

# Fuel

Leader Handbook



## **CONCEPT:**

Sunday mornings are the next step in the discipleship of students at FBC Dover. The goal is to involve the students in basic Bible study and help them to develop a cohesive group relationship as a part of the body of Christ. It is targeted at students whose families consider FBC Dover their home church and saved students who attend FOCUS and have no other home church. In order to do this, we must

- ⇒Keep track of who is coming
- ⇒Take note of absences
- ⇒Develop a relationship connection between church and student
- ⇒Contact absentees
- ⇒Individually challenge students to apply the Truths of Scripture to their lives
- ⇒Provide leadership opportunities for students
- Maintain a safe, orderly environment conducive to effectively reaching the teenage culture of Dover



Taking this a step further, in order to foster viable disicpleship accountability and encourage not only students, but their families as well to become involved in activities and church services, we must

- Keep accurate contact information on the attending students
- ⇒Coordinate with the appropriate adult Sunday School classes
- ⇒ Contact the families of those attending
  who are not church members
- ⇒Ensure that students and families receive information about relevant upcoming events
- ⇒Be in regular prayer concerning these outreach efforts

This is where fuel leaders come in to play. Through following the job description and making the personal commitment both outlined in this guide, the stage is set to meet the above objectives through our diligence, it is my prayer that the Lord will bless our efforts by growing the youth ministry in both spiritual maturity and physical growth.



#### **GROUP COMMITMENT:**

1 year commitment 3-4 hours per week

- ⇒Weekly meeting with your Fuel group
- ⇒ Meetings with Fuel leaders as needed
- Meeting with Fuel group members as needed
- ⇒Contacting Fuel group members regularly

#### PERSONAL COMMITMENT:

- ⇒Regular devotion time with God
- ⇒Growing in relationship with Christ
- ⇒Praying for Fuel members, the small group meeting, and unbelieving friends
- ⇒Living a life consistent with Scripture



## **JOB DESCRIPTION**

- 1. Be at Fuel.
  - A. Arrive 15 minutes before start.
  - B. Let the Minister to Students know if you are not going to be at Fuel a particular week and arrange for a substitute..
  - C. Hang out with students, look for new or uninvolved kids; introduce them to others. Get to know them, help them to not be isolated. Interact with students.
  - D. Serve in a supervisory/crowd control capacity and maintain a safe environment.
- 2. Lead your group.
  - A. Arrive prepared and well rested.
  - B. Take note of absent students. Contact them during the week.
  - C. Develop appropriate relationships with the students in your group.
  - D. Periodically organize a group activity outside of the planned youth events.
  - E. Contact new students sometime within the next week.
  - F. Provide leadership opportunities for the students in your group.



3. Let the Minister of Students know of anything unusual or requiring further attention.
