PRAY (96)

(Genesis 20:7) Now then, return the man's wife, for he is a prophet, so that he will pray for you, and you shall live. But if you do not return her, know that you shall surely die, you and all who are yours."

(Numbers 21:7) And the people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you. Pray to the LORD, that he take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people.

(1 Samuel 7:5) Then Samuel said, "Gather all Israel at Mizpah, and I will pray to the LORD for you."

(1 Samuel 12:19) And all the people said to Samuel, "Pray for your servants to the LORD your God, that we may not die, for we have added to all our sins this evil, to ask for ourselves a king."

(1 Samuel 12:23) Moreover, as for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD by ceasing to pray for you, and I will instruct you in the good and the right way.

(2 Samuel 7:27) For you, O LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, have made this revelation to your servant, saying, 'I will build you a house.' Therefore your servant has found courage to pray this prayer to you.

(1 Kings 8:30) And listen to the plea of your servant and of your people Israel, when they pray toward this place. And listen in heaven your dwelling place, and when you hear, forgive.

(1 Kings 8:33) "When your people Israel are defeated before the enemy because they have sinned against you, and if they turn again to you and acknowledge your name and pray and plead with you in this house,

(1 Kings 8:35) "When heaven is shut up and there is no rain because they have sinned against you, if they pray toward this place and acknowledge your name and turn from their sin, when you afflict them,

(1 Kings 8:44) "If your people go out to battle against their enemy, by whatever way you shall send them, and they pray to the LORD toward the city that you have chosen and the house that I have built for your name,

(1 Kings 8:48) if they repent with all their mind and with all their heart in the land of their enemies, who carried them captive, and pray to you toward their land, which you gave to their fathers, the city that you have chosen, and the house that I have built for your name,

(1 Kings 13:6) And the king said to the man of God, "Entreat now the favor of the LORD your God, and pray for me, that my hand may be restored to me." And the man of God entreated the LORD, and the king's hand was restored to him and became as it was before.

(1 Chronicles 17:25) For you, my God, have revealed to your servant that you will build a house for him. Therefore your servant has found courage to pray before you.

(2 Chronicles 6:21) And listen to the pleas of your servant and of your people Israel, when they pray toward this place. And listen from heaven your dwelling place, and when you hear, forgive.

(2 Chronicles 6:24) "If your people Israel are defeated before the enemy because they have sinned against you, and they turn again and acknowledge your name and pray and plead with you in this house,

(2 Chronicles 6:26) "When heaven is shut up and there is no rain because they have sinned against you, if they pray toward this place and acknowledge your name and turn from their sin, when you afflict them,

(2 Chronicles 6:34) "If your people go out to battle against their enemies, by whatever way you shall send them, and they pray to you toward this city that you have chosen and the house that I have built for your name,

(2 Chronicles 6:38) if they repent with all their mind and with all their heart in the land of their captivity to which they were carried captive, and pray toward their land, which you gave to their fathers, the city that you have chosen and the house that I have built for your name,

(2 Chronicles 7:14) if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land.

(Ezra 6:10) that they may offer pleasing sacrifices to the God of heaven and pray for the life of the king and his sons.

(Nehemiah 1:6) let your ear be attentive and your eyes open, to hear the prayer of your servant that I now pray before you day and night for the people of Israel your servants, confessing the sins of the people of Israel, which we have sinned against you. Even I and my father's house have sinned.

(Job 21:15) What is the Almighty, that we should serve him? And what profit do we get if we pray to him?'

(Job 42:8) Now therefore take seven bulls and seven rams and go to my servant Job and offer up a burnt offering for yourselves. And my servant Job shall pray for you, for I will accept his prayer not to deal with you according to your folly. For you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has."

(Psalms 5:2) Give attention to the sound of my cry, my King and my God, for to you do I pray.

(Psalms 116:4) Then I called on the name of the LORD: "O LORD, I pray, deliver my soul!"

(Psalms 118:25) Save us, we pray, O LORD! O LORD, we pray, give us success!

(Psalms 122:6) Pray for the peace of Jerusalem! "May they be secure who love you!"

(Isaiah 16:12) And when Moab presents himself, when he wearies himself on the high place, when he comes to his sanctuary to pray, he will not prevail.

(Jeremiah 7:16) "As for you, do not pray for this people, or lift up a cry or prayer for them, and do not intercede with me, for I will not hear you.

(Jeremiah 11:14) "Therefore do not pray for this people, or lift up a cry or prayer on their behalf, for I will not listen when they call to me in the time of their trouble.

(Jeremiah 14:11) The LORD said to me: "Do not pray for the welfare of this people.

(Jeremiah 29:7) But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.

(Jeremiah 29:12) Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will hear you.

(Jeremiah 37:3) King Zedekiah sent Jehucal the son of Shelemiah, and Zephaniah the priest, the son of Maaseiah, to Jeremiah the prophet, saying, "Please pray for us to the LORD our God."

(Jeremiah 42:2) and said to Jeremiah the prophet, "Let our plea for mercy come before you, and pray to the LORD your God for us, for all this remnant--because we are left with but a few, as your eyes see us--

(Jeremiah 42:4) Jeremiah the prophet said to them, "I have heard you. Behold, I will pray to the LORD your God according to your request, and whatever the LORD answers you I will tell you. I will keep nothing back from you."

(Jeremiah 42:20) that you have gone astray at the cost of your lives. For you sent me to the LORD your God, saying, 'Pray for us to the LORD our God, and whatever the LORD our God says declare to us and we will do it.'

(Matthew 5:44) But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you,

(Matthew 6:5) "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward.

(Matthew 6:6) But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

(Matthew 6:7) "And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words.

(Matthew 6:9) Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.

(Matthew 9:38) therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

(Matthew 14:23) And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone,

(Matthew 19:13) Then children were brought to him that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked the people,

(Matthew 24:20) Pray that your flight may not be in winter or on a Sabbath.

(Matthew 26:36) Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray."

(Matthew 26:41) Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

(Mark 6:46) And after he had taken leave of them, he went up on the mountain to pray.

(Mark 13:18) Pray that it may not happen in winter.

(Mark 14:32) And they went to a place called Gethsemane. And he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray."

(Mark 14:38) Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."

(Luke 5:16) But he would withdraw to desolate places and pray.

(Luke 6:12) In these days he went out to the mountain to pray, and all night he continued in prayer to God.

(Luke 6:28) bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.

(Luke 9:28) Now about eight days after these sayings he took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray.

(Luke 10:2) And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.

(Luke 11:1) Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples."

(Luke 11:2) And he said to them, "When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come.

(Luke 18:1) And he told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart.

(Luke 18:10) "Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector.

(Luke 22:40) And when he came to the place, he said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation."

(Luke 22:46) and he said to them, "Why are you sleeping? Rise and pray that you may not enter into temptation."

(Acts 8:22) Repent, therefore, of this wickedness of yours, and pray to the Lord that, if possible, the intent of your heart may be forgiven you.

(Acts 8:24) And Simon answered, "Pray for me to the Lord, that nothing of what you have said may come upon me."

(Acts 10:9) The next day, as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the housetop about the sixth hour to pray.

(Romans 8:26) Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words.

(1 Corinthians 11:13) Judge for yourselves: is it proper for a wife to pray to God with her head uncovered?

(1 Corinthians 14:13) Therefore, one who speaks in a tongue should pray for the power to interpret.

(1 Corinthians 14:14) For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays but my mind is unfruitful.

(1 Corinthians 14:15) What am I to do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will pray with my mind also; I will sing praise with my spirit, but I will sing with my mind also.

(2 Corinthians 9:14) while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God upon you.

(2 Corinthians 13:7) But we pray to God that you may not do wrong--not that we may appear to have met the test, but that you may do what is right, though we may seem to have failed.

(2 Corinthians 13:9) For we are glad when we are weak and you are strong. Your restoration is what we pray for.

(Colossians 1:3) We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you,

(Colossians 1:9) And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding,

(Colossians 4:3) At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison--

(1 Thessalonians 3:10) as we pray most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith?

(1 Thessalonians 5:17) pray without ceasing,

(1 Thessalonians 5:25) Brothers, pray for us.

(2 Thessalonians 1:11) To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and may fulfill every resolve for good and every work of faith by his power,

(2 Thessalonians 3:1) Finally, brothers, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may speed ahead and be honored, as happened among you,

(1 Timothy 2:8) I desire then that in every place the men should pray, lifting holy hands without anger or quarreling;

(Philemon 1:6) and I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ.

(Hebrews 13:18) Pray for us, for we are sure that we have a clear conscience, desiring to act honorably in all things.

(James 5:13) Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise.

(James 5:14) Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord.

(James 5:16) Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.

(1 John 5:16) If anyone sees his brother committing a sin not leading to death, he shall ask, and God will give him life--to those who commit sins that do not lead to death. There is sin that leads to death; I do not say that one should pray for that.

(3 John 1:2) Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, as it goes well with your soul.

PRAYS (9)

(1 Kings 8:28) Yet have regard to the prayer of your servant and to his plea, O LORD my God, listening to the cry and to the prayer that your servant prays before you this day,

(1 Kings 8:42) (for they shall hear of your great name and your mighty hand, and of your outstretched arm), when he comes and prays toward this house,

(2 Chronicles 6:19) Yet have regard to the prayer of your servant and to his plea, O LORD my God, listening to the cry and to the prayer that your servant prays before you,

(2 Chronicles 6:32) "Likewise, when a foreigner, who is not of your people Israel, comes from a far country for the sake of your great name and your mighty hand and your outstretched arm, when he comes and prays toward this house,

(Job 33:26) then man prays to God, and he accepts him; he sees his face with a shout of joy, and he restores to man his righteousness.

(Isaiah 44:17) And the rest of it he makes into a god, his idol, and falls down to it and worships it. He prays to it and says, "Deliver me, for you are my god!"

(1 Corinthians 11:4) Every man who prays or prophesies with his head covered dishonors his head,

(1 Corinthians 11:5) but every wife who prays or prophesies with her head uncovered dishonors her head, since it is the same as if her head were shaven.

(1 Corinthians 14:14) For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays but my mind is unfruitful.

PRAYED (68)

(Genesis 20:17) Then Abraham prayed to God, and God healed Abimelech, his wife and his slave girls so they could have children again,

(Genesis 24:12) Then he prayed, "O LORD, God of my master Abraham, give me success today, and show kindness to my master Abraham.

(Genesis 25:21) Isaac prayed to the LORD on behalf of his wife, because she was barren. The LORD answered his prayer, and his wife Rebekah became pregnant.

(Genesis 32:9) Then Jacob prayed, "O God of my father Abraham, God of my father Isaac, O LORD, who said to me, 'Go back to your country and your relatives, and I will make you prosper,'

(Exodus 8:30) Then Moses left Pharaoh and prayed to the LORD,

(Exodus 10:18) Moses then left Pharaoh and prayed to the LORD.

(Numbers 11:2) When the people cried out to Moses, he prayed to the LORD and the fire died down.

(Numbers 21:7) The people came to Moses and said, "We sinned when we spoke against the LORD and against you. Pray that the LORD will take the snakes away from us." So Moses prayed for the people.

(Deuteronomy 9:20) And the LORD was angry enough with Aaron to destroy him, but at that time I prayed for Aaron too.

(Deuteronomy 9:26) I prayed to the LORD and said, "O Sovereign LORD, do not destroy your people, your own inheritance that you redeemed by your great power and brought out of Egypt with a mighty hand.

(Judges 13:8) Then Manoah prayed to the LORD: "O Lord, I beg you, let the man of God you sent to us come again to teach us how to bring up the boy who is to be born."

(Judges 16:28) Then Samson prayed to the LORD, "O Sovereign LORD, remember me. O God, please strengthen me just once more, and let me with one blow get revenge on the Philistines for my two eyes."

(1 Samuel 1:10) In bitterness of soul Hannah wept much and prayed to the LORD.

(1 Samuel 1:27) I prayed for this child, and the LORD has granted me what I asked of him.

(1 Samuel 2:1) Then Hannah prayed and said: "My heart rejoices in the LORD; in the LORD my horn is lifted high. My mouth boasts over my enemies, for I delight in your deliverance.

(1 Samuel 2:20) Eli would bless Elkanah and his wife, saying, "May the LORD give you children by this woman to take the place of the one she prayed for and gave to the LORD." Then they would go home.

(1 Samuel 8:6) But when they said, "Give us a king to lead us," this displeased Samuel; so he prayed to the LORD.

(1 Samuel 14:41) Then Saul prayed to the LORD, the God of Israel, "Give me the right answer." And Jonathan and Saul were taken by lot, and the men were cleared.

(2 Samuel 15:31) Now David had been told, "Ahithophel is among the conspirators with Absalom." So David prayed, "O LORD, turn Ahithophel's counsel into foolishness."

(1 Kings 8:59) And may these words of mine, which I have prayed before the LORD, be near to the LORD our God day and night, that he may uphold the cause of his servant and the cause of his people Israel according to each day's need,

(1 Kings 18:36) At the time of sacrifice, the prophet Elijah stepped forward and prayed: "O LORD, God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel, let it be known today that you are God in Israel and that I am your servant and have done all these things at your command.

(1 Kings 19:4) while he himself went a day's journey into the desert. He came to a broom tree, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. "I have had enough, LORD," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors."

(2 Kings 4:33) He went in, shut the door on the two of them and prayed to the LORD.

(2 Kings 6:17) And Elisha prayed, "O LORD, open his eyes so he may see." Then the LORD opened the servant's eyes, and he looked and saw the hills full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha.

(2 Kings 6:18) As the enemy came down toward him, Elisha prayed to the LORD, "Strike these people with blindness." So he struck them with blindness, as Elisha had asked.

(2 Kings 19:15) And Hezekiah prayed to the LORD: "O LORD, God of Israel, enthroned between the cherubim, you alone are God over all the kingdoms of the earth. You have made heaven and earth.

(2 Kings 20:2) Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed to the LORD,

(2 Chronicles 30:18) Although most of the many people who came from Ephraim, Manasseh, Issachar and Zebulun had not purified themselves, yet they ate the Passover, contrary to what was written. But Hezekiah prayed for them, saying, "May the LORD, who is good, pardon everyone

(2 Chronicles 32:24) In those days Hezekiah became ill and was at the point of death. He prayed to the LORD, who answered him and gave him a miraculous sign.

(2 Chronicles 33:13) And when he prayed to him, the LORD was moved by his entreaty and listened to his plea; so he brought him back to Jerusalem and to his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the LORD is God.

(Ezra 9:6) and prayed: "O my God, I am too ashamed and disgraced to lift up my face to you, my God, because our sins are higher than our heads and our guilt has reached to the heavens.

(Nehemiah 1:4) When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven.

(Nehemiah 2:4) The king said to me, "What is it you want?" Then I prayed to the God of heaven,

(Nehemiah 4:9) But we prayed to our God and posted a guard day and night to meet this threat.

(Nehemiah 6:9) They were all trying to frighten us, thinking, "Their hands will get too weak for the work, and it will not be completed." But I prayed, "Now strengthen my hands."

(Job 42:10) After Job had prayed for his friends, the LORD made him prosperous again and gave him twice as much as he had before.

(Isaiah 37:15) And Hezekiah prayed to the LORD:

(Isaiah 37:21) Then Isaiah son of Amoz sent a message to Hezekiah: "This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: Because you have prayed to me concerning Sennacherib king of Assyria,

(Isaiah 38:2) Hezekiah turned his face to the wall and prayed to the LORD,

(Jeremiah 32:16) "After I had given the deed of purchase to Baruch son of Neriah, I prayed to the LORD:

(Daniel 6:10) Now when Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before.

(Daniel 9:4) I prayed to the LORD my God and confessed: "O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps his covenant of love with all who love him and obey his commands,

(Jonah 2:1) From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the LORD his God.

(Jonah 4:2) He prayed to the LORD, "O LORD, is this not what I said when I was still at home? That is why I was so quick to flee to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity.

(Matthew 26:39) Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

(Matthew 26:42) He went away a second time and prayed, "My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to be taken away unless I drink it, may your will be done."

(Matthew 26:44) So he left them and went away once more and prayed the third time, saying the same thing.

(Mark 1:35) Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed.

(Mark 14:35) Going a little farther, he fell to the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from him.

(Mark 14:39) Once more he went away and prayed the same thing.

(Luke 5:16) But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed.

(Luke 18:11) The Pharisee stood up and prayed about himself: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men--robbers, evildoers, adulterers--or even like this tax collector.

(Luke 22:32) But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned back, strengthen your brothers."

(Luke 22:41) He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed,

(Luke 22:44) And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground.

(John 17:1) After Jesus said this, he looked toward heaven and prayed: "Father, the time has come. Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you.

(Acts 1:24) Then they prayed, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which of these two you have chosen

(Acts 4:31) After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.

(Acts 6:6) They presented these men to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

(Acts 7:59) While they were stoning him, Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit."

(Acts 8:15) When they arrived, they prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit,

(Acts 9:40) Peter sent them all out of the room; then he got down on his knees and prayed. Turning toward the dead woman, he said, "Tabitha, get up." She opened her eyes, and seeing Peter she sat up.

(Acts 10:2) He and all his family were devout and God-fearing; he gave generously to those in need and prayed to God regularly.

(Acts 13:3) So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off.

(Acts 20:36) When he had said this, he knelt down with all of them and prayed.

(Acts 27:29) Fearing that we would be dashed against the rocks, they dropped four anchors from the stern and prayed for daylight.

(James 5:17) Elijah was a man just like us. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years.

(James 5:18) Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops.

PRAYER (115)

(Genesis 25:21) And Isaac prayed to the LORD for his wife, because she was barren. And the LORD granted his prayer, and Rebekah his wife conceived.

(2 Samuel 7:27) For you, O LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, have made this revelation to your servant, saying, 'I will build you a house.' Therefore your servant has found courage to pray this prayer to you.

(1 Kings 8:28) Yet have regard to the prayer of your servant and to his plea, O LORD my God, listening to the cry and to the prayer that your servant prays before you this day,

(1 Kings 8:29) that your eyes may be open night and day toward this house, the place of which you have said, 'My name shall be there,' that you may listen to the prayer that your servant offers toward this place.

(1 Kings 8:38) whatever prayer, whatever plea is made by any man or by all your people Israel, each knowing the affliction of his own heart and stretching out his hands toward this house,

(1 Kings 8:45) then hear in heaven their prayer and their plea, and maintain their cause.

(1 Kings 8:49) then hear in heaven your dwelling place their prayer and their plea, and maintain their cause

(1 Kings 8:54) Now as Solomon finished offering all this prayer and plea to the LORD, he arose from before the altar of the LORD, where he had knelt with hands outstretched toward heaven.

(1 Kings 9:3) And the LORD said to him, "I have heard your prayer and your plea, which you have made before me. I have consecrated this house that you have built, by putting my name there forever. My eyes and my heart will be there for all time.

(2 Kings 6:18) And when the Syrians came down against him, Elisha prayed to the LORD and said, "Please strike this people with blindness." So he struck them with blindness in accordance with the prayer of Elisha.

(2 Kings 19:4) It may be that the LORD your God heard all the words of the Rabshakeh, whom his master the king of Assyria has sent to mock the living God, and will rebuke the words that the LORD your God has heard; therefore lift up your prayer for the remnant that is left."

(2 Kings 19:20) Then Isaiah the son of Amoz sent to Hezekiah, saying, "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: Your prayer to me about Sennacherib king of Assyria I have heard.

(2 Kings 20:5) "Turn back, and say to Hezekiah the leader of my people, Thus says the LORD, the God of David your father: I have heard your prayer; I have seen your tears. Behold, I will heal you. On the third day you shall go up to the house of the LORD,

(2 Chronicles 6:19) Yet have regard to the prayer of your servant and to his plea, O LORD my God, listening to the cry and to the prayer that your servant prays before you,

(2 Chronicles 6:20) that your eyes may be open day and night toward this house, the place where you have promised to set your name, that you may listen to the prayer that your servant offers toward this place.

(2 Chronicles 6:29) whatever prayer, whatever plea is made by any man or by all your people Israel, each knowing his own affliction and his own sorrow and stretching out his hands toward this house,

(2 Chronicles 6:35) then hear from heaven their prayer and their plea, and maintain their cause.

(2 Chronicles 6:39) then hear from heaven your dwelling place their prayer and their pleas, and maintain their cause and forgive your people who have sinned against you.

(2 Chronicles 6:40) Now, O my God, let your eyes be open and your ears attentive to the prayer of this place.

(2 Chronicles 7:1) As soon as Solomon finished his prayer, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices, and the glory of the LORD filled the temple.

(2 Chronicles 7:12) Then the LORD appeared to Solomon in the night and said to him: "I have heard your prayer and have chosen this place for myself as a house of sacrifice.

(2 Chronicles 7:15) Now my eyes will be open and my ears attentive to the prayer that is made in this place.

(2 Chronicles 30:27) Then the priests and the Levites arose and blessed the people, and their voice was heard, and their prayer came to his holy habitation in heaven.

(2 Chronicles 33:18) Now the rest of the acts of Manasseh, and his prayer to his God, and the words of the seers who spoke to him in the name of the LORD, the God of Israel, behold, they are in the Chronicles of the Kings of Israel.

(2 Chronicles 33:19) And his prayer, and how God was moved by his entreaty, and all his sin and his faithlessness, and the sites on which he built high places and set up the Asherim and the images, before he humbled himself, behold, they are written in the Chronicles of the Seers.

(Nehemiah 1:6) let your ear be attentive and your eyes open, to hear the prayer of your servant that I now pray before you day and night for the people of Israel your servants, confessing the sins of the people of Israel, which we have sinned against you. Even I and my father's house have sinned.

(Nehemiah 1:11) O Lord, let your ear be attentive to the prayer of your servant, and to the prayer of your servants who delight to fear your name, and give success to your servant today, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man." Now I was cupbearer to the king.

(Job 16:17) although there is no violence in my hands, and my prayer is pure.

(Job 22:27) You will make your prayer to him, and he will hear you, and you will pay your vows.

(Job 42:8) Now therefore take seven bulls and seven rams and go to my servant Job and offer up a burnt offering for yourselves. And my servant Job shall pray for you, for I will accept his prayer not to deal with you according to your folly. For you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has."

(Job 42:9) So Eliphaz the Temanite and Bildad the Shuhite and Zophar the Naamathite went and did what the LORD had told them, and the LORD accepted Job's prayer.

(Psalms 4:1) To the choirmaster: with stringed instruments. A Psalm of David. Answer me when I call, O God of my righteousness! You have given me relief when I was in distress. Be gracious to me and hear my prayer!

(Psalms 6:9) The LORD has heard my plea; the LORD accepts my prayer.

(Psalms 17:1) A Prayer of David. Hear a just cause, O LORD; attend to my cry!
Give ear to my prayer from lips free of deceit!

(Psalms 32:6) Therefore let everyone who is godly offer prayer to you at a time
when you may be found; surely in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach
him.

(Psalms 39:12) "Hear my prayer, O LORD, and give ear to my cry; hold not your
peace at my tears! For I am a sojourner with you, a guest, like all my fathers.

(Psalms 42:8) By day the LORD commands his steadfast love, and at night his
song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life.

(Psalms 54:2) O God, hear my prayer; give ear to the words of my mouth.

(Psalms 55:1) To the choirmaster: with stringed instruments. A Maskil of David.
Give ear to my prayer, O God, and hide not yourself from my plea for mercy!

(Psalms 61:1) To the choirmaster: with stringed instruments. Of David. Hear my
cry, O God, listen to my prayer;

(Psalms 65:2) O you who hear prayer, to you shall all flesh come.

(Psalms 66:19) But truly God has listened; he has attended to the voice of my
prayer.

(Psalms 66:20) Blessed be God, because he has not rejected my prayer or
removed his steadfast love from me!

(Psalms 69:13) But as for me, my prayer is to you, O LORD. At an acceptable
time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love answer me in your saving
faithfulness.

(Psalms 72:15) Long may he live; may gold of Sheba be given to him! May prayer
be made for him continually, and blessings invoked for him all the day!

(Psalms 84:8) O LORD God of hosts, hear my prayer; give ear, O God of Jacob!
Selah

(Psalms 86:1) A Prayer of David. Incline your ear, O LORD, and answer me, for I
am poor and needy.

(Psalms 86:6) Give ear, O LORD, to my prayer; listen to my plea for grace.

(Psalms 88:2) Let my prayer come before you; incline your ear to my cry!

(Psalms 88:13) But I, O LORD, cry to you; in the morning my prayer comes before you.

(Psalms 90:1) A Prayer of Moses, the man of God. Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations.

(Psalms 102:1) A Prayer of one afflicted, when he is faint and pours out his complaint before the LORD. Hear my prayer, O LORD; let my cry come to you!

(Psalms 102:17) he regards the prayer of the destitute and does not despise their prayer.

(Psalms 109:4) In return for my love they accuse me, but I give myself to prayer.

(Psalms 109:7) When he is tried, let him come forth guilty; let his prayer be counted as sin!

(Psalms 141:2) Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice!

(Psalms 141:5) Let a righteous man strike me--it is a kindness; let him rebuke me--it is oil for my head; let my head not refuse it. Yet my prayer is continually against their evil deeds.

(Psalms 142:1) A Maskil of David, when he was in the cave. A Prayer. With my voice I cry out to the LORD; with my voice I plead for mercy to the LORD.

(Psalms 143:1) A Psalm of David. Hear my prayer, O LORD; give ear to my pleas for mercy! In your faithfulness answer me, in your righteousness!

(Proverbs 15:8) The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the LORD, but the prayer of the upright is acceptable to him.

(Proverbs 15:29) The LORD is far from the wicked, but he hears the prayer of the righteous.

(Proverbs 28:9) If one turns away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer is an abomination.

(Isaiah 26:16) O LORD, in distress they sought you; they poured out a whispered prayer when your discipline was upon them.

(Isaiah 37:4) It may be that the LORD your God will hear the words of the Rabshakeh, whom his master the king of Assyria has sent to mock the living God, and will rebuke the words that the LORD your God has heard; therefore lift up your prayer for the remnant that is left."

(Isaiah 38:5) "Go and say to Hezekiah, Thus says the LORD, the God of David your father: I have heard your prayer; I have seen your tears. Behold, I will add fifteen years to your life.

(Isaiah 56:7) these I will bring to my holy mountain, and make them joyful in my house of prayer; their burnt offerings and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar; for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples."

(Jeremiah 7:16) "As for you, do not pray for this people, or lift up a cry or prayer for them, and do not intercede with me, for I will not hear you.

(Jeremiah 11:14) "Therefore do not pray for this people, or lift up a cry or prayer on their behalf, for I will not listen when they call to me in the time of their trouble.

(Lamentations 3:8) though I call and cry for help, he shuts out my prayer;

(Lamentations 3:44) you have wrapped yourself with a cloud so that no prayer can pass through.

(Daniel 9:3) Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking him by prayer and pleas for mercy with fasting and sackcloth and ashes.

(Daniel 9:17) Now therefore, O our God, listen to the prayer of your servant and to his pleas for mercy, and for your own sake, O Lord, make your face to shine upon your sanctuary, which is desolate.

(Daniel 9:21) while I was speaking in prayer, the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the vision at the first, came to me in swift flight at the time of the evening sacrifice.

(Jonah 2:7) When my life was fainting away, I remembered the LORD, and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple.

(Habakkuk 3:1) A prayer of Habakkuk the prophet, according to Shigionoth.

(Matthew 17:21) [But this kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting.]

(Matthew 21:13) He said to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer,' but you make it a den of robbers."

(Matthew 21:22) And whatever you ask in prayer, you will receive, if you have faith."

(Mark 9:29) And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer."

(Mark 11:17) And he was teaching them and saying to them, "Is it not written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations'? But you have made it a den of robbers."

(Mark 11:24) Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.

(Luke 1:13) But the angel said to him, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard, and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John.

(Luke 2:37) and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She did not depart from the temple, worshiping with fasting and prayer night and day.

(Luke 6:12) In these days he went out to the mountain to pray, and all night he continued in prayer to God.

(Luke 19:46) saying to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be a house of prayer,' but you have made it a den of robbers."

(Luke 22:45) And when he rose from prayer, he came to the disciples and found them sleeping for sorrow,

(Acts 1:14) All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.

(Acts 3:1) Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer, the ninth hour.

(Acts 6:4) But we will devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

(Acts 10:31) and said, 'Cornelius, your prayer has been heard and your alms have been remembered before God.

(Acts 12:5) So Peter was kept in prison, but earnest prayer for him was made to God by the church.

(Acts 14:23) And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they had believed.

(Acts 16:13) And on the Sabbath day we went outside the gate to the riverside, where we supposed there was a place of prayer, and we sat down and spoke to the women who had come together.

(Acts 16:16) As we were going to the place of prayer, we were met by a slave girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners much gain by fortune-telling.

(Romans 10:1) Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for them is that they may be saved.

(Romans 12:12) Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.

(1 Corinthians 7:5) Do not deprive one another, except perhaps by agreement for a limited time, that you may devote yourselves to prayer; but then come together again, so that Satan may not tempt you because of your lack of self-control.

(2 Corinthians 1:11) You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many.

(Ephesians 6:18) praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,

(Philippians 1:4) always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy,

(Philippians 1:9) And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment,

(Philippians 4:6) do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

(Colossians 4:2) Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving.

(1 Timothy 4:5) for it is made holy by the word of God and prayer.

(James 5:15) And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.

(James 5:16) Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.

(1 Peter 3:12) For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil."

PRAYERS (27)

(Psalms 72:20) The prayers of David, the son of Jesse, are ended.

(Psalms 80:4) O LORD God of hosts, how long will you be angry with your people's prayers?

(Isaiah 1:15) When you spread out your hands, I will hide my eyes from you; even though you make many prayers, I will not listen; your hands are full of blood.

(Matthew 23:14) [Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you devour widows' houses and for a pretense you make long prayers; therefore you will receive the greater condemnation.]

(Mark 12:40) who devour widows' houses and for a pretense make long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation."

(Luke 5:33) And they said to him, "The disciples of John fast often and offer prayers, and so do the disciples of the Pharisees, but yours eat and drink."

(Luke 20:47) who devour widows' houses and for a pretense make long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation."

(Acts 2:42) And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

(Acts 10:4) And he stared at him in terror and said, "What is it, Lord?" And he said to him, "Your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God.

(Romans 1:10) always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you.

(Romans 15:30) I appeal to you, brothers, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to strive together with me in your prayers to God on my behalf,

(2 Corinthians 1:11) You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many.

(Ephesians 1:16) I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers,

(Philippians 1:19) for I know that through your prayers and the help of the Spirit of Jesus Christ this will turn out for my deliverance,

(Colossians 4:12) Epaphras, who is one of you, a servant of Christ Jesus, greets you, always struggling on your behalf in his prayers, that you may stand mature and fully assured in all the will of God.

(1 Thessalonians 1:2) We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers,

(1 Timothy 2:1) First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people,

(1 Timothy 5:5) She who is truly a widow, left all alone, has set her hope on God and continues in supplications and prayers night and day,

(2 Timothy 1:3) I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day.

(Philemon 1:4) I thank my God always when I remember you in my prayers,

(Philemon 1:22) At the same time, prepare a guest room for me, for I am hoping that through your prayers I will be graciously given to you.

(Hebrews 5:7) In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to him who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverence.

(1 Peter 3:7) Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered.

(1 Peter 4:7) The end of all things is at hand; therefore be self-controlled and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers.

(Revelation 5:8) And when he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.

(Revelation 8:3) And another angel came and stood at the altar with a golden censer, and he was given much incense to offer with the prayers of all the saints on the golden altar before the throne,

(Revelation 8:4) and the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, rose before God from the hand of the angel.

(Isaiah 45:20) "Assemble yourselves and come; draw near together, you survivors of the nations! They have no knowledge who carry about their wooden idols, and keep on praying to a god that cannot save.

(Daniel 9:20) While I was speaking and praying, confessing my sin and the sin of my people Israel, and presenting my plea before the LORD my God for the holy hill of my God,

(Mark 11:25) And whenever you stand praying, forgive, if you have anything against anyone, so that your Father also who is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses."

(Luke 1:10) And the whole multitude of the people were praying outside at the hour of incense.

(Luke 3:21) Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened,

(Luke 9:18) Now it happened that as he was praying alone, the disciples were with him. And he asked them, "Who do the crowds say that I am?"

(Luke 9:29) And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white.

(Luke 11:1) Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples."

(Luke 21:36) But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

(John 17:9) I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom you have given me, for they are yours.

(Acts 9:11) And the Lord said to him, "Rise and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul, for behold, he is praying,

(Acts 10:30) And Cornelius said, "Four days ago, about this hour, I was praying in my house at the ninth hour, and behold, a man stood before me in bright clothing

(Acts 11:5) "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision, something like a great sheet descending, being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to me.

(Acts 12:12) When he realized this, he went to the house of Mary, the mother of John whose other name was Mark, where many were gathered together and were praying.

(Acts 13:3) Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off.

(Acts 16:25) About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them,

(Acts 22:17) "When I had returned to Jerusalem and was praying in the temple, I fell into a trance

(Ephesians 6:18) praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,

(Jude 1:20) But you, beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit,
