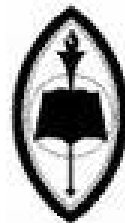

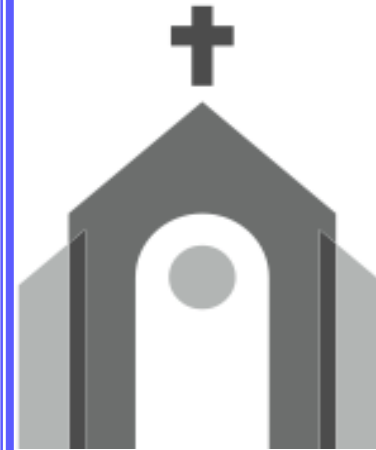

Rusty's Ramblings

Sometimes we look for God to act in dramatic fashion. Sometimes we think we're required to do "big" things for God in order to see God do something incredible. While I do think that God sometimes reveals His power and His grace in particularly attention grabbing ways and that sometimes the Lord leads us to something that, at least for us, is "big," I don't believe that's always the case. God is at work in the ordinary details of life and ministers to us and works in our lives in normal, ordinary ways. We're called to be people who love, know, reflect upon, and seek to obey the Scriptures. We're called to be people of prayer. We're called to serve each other. We're called to make disciples. We're called to worship together. Sometimes these things can have a seemingly dramatic flare to them. Oftentimes, however, our work for God and God's work in us is seemingly simple. We take a few minutes to read the Bible in the morning or evening. We pray for a friend who doesn't know Christ everyday and invite them to a church fellowship or into our homes so that they can see a picture of what God can do with our lives. We make it a point to hold the door open for an older brother or sister, offer a ride, or prepare a meal.

We shouldn't discount these things; God is at work. With this in mind, I would ask each member of this church to be in prayer for our church and to read and reflect upon the Scriptures.

Pray that God would direct us. Pray that God would protect us. Pray that God would use us. Pray that God would grow us in our dependence upon Him and in our desire to see His will accomplished. Read the Bible. Read a short passage when you can (just make sure you're reading it in its context!); read a long passage and savor God's truth. Make it a discipline to do it everyday. Find what works for you. Ask God to help you understand, apply, and cherish His Word.

In particular, I'd like to encourage everyone to read the Bible with an eye to what God has called His people to do and for His promises made to His people. Pray those promises over this congregation and pray that He'll uphold us and help us to be faithful. Daily prayer and bible study may not be dramatic. You may not see angels or hear heavenly music. But, if you daily seek God's will and God's provision and seek to be transformed by the renewing of your mind by His truth, God will work in you and God will work in our midst.

To help facilitate this, a Scripture Reading and Prayer Guide will be made available on Sunday, June 4. Please take one and refer to insofar as it is helpful for you. It's a tool to be used, not a law to be obeyed. The recommended passages and prayer suggestions are given to help us seek God's Will together as a church in the time of transition. We're in transition, but that doesn't mean that God isn't at work. Being in transition doesn't mean that our calling has been revoked. Hopefully, this guide will help us in this time. If there's another way God provides for you to search the Scriptures and pray, that's great! Whatever form it takes, let's seek to submit ourselves to the Lord. Let's offer Him every ordinary moment of our lives and see what He does through simple, ordinary things.
