For the past three years, I've been mentoring first-time honeybee keepers in the Finger Lakes Beekeepers Club. Last year, my advisee was a retired teacher. On a whim, I sent him a pop quiz after one of our visits together. "Pop quiz?! Are you allowed to do that," he asked with mock indignation. I'm doing the same this year with new advisees, both to test their powers of observation and to reinforce what I've (hopefully) taught them. - 4. In that same story, Jesus talked about "living water." For the average person of that era, what image would "living water" most likely bring to mind: a) water in a bucket, b) water in a well, c) water in a pool at an oasis, d) water flowing in a stream, e) pond water filled with algae? Bonus: What did Jesus mean by "living water?"
- 5. To start my sermon on Mother's Day, I shared the story of a man who asked God to grant him one wish, which ended up being two. News from Trustees

- June 7th A **Congregational Meeting** to vote on replacement of the flat portion of our roof will take place. This will be the only item to be voted on. A previous mention of a By-Law change has been deferred for now. The actual resolution and background information regarding the roof are available on the information table in the Narthex.
- Last month we announced that we would purchase a new computer for ease in using the new accounting software. However, we believe at this point it would be more prudent to use the computer we presently have and purchase a quality backup system. Persons using the accounting package will work around the Administrative Assistant's schedule.
- Plans to use **Complete Payroll Processing** for all of our employees is expected to be underway beginning in July.
- Plans for transitioning the role of Treasurer are moving along. Jennifer Fais and Pam Walker have been nominated to handle the changing roles of the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer. Jennifer will be handling the role of Treasurer as it pertains to financial reporting and analyzing and Pam Walker will be the new Assistant Treasurer, working closely with Jennifer as we transition to Church Windows accounting software.
- The Community Garden has two partners now. First United Methodist Church and Emanuel Lutheran Church have each contributed \$200 to our project. With those contributions, the pancake supper, and a contribution from Eleanor Cicerchi we now have \$1,285 toward the cost of materials to make this happen.
- We authorized \$225 for the flower boxes for our front and back entrances.

Nominating Committee

Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Clerk to Be Elected in Congregational Meeting, Sunday, June 21

After careful deliberation with the trustees and advisory committee, the nominating committee is pleased to nominate Jennifer Fais for the position of church treasurer and Pam Walker for assistant treasurer.

In the March *Caller*, the nominating committee proposed that the office of treasurer, held by Margo for many years, be shared between a church treasurer and accounts manager. Jennifer Fais will perform the treasurer's duties, which will continue to focus on preparing monthly and year-end financial reports and overseeing the church's budget and financial performance in conjunction with the trustees. Pam Walker will serve as assistant treasurer in the capacity of an accounts manager. She will assist the treasurer by handling the routine duties of paying bills and maintaining ledgers.

Because the treasurer and assistant treasurer are officers of the church, we feel it prudent and correct to bring these nominations to the congregation for a vote. This vote will be for a term of approximately seven-months in accordance with the bylaws, which state that vacancies shall be filled temporarily until the next annual meeting.

In addition, because Jennifer will be vacating the position of clerk, the nominating committee is proposing that Jill VanDewoestine temporarily fill that role until the next annual meeting

The Deacon's Fund Collections



A different monthly beneficiary is designated to received funds collected by the Deacons Fund each

Sunday in that month. Usually, envelopes are placed in the pews on the first Sunday of the month.

In the four Denomination Wide collections: One Great Hour of Sharing in March; Strengthen Our Church in May; Neighbors in Need in October, and The Christmas Fund in December, a special flyer will appear in the prior week's bulletin and a special envelope in the bulletin on the date of the collection. These four Denomination Wide collections and the Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) donation that is an annual budget item constitute the Five for Five donations that we make Denomination Wide.

The other eight monthly beneficiaries of the Deacon's Fund are local charities chosen annually by the Board of Deacons. In June it will be the Campus Ministry at CCC. In July it will be for Habitat for Humanity. Expect to see announcements of the local beneficiary in the Caller and in the first bulletin for that month. (Hint: if you put cash in a Deacon's Fund envelope, print your name on the envelope if you would like to get credit for the donation.)

The Deacon's Offering for June: Corning Community College Campus Ministry

During the month of June, the Deacons will take up a special offering to benefit Corning Community College's Campus Ministry. The Campus Ministry is an interfaith ministry serving the CCC community by fostering spiritual guidance, compassion, interfaith understanding and religious pluralism. It is funded by the area council of faith communities. local congregations, religious communities and through grants, community organizations and individual donations. The program is administered by the Campus Ministry Advisory Board, whose members are drawn from area clergy, lay people and CCC employees. The College chaplain is Cynthia M. Hale, MDiv (Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School). The Ministry sponsors interfaith forums to promote understanding and provides counseling and emergency support for students.

The book is available in print, Kindle, Nook, Audible, and CD formats. Unbroken is the true story of Louis Zamperini, who was born in 1917 in Olean, New York. Zamperini competed in the 1936 Summer Olympic Games. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps in 1941 and became a bombardier. When his plane crashed in the Pacific Ocean on May 23, 1943, he survived 47 days at sea and as a POW of the Japanese until 1945. He became a Christian in 1949, which led him to a career as an inspirational speaker. He died in 2014. 


