Approximately 45 students in teams from Parkview, Thorson, Westlawn, First Immanuel and St. Francis Borgia elementary schools gathered to participate in a Bridge Building Contest at Cedarburg High School on Nov. 14. The event was a community service project organized and sponsored by the CHS Engineering Club, which is led by faculty member David Tice and organized to compete annually in the U.S. FIRST robotics competition.

The contest was open to teams of students from ages

5-14. Each team was given Popsicle sticks, glue and guidelines, with the goal of successfully building the bridge that

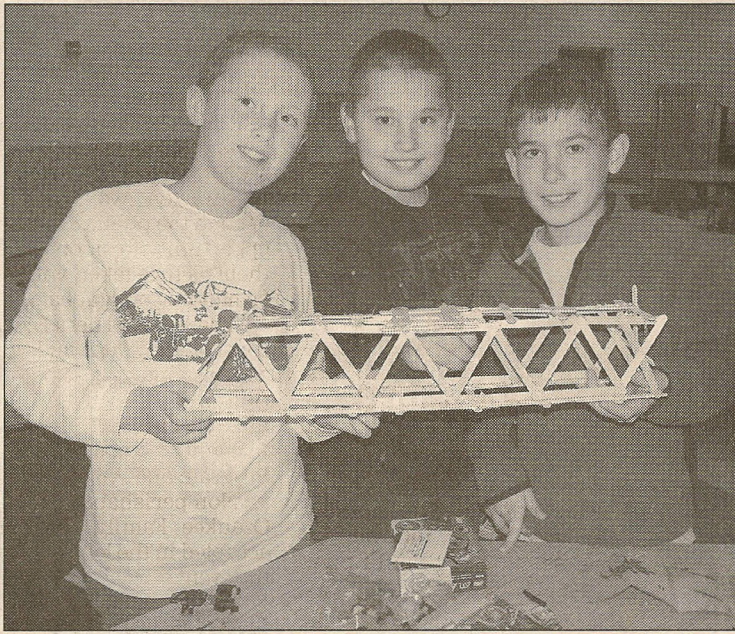
