and rising kindergartener have summer homework!). This state of affairs serves as a good illustration of an important truth about our relationship with God: we're still students and there's still more to learn. It's interesting that one of the primary descriptions for Christians in the New Testament is as disciples. Disciples are those who are literally "under discipline," not punishment for misbehaviors, but rather those who have been summoned and dedicated to living a particular life following and learning from a particular teacher, whose example and teaching provide the shape for the disciples' lives.

As disciples, as students of Jesus, we need to remember the foundational truths, regularly reviewing them. We need to be reminded of the reality, the goodness, the righteousness, the holiness, the majesty, the power, and the wisdom and knowledge of the Triune God whom we confess. We need to remember the Incarnation, the sinless life of perfect faithfulness, the atoning death, the glorious Resurrection, the Ascension and Exaltation, and the impending Return of God the Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. We need to remember that we have been sealed with the Holy Spirit, Who has gifted us for ministry, Whose fruit should be evident in our lives, Whose work is to make us holy by conforming us to the image of Christ. We need to remember the reality of justification by faith alone and the call to pursue sanctification. And we need to continually grow in our knowledge of God's Word, the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments. We need to remember to show love to all and study so that we can more effectively share Christ's love with all. While we may "know" some of the facts of our faith, we, as disciples in the school of Christ, must grow in our appreciation of these truths and study so that they can make a deeper mark on our lives.

Disciple of Jesus Christ, you haven't graduated yet. Study God's Word daily. Pray daily. Share Christ's love daily. Humble yourself daily. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you your sins daily. Yes, there are sins in your life. Lots of them. Repent and confess them daily. Worship daily. In doing so, you will grow in your knowledge, both intellectual and experiential, of Jesus and find in Him a joy without compare.
