Jacques and Maisey understand fairness and justice. When I am eating popcorn, they know that each of them must take turns to get a piece of popcorn, and they keep track of whose turn it is. Jacques will not accept

his morning Greenie until he sees that Maisey has received hers. They know that if they stand still for me to apply their monthly flea medication, they will each get a treat. If Jacques gets a treat but Maisey doesn't, Jacques drops his treat and waits for me to give Maisey hers. This sense of justice is not trained; it is innate. Multiple scientific studies have shown a natural sense of justice in dogs. Most recently, a study suggested that this sense of fairness is an ancestral trait rather than a result of domestication. In partner sets of wolves and domesticated dogs, the wolves were quicker to refuse participation in an activity when they realized that pressing a buzzer was not being rewarded equally among the partners. It was suggested that interaction with humans had eroded the sense of

justice in the domesticated dogs.

What does this tell us? If God has placed a sense of justice in wild dogs, I must believe that he has placed an even greater sense of justice in His children. We are reminded in the book of Micah to do justice, to love mercy, and to walk with our God. Our God is a God of justice AND mercy. As we walk with Him, we are able to clearly see justice from His perspective. Outside of relationship with God, our sense of justice can be quickly eroded to the point where a person will only recognize injustice if it is committed against them personally. As believers, we are called to a great responsibility of finding spiritual balance between doing justice and showing mercy. The only way this happens is through our walk with God.

"He has shown you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?" – Micah 6:8
