PASTORS NOTES:

As I sat in my study early Sunday, going over morning's sermon, I heard a bloodcurdling knew cry. 1 immediately what it was so I jumped out of my chair and moved towards the hallway. Before I got there, one of our youngest cats, the named Skeeter, went by in a flash and disappeared under the bed not to be seen for another hour. It was he who let out this What had agonizing cry. happened to him wasn't his fault though. It was the consequence of one of our dog's actions.

As happens with a lot of dogs during the 4th of July, Jesse (our dog) was very disturbed with all the bangs, pops and whistles associated with this holiday. In her mind she felt she would be better off outside of her yard which is surrounded by a chain link fence. Of course we knew there was no place she could go to get away from all the noise but she was bound and determined to find such a place.

After being out several times and after the holiday passed, Jesse decided she liked roaming the neighborhood at her leisure. This of course did not set well with us. It is not in her best interest or our neighbors for her to roam around all night.

So Saturday we took steps. We put a low voltage hot wire around the interior of our fence, something we had to do in years past. The difference today is that our cats have never been introduced to a hot wire.

I really felt sorry for Skeeter when he did finally come out. I was glad to see he was alright but boy was he sheepish. He came in the study walking softly and you could tell he was spooked. The sad thing was it wasn't his fault. He didn't create the problem but yet he paid the price. He was bit by the hotwire. He entered into the consequences of Jesse's actions.

So it is in life when we step out of the Spirit and into the flesh. The decisions we make, the words we say, the actions we take can have a lasting effect on all those around us. Skeeter has ventured outside again but not beyond the deck and nowhere near the fence. I suppose he will eventually but he now has to adjust his life to this new reality.

How many people are you requiring to adjust to a new reality because of your actions? In Sunday's sermon I referred to David and a decision he made that was not in line with the will of God. The consequences were disastrous for those around him. You can read about it in 1 Chronicles 21:1-14. Sometimes like David we make decisions which seem minor but the consequences for those around us can be major.

How do we protect those around us and ourselves from the consequences of poor choices? The easy answer is to "...walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh." (Galatians 5:16) How do we do this, walk by the Spirit in order to avoid problems? "And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests...." (Ephesians 6:18) Be intimate with and pray to God 24/7 in and for all occasions and He will protect you and those around you from getting bit from consequences.

Don't Fight Fire With Fire

In responding to an angry reaction, remember that "a gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger" (Prov. 15:1). Respond to anger with a gentle voice, relaxed posture, and calm gestures. Communicate in every way that you take the other's expression of anger seriously and want to help resolve the problems that prompt it. Plan ahead how to respond to possible objections and deal with them specifically and reasonably.

Food for Thought

If you're counting on excellent self-control or a naturally sunny disposition to keep you from responding harshly to a burst of anger from someone else today, you're drawing from an awfully shallow well. Chances are your "well of gentleness" will run dry ... at exactly the worst moment.

The source of the "gentle answer" to anger that's recommended in Proverbs isn't you at all. It is none other than Christ, as he desires to make an appeal through us precisely at the moment that another unloads anger. As Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 5:18-19, "All this"--including the ability to respond to anger with a gentle answer--"is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation."

So if you find yourself on the receiving end of a blast of anger today, don't rely on yourself to respond gently. Instead, pray briefly, then invite Christ to make his appeal through you. As Paul notes, God has committed the message of reconciliation to you; it is your birthright as a Christian. Far more reliable than your own pleasant demeanor, it is a constant within you. Pray for God's guidance to draw upon it even in the most trying circumstances.

There is a passage in James that shares with believers what they are to do if they desire God's healing touch. James 5:14-15, "ds anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up..."

In this verse we see some pretty specific steps to receive the full healing God desires to give.

1. Call the Elders 2. Let them pray over you 3. Be anointed with oil

- 2. The Lord will raise them up
