North Carolina is one of five states with the highest number of people who struggle with food insecurity. But we are followers of a Savior who is capable of taking what we give Him and using it to feed the multitudes.

LEVEL 1: LOW INVOLVEMENT

- Purchase food items: OUR GOAL is 10,000 lbs. of food for Mother Hubbard's Cupboard & Alderman's Weekend Backpack Food program
- Prepare a meal for Interfaith Hospitality homeless families once a quarter for one year (4 meals total)
- Donate to the Hunger Relief Offering: this year all the proceeds will be used locally

LEVEL 2: MEDIUM INVOLVEMENT

- Help cook & serve supper at the Good Shepherd House one night a month for one year (12 times)
- Pick up donated food from local businesses for the Tuesday Night Feeding Ministry (weekly or monthly commitment)
- Collect food outside a local grocery store for the Mother Hubbard's Cupboard food drive on Saturday, October 22: this is a great family project - shifts are 2 hour increments

LEVEL 3: HIGH INVOLVEMENT

- Serve lunch once a week at the Good Shepherd House
- Deliver a meal once a week to a senior or Veteran through Meals On Wheels
- Commit to sharing a meal around the table with our guests every week during the Tuesday Night Feeding Ministry to build relationships and show the unconditional love of Christ with homeless men and women

Breaking Bread for Strangers

In the 24th Chapter of Luke's story about Jesus, a guy named Cleopas and his unknown companion walk the dusty road from Jerusalem to Emmaus that Passover. We know how the story ends, so it's easy to forget how they must have felt as they left the city. For centuries, God's people had been waiting for the Messiah to come and now there was a small band of men and women who believed that he had come, and his name was Jesus.

But something went all wrong. A week earlier Jesus had come riding into town to the shouts of thousands, but only a few days later they watched with horror as he was put to death on the cross. And yet that very morning word spread that the women, who had gone to the tomb, had experienced something remarkable which was angels telling them that Jesus was alive! Now you and I know what happens next, but try if you can to put yourself in their shoes for a moment, into that strange mixture of uncertainty and also possibility.

That is when they meet a stranger on the road.

The strange events of the week become their conversation. At first Cleopas and unnamed disciple #2 do all the talking, but when they get to the point of wondering whether the women at the tomb were telling the truth, the stranger takes over. The stranger gets worked up in a hurry, talking about everything that God's been up to throughout history, and helping them understand that this Jesus they were following was the culmination of the whole plan.

Now you and I know who the guy is, but they don't, even when he's quoting scripture and preaching up a storm. **But then they invite him to dinner.**

And Luke says, "when he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. And then their eyes were opened."

So let me ask you...do you think it's just a coincidence that they finally see Jesus when they sit down to eat together? Not hardly.

Beginning this month, we turn our attention to an additional area of brokenness in our community: hunger. North Carolina is one of the top ten states in the nation for people struggling with hunger insecurity, which means you don't know where or when to expect your next meal. That's not a problem that most of us struggle with, but apparently there are quite a few of our neighbors who do. And we can not only change that, but we can also experience something amazing along the way I think. What if we volunteered at Mother Hubbard's cupboard? What if joined the feeding crew at the Good Shepherd Center? What if we came downtown on Tuesday night and sat around the table? If it happened before, it can happen again. When we break bread with strangers, when we open up our lives and let people in, then here's what happens—Jesus appears!

Baptist and First Baptist Church while in Winston-Salem. Mary Beth and Bob have re-engaged with the Forum Sunday School Class. Welcome home!




Frankie Robinson

Seven years ago, Tameka Nixon dreamed of owning her own home. And every day since then she has leaned into that dream, by will and by faith, with great courage and strength and self-determination. But she has not walked alone. For those seven years, The Bridge-CWJC (Christian Women's Job Corps) has walked along side of her, believing in her, encouraging her, equipping her, loving her. Giving her a hand up, not a hand out.

That dream is almost a reality now. In April, ground was broken on Tameka's new Habitat home. Last month, Mary Margaret Brooks prayed a blessing over each of the rooms in the house during a service of dedication. Soon, the loan will close and the keys will be in Tameka's hands, and she and Joshua and Kamahra will move in. A dream realized.

It has been a long journey – out of homelessness, through college, into employment, and now, owning a home. During the dedication, Tameka talked about the people who continue to walk with her along the way, who have poured themselves into her life and the lives of her children. We could stop right here and celebrate the happy ending to this story. But Tameka's story is just beginning.

Tameka's desire for her home is not just a place of shelter and rest for her family. Her desire is to be a beacon of light and hope in her community.

Tameka's determination to live into her dream is not just for the satisfaction of accomplishing what she set out to do, but to show other women who are struggling, that dreams are possible for them as well. Tameka's faithfulness in how she is living her life is not only a way for her to honor God but a witness to her family, to inspire and encourage them to follow her along the way.

Women of The Bridge – CWJC invested themselves in Tameka. That investment is already returning ten - and twenty-fold as Tameka invests herself in the lives of others. That is how God's economy works – always returning abundantly more than we could ever ask or imagine.
