# **Rusty's Ramblings**

For the last several months, I have been trying to become a healthier person. And there are some fairly simple things that, when I'm consistent in practicing them, have really helped. I try to eat more vegetables, consume less sugar, and walk on a regular basis. It's not complicated or spectacular, but this method has worked for me. Our walk with the Lord is similar. There are some basic things that we are called to do for our spiritual health. They're supposed to be a normal part of our Christian lives. Some theologians have called them the "ordinary means of grace." In other words, these are the normal ways we open ourselves up to the work of the Holy Spirit and the normal ways in which God works what is well-pleasing in in us. Very simply, these are prayer, the Word of God, and the corporate worship of God's people.

Through God's Word, we see God's revelation of His character and glory, are exposed to God's will for our lives, and are comforted by the promises of God. In prayer, we respond to God's work in praise, submission, and petition. As we worship with the Body of Christ, we are encouraged as we encounter other believers, pray with them, and hear the Word of God proclaimed in song and sermon and see it visually proclaimed in the sacraments of Baptism and Communion. Just as I need to regularly evaluate my diet and level of activity for my physical health, it's spiritually beneficial to evaluate our ordinary, daily spiritual practices. Are we praying regularly, praising God and seeking His will? Are we reading and meditating upon God's Word, receiving its truth with humble and reverent hearts, and, with the help of the Holy Spirit, putting what we've learned into practice? Are we regularly worshiping our Lord together, declaring His incomparable worth as part of Christ's Body, encouraging each other, and celebrating Gospel in the Lord's Supper as Jesus himself ordained? It is my prayer that God will help us as individual followers of Jesus and as a body of believers to grow in these areas. I believe that if we continually and consistently seek God with these ordinary means of grace in our everyday lives, we will see God do incredible things in and through us to His glory.
