

What Is AWANA?

AWANA is:

An international non-denominational youth organization-providing weekday clubs for 3 years old through to Grade 6. The letters for AWANA come from the phrase “*Approved workman are not ashamed,*” which is part of a Bible verse found in 2 Timothy 2:15 in the New Testament.

Discipline Standard

Discipline is a process of teaching acceptable behavior and self-control. The motivation for discipline is love for a clubber.

Step 1: Reward good behavior instead of punishing unacceptable behavior;

Step 2: The Leader asks a child to be quiet and begins to use the 3 count,

Step 3: The child is moved away from his/her friends,

Step 4: The club Leader talks to the child to find out what the problem may be,

Step 4: Call parents; (last resort, only in severe cases).

How Can I Help My Child
Memorize Verses?

*Show an interest in your child and what he/she is learning

Tip #1: Read and repeat verses over and over again with your child.

Tip #2: Break up the verses into phrases-learn one phrase then add the next and so on until the whole verse is memorized.

Tip #3: Just spend 5 minutes before bedtime, going over the verses for the coming week. You'll be using this time to train the kids to start a lifelong habit of studying and praying before bed.

Then see how much they remember at breakfast time.

Tip #4: Cut up several small pieces of paper. Tell your child to write one word of the verse on each piece of the paper. Then mix the pieces up and have her/him put the verse in order. Repeat this process several times.
