

Siloam Springs 2019 Parent Information

Logistics:

Be at the church by 8:30 am on Monday, July 22. We leave at 9:00 am. Children should bring a sack lunch and drink. These will be put in an ice chest until we reach the park in Tontitown, where we will eat lunch. We will return Friday at 1:30 pm. Each child will need to bring exactly \$10.00 (Bro. Caleb will not have change on Monday) for lunch on Friday. This will be given to Bro. Caleb before we leave and given back to the child at lunch on Friday.

Dress Code:

Shorts (not shorter than the tips of the camper's fingers with their arms extended toward their knees) are acceptable in all services. Undergarments should not show under or over clothing. Midriffs should not show. Halter-tops and shirt/dress straps less than an inch wide are not allowed. Message t-shirts featuring rock music groups, alcohol, tobacco products, or inappropriate or suggestive statements are not allowed. Hats or caps will not be worn in the worship center.

Themed Dress:

Each full day of camp, kids can choose to wear their normal camp clothes or a themed attire for the day. If they choose to dress up, they will receive color team points.

Swimming Pool:

No bikinis or one-pieces that resemble a bikini. T-shirts worn over bikinis are not an option. One piece swim suits only. Speedos are also not allowed.

Cell Phones:

Campers do not bring cell phones. Bro. Caleb will have one. His number is (501) 304-3887. Parents, feel free to call if you need to contact your child. Adults may bring a cell phone.

Stuff to Leave at Home:

Guns, knives, fireworks, pets, tobacco products, alcohol, electronics, cell phones, roller skates, skateboards, scooters, ATV's, motorcycles, and bicycles. If an item is in question, call Bro. Daniel.

Stuff to Bring:

Bible, pen/pencil, sheets for twin bed/sleeping bag, pillow, towels, clothes for the week (**three sets for each day is recommended**), fan, extension cord, surge protector, toiletries, sunscreen, bug spray, rain gear, watch, shower shoes, creek shoes, tennis shoes, swimsuit, water bottle, and spending money.

Snacks:

If a camper wants to buy any items from the Snack Shack, he/she must purchase a Snack Shack Card. Snack Shack Cards may be purchased for \$5 each. Any unused amounts on Snack Shack Cards may be redeemed Thursday night. Campers may bring snacks for the dorm; however, snacks should be in single serving packages instead of family-sized bags. These smaller packages will help keep the cabins clean. Some campers bring bottled water.

Book Store:

Camp souvenirs, t-shirts, toiletries, gifts, etc. are available for purchase at the camp Book Store. T-shirt costs range from \$8.00 to \$20.00.

First Aid Station:

A registered nurse or paramedic will be on duty at the First Aid Station. He/she will be on call in case of an emergency. A schedule for routine medications will be announced for each week. All medicines will be dispensed at the First Aid Station by qualified personnel. All cases of sickness or injury should be reported to the First Aid Station.

Mail and Telephones:

Campers can receive mail from family and friends. It usually takes 2-3 days for mail to reach the Arkansas Baptist Assembly, so send mail early. Campers should check with the Business Office during the morning break or in the afternoon break to pick up their mail. Mail should be addressed to:
