April has come! Aren't we all thankful to God for warm weather, greenery and flowers, birds chirping and most importantly, no more snow. We have indeed been snow weary!

This April also brings Holy Week when we celebrate Jesus' final entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, the unbearable events of Good Friday when Jesus was crucified and the happiest of celebrations on Resurrection Sunday when Jesus triumphs over death and we declare: He is not dead! He is Alive! Needless to say, this is a most holy time for Christians everywhere! Or is it?

For some Easter Sunday may be the one time in the year when they go to church, the only other time being Christmas, or perhaps a wedding, a baptism, or funeral. I do often wonder why this is so?

Sociologists say that we are living in a post-Christian, non-religious society where more and more folks are choosing not to participate in any religious activities and don't go to church on Sunday, or any other day of the week. Many don't have any religious association whatsoever and are now known as "nones."

In an article in the Huffington
Post by Gary Laderman, chair of the
Department of Religion at Emory
University, he writes, "...popular culture in America rules our spiritual
lives and is a more important source
of wisdom, morality, transcendence,
and meaning, than the traditional
institutions like the church that used
to provide these religious elements.
Films, music, the internet, television,
literature—these now are just as im-

portant, if not more important, than the teachings found in sacred texts and theological pronouncements for the younger generation as well as baby boomers. Reality TV and rap, Harry Potter and the Super Bowl provide Americans with moral dramas and existential ideals these days, and can make a profound impact on the lives of followers. Organized religion is clearly losing its authority and relevancy in the day-to-day worlds of Americans, and so those forces that predominate in our culture, such as new media, entertainment, and information technologies are now shaping spiritual sensibilities and sacred values."

Laderman continues, "the rise of the "nones" surely suggests it is the end of religion as we know it. Forget churches; forget priests and pastors; forget the Bible; forget organized religion generally. What is sacred are no longer conventional objects like a cross, a singular religious identity like being a Methodist, nor activities like going to church or prayer. Instead, the religious worlds in the contemporary and future United States are robust and capacious, providing an abundance of spiritual possibilities found in unexpected places like drum circles and meditation exercises, sports events and other expressions from popular culture."

So, given this seeming reality what is the church global and church local to do? What are we the gathered congregation of believers who with faithful consistency come to worship the Lord in community, who continue to uphold that Jesus Christ is Lord of all and savior for whosever

believes, who give of our time and monies to sustain ministries and a church building, who gladly and with joy serve and love our neighbor as ourselves? What are we to do in the face of such seeming realities of folks who say they are spiritual but not religious? Not forget the "nones" but love them, care for them, and show them true happiness.

Be happy, like a room without a roof!!! I say we love Jesus more, we proclaim Jesus more, we serve Jesus more, we follow his example more until we are bursting with happiness and with vitality and with the power of the Holy Spirit to move hearts. We shout it from the mountaintops and we whisper it in people's ears. We embrace with big and long hugs of love. We smile. We believe it! We take off our outer robe, we tie a towel around our waist, we pour water into a basin and we wash feet...ves, smelly, stinky and dirty feet, we wash them in service and in devotion with happiness - heart joy! Now, clap along.



Pastor Mayra recently shared with council a humorous video on greeting visitors that

was modeled on a couple going to a Starbucks "to get a cup of coffee". The wife in the video confessed being nervous because it was years since she had been to Starbucks, and the husband said he had never been to one, so had no idea what to expect. When they arrived, there were "greeters" at the door, but they were involved in a conversation with each other and ignored the couple. So they went in, and got on a line. Some of the folks on the line knew each other and were chatting. One man turned around, looked the couple up and down, and then turned back without saying anything to them. You could tell the couple was starting to get a little uncomfortable. At this point, someone at the counter steps up with a megaphone and says "Is anyone here for the first time? Please, raise your hand so we can know who you are!" The couple looks around hesitantly and then slowly raise their hands. Another person rushes up and says, "Welcome! Please come over here and fill in this form with all of your contact information so we can add you to our mailing list." He pulls them out of the line,

while the husband protests, saying, "All we want is a cup of coffee..." The employee says, "Oh we'll get to that soon, but first we want you to fill out the form..." So after filling out the form, the couple gets back on line. When they get to the counter, they are somewhat overwhelmed by all the choices and questions asked by the counterperson, as well as an offer to join a small coffee group, or sign up for a coffee



class. The wife stammers, "All we wanted was a cup of coffee..." I've taken a little poetic license with the video, but you get the idea.

Sound familiar? The council was struck by how this paralleled some of our well-meaning ways of greeting visitors here at FBC. We have a reputation as a friendly church, and that's great. A few questions are fine. But let's try to remember that visitors may just be here for that "cup of coffee", in our case the warmth and love of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Is that what we are "serving"?
