From the Pastor

As the sun begins to shine and we all spend more time outside, I'm longing for some time in the mountains. Ever since my first run down the slopes at Winter Park a decade ago, the top of a mountain has become a refuge for me. Men's retreats in the mountains, getting away to pray, climbing a 14er in Colorado and not having a lung collapse..... All times when I felt closer to God.

I also was reminded of a quote from a devotional from Charles Spurgeon:

"Our knowledge of Christ is somewhat like climbing a mountain. When you are at the base you see but little: the mountain itself appears to be but half as high as it really is. Confined in a little valley, you hardly discover anything but the rippling brooks as they descend into the stream at the foot of the mountain. Climb the first rising knoll, and the valley lengthens and widens beneath your feet. Go higher, and you see the country for four or five miles round, and you are delighted with the widening prospect.

Mount still, and the scene enlarges, till at last, when you are on the summit, and look east, west, north, and south, you see almost all the land lying before you. Over there is a forest in some distant county, perhaps 200 miles away, and here the sea, and there a shining river and the smoking chimneys of a manufacturing town, or the masts of the ships in a busy port. All these things please and delight you, and you say, "I could not have imagined that so much could be seen at this elevation."

Now, the Christian life is of the same order. When we first believe in Christ we see but little of him. The higher we climb the more we discover of his beauties. But who has ever reached the summit? Who has known all the heights and depths of the love of Christ which passes knowledge?

Paul, when grown old, sitting grey-haired, shivering in a dungeon in Rome, could say with greater emphasis than we can, "I know whom I have believed," for each experience had been like the climbing of a hill, each trial had been like ascending another summit, and his death seemed like gaining the top of the mountain, from which he could see the whole of the faithfulness and the love of him to whom he had committed his soul. Get yourself up, dear friend, into the high mountain."

As we climb the mountain of our faith, we start out at a rapid pace, then begin to drag as the elevation climbs. We stop, rest, take on some water, and then get moving again. Sometimes it feels as if the world is moving past us and we are standing still! There are moments where we are just about to quit, and then something moves our foot one.more.step. until we reach the top.

At the top we find such joy and satisfaction for making it through the struggle that is now behind us. We quickly forget just how painful and on the verge of giving up we really teetered.

Over the last few weeks, we've seen Jesus, in Mark's gospel, striving to open wide the eyes of his disciples. Again and again, they just don't get it. Jesus gets frustrated, yet shows great patience and grace. This is the same pattern of grace he pours onto each of us.

Don't ever give up. Don't ever take your eyes off of the prize. Each grueling step puts us one moment closer to the King. He's worth it. He's the only thing that matters.

Jesus is EVERYTHING!!

I pray for each of you and your daily steps up the mountain.

The proposed budget for our upcoming budget year has been presented to the Church Board and was approved to be presented for congregation approval at our congregational meeting in May. The unknown of pastoral transition appears to be in our rearview mirror and the proposed budget has been prepared with the mentality of getting "back to business." The exercise of streamlining operations during our period of search proved to be successful in eliminating areas of budget inefficiency and has allowed for this upcoming budget year to reflect some exciting plans and programs in the year to come. As we approach our congregational meeting, copies of the proposed budget will be available for review at the Church. If you have any questions please let me know or feel free to contact the appropriate ministry team leader.

It is at this time of voting on a budget when the reality of bills and expenses of the Church raise their ugly heads and we can lose focus on what we are actually trying to do through our programs, our people, and our building. It is also a time when the message of offering can turn to one more of fundraising. In thinking about this and trying to make sure that the finance committee stayed focused on our Church's purpose and not so much the "bottom-line" I came across this message that I would like to share with you.

"If Christians really understood the pearl of great price there would be no need for long messages on giving."

I think this is an interesting idea. There is no guarantee of return in this statement. We might see a return of our gift, but then again we might not. But one thing is guaranteed through our giving, if we give something of value then someone in need will receive something of value. God understands all of our needs and will take care of us.

Jesus is the pearl of great price. Out of love, He gave all that He had to get what He valued most, us. If we also give out of love, others will get what we value, Him.

Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it. (Matthew 13:44-45)


Anna Jean Wheat Celebrates her 90th Birthday!

Kidney Walk 2013 – Team Wyoming – Making a Difference

On Sunday, May 19, I will participate for my 5th year in the Kidney Walk put on by the National Kidney Foundation (NKF), which helps raise awareness of kidney disease and money towards research and support of those with kidney disease and kidney transplants. I am team captain of Team Wyoming – Making a Difference. We are the only team that travels from Wyoming to participate in the Kidney Walk.

As you may already know, I was diagnosed wi/kidney failure at age 19, cause unknown. I went on dialysis and later received a kidney transplant from a "non-living, non-related" donor. It lasted 12 great years and then I had to go back on dialysis again. In 2005, I received another transplant from a non-living, non-related donor. At the time I was living in Colorado, but was told that the kidney came from Wyoming. I like to say that my kidney is doing so well because it came home . . . it loves Wyoming! [My creatnine has been holding steady at 1.2.]

I also walk for my best friend Jeanni who doesn't have a transplant, but has been living a long time on dialysis. It's rough, let me tell you, but she is doing it. Pray for her and for me and let's hope that someday there is a cure for kidney disease.

Top Ten Reasons to Walk the Kidney Walk

- 1. Chronic kidney disease affects 26 million Americans and millions more are at risk
- 2. People can live a healthy life with just one kidney
- 3. Kidney disease is common, harmful and treatable
- 4. Kidneys are cool and need love, too
- 5. Risk factors include high blood pressure, diabetes and family history
- 6. Early detection can slow the progression of kidney disease
- 7. Once kidneys fail, patients need dialysis or a transplant to survive
- 8. Kidneys help you tinkle
- 9. Over 104,000 people are waiting for an organ transplant
- 10. Again, kidneys = cool



Twenty-five years ago God freed me from alcohol addiction. He used The Twelve Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous as a tool for my recovery. I know from personal experience that The Twelve Steps work for many of us, and not just for alcohol addiction, but for other forms of addictions, or compulsions or obsessions: spending, gambling, overeating, controlling, perpetual lying, unforgiveness, resentment, and inappropriate anger, fear or guilt. No list is comprehensive enough to address all the areas within which we sinners get in trouble. This side of heaven, we all continue to suffer the effects of sin.

J. Keith Miller in his book A Hunger for Healing: The Twelve Steps as a Classic Model for Christian Spiritual Growth writes, "Millions of people find that working these steps frees them from compulsion and creates serenity, peace, joy and healthier relationships with God and others,"(7). The Twelve Step program is rooted in spiritual principles displayed prominently in God's Word.

As a Christian, I want my life to bring glory to God; however, there is an area of my life in which I have no victory. I believe that by working The Twelve Steps together with other Christians who have similar issues, and becoming accountable to one another, we sisters and brothers in Christ can find hope and recovery.
