206 times in the Bible (ESV)

(Genesis 49:7) Cursed be their anger, for it is fierce, and their wrath, for it is cruel! I will divide them in Jacob and scatter them in Israel.

(Exodus 22:24) and my wrath will burn, and I will kill you with the sword, and your wives shall become widows and your children fatherless.

(Exodus 32:10) Now therefore let me alone, that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them, in order that I may make a great nation of you."

(Exodus 32:11) But Moses implored the LORD his God and said, "O LORD, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you have brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand?"

(Leviticus 10:6) And Moses said to Aaron and to Eleazar and Ithamar his sons, "Do not let the hair of your heads hang loose, and do not tear your clothes, lest you die, and wrath come upon all the congregation; but let your brothers, the whole house of Israel, bewail the burning that the LORD has kindled.

(Numbers 1:53) But the Levites shall camp around the tabernacle of the testimony, so that there may be no wrath on the congregation of the people of Israel. And the Levites shall keep guard over the tabernacle of the testimony."

(Numbers 16:46) And Moses said to Aaron, "Take your censer, and put fire on it from off the altar and lay incense on it and carry it quickly to the congregation and make atonement for them, for wrath has gone out from the LORD; the plague has begun."

(Numbers 18:5) And you shall keep guard over the sanctuary and over the altar, that there may never again be wrath on the people of Israel.

(Numbers 25:11) "Phinehas the son of Eleazar, son of Aaron the priest, has turned back my wrath from the people of Israel, in that he was jealous with my jealousy among them, so that I did not consume the people of Israel in my jealousy.

(Deuteronomy 9:7) Remember and do not forget how you provoked the LORD your God to wrath in the wilderness. From the day you came out of the land of Egypt until you came to this place, you have been rebellious against the LORD.

(Deuteronomy 9:8) Even at Horeb you provoked the LORD to wrath, and the LORD was so angry with you that he was ready to destroy you.

(Deuteronomy 9:22) "At Taberah also, and at Massah and at Kibroth-hattaavah you provoked the LORD to wrath.

(Deuteronomy 29:23) the whole land burned out with brimstone and salt, nothing sown and nothing growing, where no plant can sprout, an overthrow like that of Sodom and Gomorrah, Admah, and Zeboiim, which the LORD overthrew in his anger and wrath--

(Deuteronomy 29:28) and the LORD uprooted them from their land in anger and fury and great wrath, and cast them into another land, as they are this day.'

(Joshua 9:20) This we will do to them: let them live, lest wrath be upon us, because of the oath that we swore to them."

(Joshua 22:20) Did not Achan the son of Zerah break faith in the matter of the devoted things, and wrath fell upon all the congregation of Israel? And he did not perish alone for his iniquity."

(1 Samuel 28:18) Because you did not obey the voice of the LORD and did not carry out his fierce wrath against Amalek, therefore the LORD has done this thing to you this day.

(2 Kings 3:27) Then he took his oldest son who was to reign in his place and offered him for a burnt offering on the wall. And there came great wrath against Israel. And they withdrew from him and returned to their own land.

(2 Kings 22:13) "Go, inquire of the LORD for me, and for the people, and for all Judah, concerning the words of this book that has been found. For great is the wrath of the LORD that is kindled against us, because our fathers have not obeyed the words of this book, to do according to all that is written concerning us."

(2 Kings 22:17) Because they have forsaken me and have made offerings to other gods, that they might provoke me to anger with all the work of their hands, therefore my wrath will be kindled against this place, and it will not be quenched.

(2 Kings 23:26) Still the LORD did not turn from the burning of his great wrath, by which his anger was kindled against Judah, because of all the provocations with which Manasseh had provoked him.

(1 Chronicles 27:24) Joab the son of Zeruiah began to count, but did not finish. Yet wrath came upon Israel for this, and the number was not entered in the chronicles of King David.

(2 Chronicles 12:7) When the LORD saw that they humbled themselves, the word of the LORD came to Shemaiah: "They have humbled themselves. I will not destroy them, but I will grant them some deliverance, and my wrath shall not be poured out on Jerusalem by the hand of Shishak.

(2 Chronicles 12:12) And when he humbled himself the wrath of the LORD turned from him, so as not to make a complete destruction. Moreover, conditions were good in Judah.

(2 Chronicles 19:2) But Jehu the son of Hanani the seer went out to meet him and said to King Jehoshaphat, "Should you help the wicked and love those who hate the LORD? Because of this, wrath has gone out against you from the LORD.

(2 Chronicles 19:10) whenever a case comes to you from your brothers who live in their cities, concerning bloodshed, law or commandment, statutes or rules, then you shall warn them, that they may not incur guilt before the LORD and wrath may not come upon you and your brothers. Thus you shall do, and you will not incur guilt.

(2 Chronicles 24:18) And they abandoned the house of the LORD, the God of their fathers, and served the Asherim and the idols. And wrath came upon Judah and Jerusalem for this guilt of theirs.

(2 Chronicles 28:11) Now hear me, and send back the captives from your relatives whom you have taken, for the fierce wrath of the LORD is upon you."

(2 Chronicles 28:13) and said to them, "You shall not bring the captives in here, for you propose to bring upon us guilt against the LORD in addition to our present sins and guilt. For our guilt is already great, and there is fierce wrath against Israel."

(2 Chronicles 29:8) Therefore the wrath of the LORD came on Judah and Jerusalem, and he has made them an object of horror, of astonishment, and of hissing, as you see with your own eyes.

(2 Chronicles 32:25) But Hezekiah did not make return according to the benefit done to him, for his heart was proud. Therefore wrath came upon him and Judah and Jerusalem.

(2 Chronicles 32:26) But Hezekiah humbled himself for the pride of his heart, both he and the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the wrath of the LORD did not come upon them in the days of Hezekiah.

(2 Chronicles 34:21) "Go, inquire of the LORD for me and for those who are left in Israel and in Judah, concerning the words of the book that has been found. For great is the wrath of the LORD that is poured out on us, because our fathers have not kept the word of the LORD, to do according to all that is written in this book."

(2 Chronicles 34:25) Because they have forsaken me and have made offerings to other gods, that they might provoke me to anger with all the works of their hands, therefore my wrath will be poured out on this place and will not be quenched.

(2 Chronicles 36:16) But they kept mocking the messengers of God, despising his words and scoffing at his prophets, until the wrath of the LORD rose against his people, until there was no remedy.

(Ezra 7:23) Whatever is decreed by the God of heaven, let it be done in full for the house of the God of heaven, lest his wrath be against the realm of the king and his sons.

(Ezra 8:22) For I was ashamed to ask the king for a band of soldiers and horsemen to protect us against the enemy on our way, since we had told the king, "The hand of our God is for good on all who seek him, and the power of his wrath is against all who forsake him."

(Ezra 10:14) Let our officials stand for the whole assembly. Let all in our cities who have taken foreign wives come at appointed times, and with them the elders and judges of

every city, until the fierce wrath of our God over this matter is turned away from us."

(Nehemiah 13:18) Did not your fathers act in this way, and did not our God bring all this disaster on us and on this city? Now you are bringing more wrath on Israel by profaning the Sabbath."

(Esther 1:18) This very day the noble women of Persia and Media who have heard of the queen's behavior will say the same to all the king's officials, and there will be contempt and wrath in plenty.

(Esther 5:9) And Haman went out that day joyful and glad of heart. But when Haman saw Mordecai in the king's gate, that he neither rose nor trembled before him, he was filled with wrath against Mordecai.

(Esther 7:7) And the king arose in his wrath from the wine-drinking and went into the palace garden, but Haman stayed to beg for his life from Queen Esther, for he saw that harm was determined against him by the king.

(Esther 7:10) And the king said, "Hang him on that." So they hanged Haman on the gallows that he had prepared for Mordecai. Then the wrath of the king abated.

(Job 14:13) Oh that you would hide me in Sheol, that you would conceal me until your wrath be past, that you would appoint me a set time, and remember me!

(Job 16:9) He has torn me in his wrath and hated me; he has gnashed his teeth at me; my adversary sharpens his eyes against me.

(Job 19:11) He has kindled his wrath against me and counts me as his adversary.

(Job 19:29) be afraid of the sword, for wrath brings the punishment of the sword, that you may know there is a judgment."

(Job 20:28) The possessions of his house will be carried away, dragged off in the day of God's wrath.

(Job 21:20) Let their own eyes see their destruction, and let them drink of the wrath of the Almighty.

(Job 21:30) that the evil man is spared in the day of calamity, that he is rescued in the day of wrath?

(Job 36:18) Beware lest wrath entice you into scoffing, and let not the greatness of the ransom turn you aside.

(Psalms 2:5) Then he will speak to them in his wrath, and terrify them in his fury, saying,

(Psalms 2:12) Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in him.

(Psalms 6:1) To the choirmaster: with stringed instruments; according to The

Sheminith. A Psalm of David. O LORD, rebuke me not in your anger, nor discipline me in your wrath.

(Psalms 21:9) You will make them as a blazing oven when you appear. The LORD will swallow them up in his wrath, and fire will consume them.

(Psalms 37:8) Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath! Fret not yourself; it tends only to evil.

(Psalms 38:1) A Psalm of David, for the memorial offering. O LORD, rebuke me not in your anger, nor discipline me in your wrath!

(Psalms 56:7) For their crime will they escape? In wrath cast down the peoples, O God!

(Psalms 59:13) consume them in wrath; consume them till they are no more, that they may know that God rules over Jacob to the ends of the earth. Selah

(Psalms 76:10) Surely the wrath of man shall praise you; the remnant of wrath you will put on like a belt.

(Psalms 78:21) Therefore, when the LORD heard, he was full of wrath; a fire was kindled against Jacob; his anger rose against Israel,

(Psalms 78:38) Yet he, being compassionate, atoned for their iniquity and did not destroy them; he restrained his anger often and did not stir up all his wrath.

(Psalms 78:49) He let loose on them his burning anger, wrath, indignation, and distress, a company of destroying angels.

(Psalms 78:59) When God heard, he was full of wrath, and he utterly rejected Israel.

(Psalms 78:62) He gave his people over to the sword and vented his wrath on his heritage.

(Psalms 85:3) You withdrew all your wrath; you turned from your hot anger.

(Psalms 88:7) Your wrath lies heavy upon me, and you overwhelm me with all your waves. Selah

(Psalms 88:16) Your wrath has swept over me; your dreadful assaults destroy me.

(Psalms 89:38) But now you have cast off and rejected; you are full of wrath against your anointed.

(Psalms 89:46) How long, O LORD? Will you hide yourself forever? How long will your wrath burn like fire?

(Psalms 90:7) For we are brought to an end by your anger; by your wrath we are dismayed.

(Psalms 90:9) For all our days pass away under your wrath; we bring our years to an end

like a sigh.

(Psalms 90:11) Who considers the power of your anger, and your wrath according to the fear of you?

(Psalms 95:11) Therefore I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."

(Psalms 106:23) Therefore he said he would destroy them-- had not Moses, his chosen one, stood in the breach before him, to turn away his wrath from destroying them.

(Psalms 110:5) The Lord is at your right hand; he will shatter kings on the day of his wrath.

(Psalms 138:7) Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you preserve my life; you stretch out your hand against the wrath of my enemies, and your right hand delivers me.

(Proverbs 11:4) Riches do not profit in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death.

(Proverbs 11:23) The desire of the righteous ends only in good; the expectation of the wicked in wrath.

(Proverbs 14:35) A servant who deals wisely has the king's favor, but his wrath falls on one who acts shamefully.

(Proverbs 15:1) A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

(Proverbs 16:14) A king's wrath is a messenger of death, and a wise man will appease it.

(Proverbs 19:12) A king's wrath is like the growling of a lion, but his favor is like dew on the grass.

(Proverbs 19:19) A man of great wrath will pay the penalty, for if you deliver him, you will only have to do it again.

(Proverbs 21:14) A gift in secret averts anger, and a concealed bribe, strong wrath.

(Proverbs 27:4) Wrath is cruel, anger is overwhelming, but who can stand before jealousy?

(Proverbs 29:8) Scoffers set a city aflame, but the wise turn away wrath.

(Proverbs 29:22) A man of wrath stirs up strife, and one given to anger causes much transgression.

(Isaiah 9:19) Through the wrath of the LORD of hosts the land is scorched, and the people are like fuel for the fire; no one spares another.

(Isaiah 10:6) Against a godless nation I send him, and against the people of my wrath I command him, to take spoil and seize plunder, and to tread them down like the mire of the streets.

(Isaiah 13:9) Behold, the day of the LORD comes, cruel, with wrath and fierce anger, to make the land a desolation and to destroy its sinners from it.

(Isaiah 13:13) Therefore I will make the heavens tremble, and the earth will be shaken out of its place, at the wrath of the LORD of hosts in the day of his fierce anger.

(Isaiah 14:6) that struck the peoples in wrath with unceasing blows, that ruled the nations in anger with unrelenting persecution.

(Isaiah 27:4) I have no wrath. Would that I had thorns and briers to battle! I would march against them, I would burn them up together.

(Isaiah 51:13) and have forgotten the LORD, your Maker, who stretched out the heavens and laid the foundations of the earth, and you fear continually all the day because of the wrath of the oppressor, when he sets himself to destroy? And where is the wrath of the oppressor?

(Isaiah 51:17) Wake yourself, wake yourself, stand up, O Jerusalem, you who have drunk from the hand of the LORD the cup of his wrath, who have drunk to the dregs the bowl, the cup of staggering.

(Isaiah 51:20) Your sons have fainted; they lie at the head of every street like an antelope in a net; they are full of the wrath of the LORD, the rebuke of your God.

(Isaiah 51:22) Thus says your Lord, the LORD, your God who pleads the cause of his people: "Behold, I have taken from your hand the cup of staggering; the bowl of my wrath you shall drink no more;

(Isaiah 59:18) According to their deeds, so will he repay, wrath to his adversaries, repayment to his enemies; to the coastlands he will render repayment.

(Isaiah 60:10) Foreigners shall build up your walls, and their kings shall minister to you; for in my wrath I struck you, but in my favor I have had mercy on you.

(Isaiah 63:3) "I have trodden the winepress alone, and from the peoples no one was with me; I trod them in my anger and trampled them in my wrath; their lifeblood spattered on my garments, and stained all my apparel.

(Isaiah 63:5) I looked, but there was no one to help; I was appalled, but there was no one to uphold; so my own arm brought me salvation, and my wrath upheld me.

(Isaiah 63:6) I trampled down the peoples in my anger; I made them drunk in my wrath, and I poured out their lifeblood on the earth."

(Jeremiah 4:4) Circumcise yourselves to the LORD; remove the foreskin of your hearts, O men of Judah and inhabitants of Jerusalem; lest my wrath go forth like fire, and burn with none to quench it, because of the evil of your deeds."

(Jeremiah 6:11) Therefore I am full of the wrath of the LORD; I am weary of holding it in. "Pour it out upon the children in the street, and upon the gatherings of young men,

also; both husband and wife shall be taken, the elderly and the very aged.

(Jeremiah 7:20) Therefore thus says the Lord GOD: behold, my anger and my wrath will be poured out on this place, upon man and beast, upon the trees of the field and the fruit of the ground; it will burn and not be quenched."

(Jeremiah 7:29) "'Cut off your hair and cast it away; raise a lamentation on the bare heights, for the LORD has rejected and forsaken the generation of his wrath.'

(Jeremiah 10:10) But the LORD is the true God; he is the living God and the everlasting King. At his wrath the earth quakes, and the nations cannot endure his indignation.

(Jeremiah 10:25) Pour out your wrath on the nations that know you not, and on the peoples that call not on your name, for they have devoured Jacob; they have devoured him and consumed him, and have laid waste his habitation.

(Jeremiah 18:20) Should good be repaid with evil? Yet they have dug a pit for my life. Remember how I stood before you to speak good for them, to turn away your wrath from them.

(Jeremiah 21:5) I myself will fight against you with outstretched hand and strong arm, in anger and in fury and in great wrath.

(Jeremiah 21:12) O house of David! Thus says the LORD: "'Execute justice in the morning, and deliver from the hand of the oppressor him who has been robbed, lest my wrath go forth like fire, and burn with none to quench it, because of your evil deeds.'"

(Jeremiah 23:19) Behold, the storm of the LORD! Wrath has gone forth, a whirling tempest; it will burst upon the head of the wicked.

(Jeremiah 25:15) Thus the LORD, the God of Israel, said to me: "Take from my hand this cup of the wine of wrath, and make all the nations to whom I send you drink it.

(Jeremiah 30:23) Behold the storm of the LORD! Wrath has gone forth, a whirling tempest; it will burst upon the head of the wicked.

(Jeremiah 32:31) This city has aroused my anger and wrath, from the day it was built to this day, so that I will remove it from my sight

(Jeremiah 32:37) Behold, I will gather them from all the countries to which I drove them in my anger and my wrath and in great indignation. I will bring them back to this place, and I will make them dwell in safety.

(Jeremiah 33:5) They are coming in to fight against the Chaldeans and to fill them with the dead bodies of men whom I shall strike down in my anger and my wrath, for I have hidden my face from this city because of all their evil.

(Jeremiah 36:7) It may be that their plea for mercy will come before the LORD, and that every one will turn from his evil way, for great is the anger and wrath that the LORD has pronounced against this people."

(Jeremiah 42:18) "For thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: As my anger and my wrath were poured out on the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so my wrath will be poured out on you when you go to Egypt. You shall become an execration, a horror, a curse, and a taunt. You shall see this place no more.

(Jeremiah 44:6) Therefore my wrath and my anger were poured out and kindled in the cities of Judah and in the streets of Jerusalem, and they became a waste and a desolation, as at this day.

(Jeremiah 50:13) Because of the wrath of the LORD she shall not be inhabited but shall be an utter desolation; everyone who passes by Babylon shall be appalled, and hiss because of all her wounds.

(Jeremiah 50:25) The LORD has opened his armory and brought out the weapons of his wrath, for the Lord GOD of hosts has a work to do in the land of the Chaldeans.

(Lamentations 2:2) The Lord has swallowed up without mercy all the habitations of Jacob; in his wrath he has broken down the strongholds of the daughter of Judah; he has brought down to the ground in dishonor the kingdom and its rulers.

(Lamentations 3:1) I am the man who has seen affliction under the rod of his wrath;

(Lamentations 4:11) The LORD gave full vent to his wrath; he poured out his hot anger, and he kindled a fire in Zion that consumed its foundations.

(Ezekiel 7:8) Now I will soon pour out my wrath upon you, and spend my anger against you, and judge you according to your ways, and I will punish you for all your abominations.

(Ezekiel 7:12) The time has come; the day has arrived. Let not the buyer rejoice, nor the seller mourn, for wrath is upon all their multitude.

(Ezekiel 7:14) "They have blown the trumpet and made everything ready, but none goes to battle, for my wrath is upon all their multitude.

(Ezekiel 7:19) They cast their silver into the streets, and their gold is like an unclean thing. Their silver and gold are not able to deliver them in the day of the wrath of the LORD. They cannot satisfy their hunger or fill their stomachs with it. For it was the stumbling block of their iniquity.

(Ezekiel 8:18) Therefore I will act in wrath. My eye will not spare, nor will I have pity. And though they cry in my ears with a loud voice, I will not hear them."

(Ezekiel 9:8) And while they were striking, and I was left alone, I fell upon my face, and cried, "Ah, Lord GOD! Will you destroy all the remnant of Israel in the outpouring of your wrath on Jerusalem?"

(Ezekiel 13:13) Therefore thus says the Lord GOD: I will make a stormy wind break out in my wrath, and there shall be a deluge of rain in my anger, and great hailstones in wrath to make a full end.

(Ezekiel 13:15) Thus will I spend my wrath upon the wall and upon those who have smeared it with whitewash, and I will say to you, The wall is no more, nor those who smeared it,

(Ezekiel 14:19) "Or if I send a pestilence into that land and pour out my wrath upon it with blood, to cut off from it man and beast,

(Ezekiel 16:38) And I will judge you as women who commit adultery and shed blood are judged, and bring upon you the blood of wrath and jealousy.

(Ezekiel 16:42) So will I satisfy my wrath on you, and my jealousy shall depart from you. I will be calm and will no more be angry.

(Ezekiel 20:8) But they rebelled against me and were not willing to listen to me. None of them cast away the detestable things their eyes feasted on, nor did they forsake the idols of Egypt. "Then I said I would pour out my wrath upon them and spend my anger against them in the midst of the land of Egypt.

(Ezekiel 20:13) But the house of Israel rebelled against me in the wilderness. They did not walk in my statutes but rejected my rules, by which, if a person does them, he shall live; and my Sabbaths they greatly profaned. "Then I said I would pour out my wrath upon them in the wilderness, to make a full end of them.

(Ezekiel 20:21) But the children rebelled against me. They did not walk in my statutes and were not careful to obey my rules, by which, if a person does them, he shall live; they profaned my Sabbaths. "Then I said I would pour out my wrath upon them and spend my anger against them in the wilderness.

(Ezekiel 20:33) "As I live, declares the Lord GOD, surely with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm and with wrath poured out I will be king over you.

(Ezekiel 20:34) I will bring you out from the peoples and gather you out of the countries where you are scattered, with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, and with wrath poured out.

(Ezekiel 21:31) And I will pour out my indignation upon you; I will blow upon you with the fire of my wrath, and I will deliver you into the hands of brutish men, skillful to destroy.

(Ezekiel 22:20) As one gathers silver and bronze and iron and lead and tin into a furnace, to blow the fire on it in order to melt it, so I will gather you in my anger and in my wrath, and I will put you in and melt you.

(Ezekiel 22:21) I will gather you and blow on you with the fire of my wrath, and you shall be melted in the midst of it.

(Ezekiel 22:22) As silver is melted in a furnace, so you shall be melted in the midst of it, and you shall know that I am the LORD; I have poured out my wrath upon you."

(Ezekiel 22:31) Therefore I have poured out my indignation upon them. I have consumed them with the fire of my wrath. I have returned their way upon their heads,

declares the Lord GOD."

(Ezekiel 24:8) To rouse my wrath, to take vengeance, I have set on the bare rock the blood she has shed, that it may not be covered.

(Ezekiel 25:14) And I will lay my vengeance upon Edom by the hand of my people Israel, and they shall do in Edom according to my anger and according to my wrath, and they shall know my vengeance, declares the Lord GOD.

(Ezekiel 30:15) And I will pour out my wrath on Pelusium, the stronghold of Egypt, and cut off the multitude of Thebes.

(Ezekiel 36:6) Therefore prophesy concerning the land of Israel, and say to the mountains and hills, to the ravines and valleys, Thus says the Lord GOD: Behold, I have spoken in my jealous wrath, because you have suffered the reproach of the nations.

(Ezekiel 36:18) So I poured out my wrath upon them for the blood that they had shed in the land, for the idols with which they had defiled it.

(Ezekiel 38:18) But on that day, the day that Gog shall come against the land of Israel, declares the Lord GOD, my wrath will be roused in my anger.

(Ezekiel 38:19) For in my jealousy and in my blazing wrath I declare, On that day there shall be a great earthquake in the land of Israel.

(Daniel 8:6) He came to the ram with the two horns, which I had seen standing on the bank of the canal, and he ran at him in his powerful wrath.

(Daniel 9:16) "O Lord, according to all your righteous acts, let your anger and your wrath turn away from your city Jerusalem, your holy hill, because for our sins, and for the iniquities of our fathers, Jerusalem and your people have become a byword among all who are around us.

(Hosea 5:10) The princes of Judah have become like those who move the landmark; upon them I will pour out my wrath like water.

(Hosea 11:9) I will not execute my burning anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and not a man, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath.

(Hosea 13:11) I gave you a king in my anger, and I took him away in my wrath.

(Amos 1:11) Thus says the LORD: "For three transgressions of Edom, and for four, I will not revoke the punishment, because he pursued his brother with the sword and cast off all pity, and his anger tore perpetually, and he kept his wrath forever.

(Micah 5:15) And in anger and wrath I will execute vengeance on the nations that did not obey.

(Nahum 1:2) The LORD is a jealous and avenging God; the LORD is avenging and wrathful; the LORD takes vengeance on his adversaries and keeps wrath for his enemies.

(Nahum 1:6) Who can stand before his indignation? Who can endure the heat of his anger? His wrath is poured out like fire, and the rocks are broken into pieces by him.

(Habakkuk 2:15) "Woe to him who makes his neighbors drink-- you pour out your wrath and make them drunk, in order to gaze at their nakedness!

(Habakkuk 3:2) O LORD, I have heard the report of you, and your work, O LORD, do I fear. In the midst of the years revive it; in the midst of the years make it known; in wrath remember mercy.

(Habakkuk 3:8) Was your wrath against the rivers, O LORD? Was your anger against the rivers, or your indignation against the sea, when you rode on your horses, on your chariot of salvation?

(Zephaniah 1:15) A day of wrath is that day, a day of distress and anguish, a day of ruin and devastation, a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness,

(Zephaniah 1:18) Neither their silver nor their gold shall be able to deliver them on the day of the wrath of the LORD. In the fire of his jealousy, all the earth shall be consumed; for a full and sudden end he will make of all the inhabitants of the earth.

(Zechariah 8:2) "Thus says the LORD of hosts: I am jealous for Zion with great jealousy, and I am jealous for her with great wrath.

(Zechariah 8:14) For thus says the LORD of hosts: "As I purposed to bring disaster to you when your fathers provoked me to wrath, and I did not relent, says the LORD of hosts,

(Matthew 3:7) But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?

(Luke 3:7) He said therefore to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?

(Luke 4:28) When they heard these things, all in the synagogue were filled with wrath.

(Luke 21:23) Alas for women who are pregnant and for those who are nursing infants in those days! For there will be great distress upon the earth and wrath against this people.

(John 3:36) Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.

(Romans 1:18) For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth.

(Romans 2:5) But because of your hard and impenitent heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.

(Romans 2:8) but for those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey

unrighteousness, there will be wrath and fury.

(Romans 3:5) But if our unrighteousness serves to show the righteousness of God, what shall we say? That God is unrighteous to inflict wrath on us? (I speak in a human way.)

(Romans 4:15) For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression.

(Romans 5:9) Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God.

(Romans 9:22) What if God, desiring to show his wrath and to make known his power, has endured with much patience vessels of wrath prepared for destruction,

(Romans 12:19) Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."

(Romans 13:4) for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer.

(Romans 13:5) Therefore one must be in subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience.

(Ephesians 2:3) among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind.

(Ephesians 4:31) Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice.

(Ephesians 5:6) Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience.

(Colossians 3:6) On account of these the wrath of God is coming.

(Colossians 3:8) But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth.

(1 Thessalonians 1:10) and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come.

(1 Thessalonians 2:16) by hindering us from speaking to the Gentiles that they might be saved--so as always to fill up the measure of their sins. But God's wrath has come upon them at last!

(1 Thessalonians 5:9) For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ,

(Hebrews 3:11) As I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."

(Hebrews 4:3) For we who have believed enter that rest, as he has said, "As I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest,"" although his works were finished from the foundation of the world.

(Revelation 6:16) calling to the mountains and rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the face of him who is seated on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb,

(Revelation 6:17) for the great day of their wrath has come, and who can stand?"

(Revelation 11:18) The nations raged, but your wrath came, and the time for the dead to be judged, and for rewarding your servants, the prophets and saints, and those who fear your name, both small and great, and for destroying the destroyers of the earth."

(Revelation 12:12) Therefore, rejoice, O heavens and you who dwell in them! But woe to you, O earth and sea, for the devil has come down to you in great wrath, because he knows that his time is short!"

(Revelation 14:10) he also will drink the wine of God's wrath, poured full strength into the cup of his anger, and he will be tormented with fire and sulfur in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb.

(Revelation 14:19) So the angel swung his sickle across the earth and gathered the grape harvest of the earth and threw it into the great winepress of the wrath of God.

(Revelation 15:1) Then I saw another sign in heaven, great and amazing, seven angels with seven plagues, which are the last, for with them the wrath of God is finished.

(Revelation 15:7) And one of the four living creatures gave to the seven angels seven golden bowls full of the wrath of God who lives forever and ever,

(Revelation 16:1) Then I heard a loud voice from the temple telling the seven angels, "Go and pour out on the earth the seven bowls of the wrath of God."

(Revelation 16:19) The great city was split into three parts, and the cities of the nations fell, and God remembered Babylon the great, to make her drain the cup of the wine of the fury of his wrath.

(Revelation 19:15) From his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations, and he will rule them with a rod of iron. He will tread the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God the Almighty.
