PASSING ON FAITH



appy New Year! I hope that your new year's celebrations were all happy and safe. We have officially arrived at the time of year when companies

big and small will try to convince you that their product is the thing you need to change your life. They all know how uniquely motivated we are in January to start new habits, build new relationships or even just clean our houses out! I must admit that I am one of the people they are targeting. I find new hope in January and am filled with energy for things I previously ignored. I offer all of this as an explanation for why you will be seeing me around more often and why I will be excitedly telling you about new things The biggest thing to share with you in January is the beginning of Peer Ministry. The Bible tells us:

"Do not let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and purity." Timothy 4:12

Last year our congregation commissioned 11 high school students to go out into the world and minister to others wherever they might be. They were equipped with skills to welcome a stranger, recognize their value systems

Believing that this is true we want to equip our young people to faithfully and responsibly handle themselves when they are out with their peers. We know we won't be able to give them the answers to every situation they encounter but we strive to give them a toolbox from which to draw from at any time or place.

This January 10th will be the first session of our second Peer Ministry class. We will meet on Sunday after the 10:30 service until commissioning Sunday on May 2nd. We are planning an overnight retreat to Sugarcreek with this training and many other fun experiences for the group. Do you know a student in 9-12 grade who would benefit from this training? MESSAGE FROM PASTOR STANTON

BRIGHT AND GLORIOUS IS THE SKY



n December 21st the earth got to that point in its orbit around the sun where the northern half of the planet receives its least amount of light. This

time of year is cold, dark, and for many of us lonely. For even more of us, we at some point feel mournful as we think of days gone by, and people we miss. And yet after our twelve day celebration of Christmas, the Church remembers the story of the Magi coming from afar to pay homage to the King of the Jews. And as we remember this story we sing...

"Bright and Glorious is the Sky... radiant are the heavens high."

The Church does this kind of thing all the time. We claim the throne of Jesus is the cross. His crown is made of *thorns*. Death, the most scary thing, has *'lost its sting'* because of resurrection. So, it should come as no surprise that when it gets dark around here, we'd sing about how "bright and glorious is the sky."

Christians are in an ongoing process of noticing the world as God loves it rather than getting caught up in its darkness and despair. I'm not telling you to 'turn that frown upside down'. But Christians are called this month through the ways we worship and the readings we consider to

be renewed and refreshed. On January 6th, the Church celebrates the Epiphany of Our Lord. In some parts of the Christian world, they celebrate January 6th with

much more gusto than December 25th because of the message of Epiphany. It's not just that Jesus is born (Christmas) but that Jesus is born for *all* (Epiphany). The Magi follow a star through much darkness

to arrive at the unlikely birthplace of the Lord of all. These Kings are not Jewish, and yet they pay homage to a Jew. We follow in their footsteps more than 2,000 years later paying homage to Jesus, claiming him as Our Lord. What does it mean to you—living in 21st century Wisconsin—that Jesus, a lower class Jewish boy, was born for your sake? How would your life be different had he never been born?

If you really stop to think where you'd be without the birth of Jesus, then you'll understand much more easily why we sing, "Bright and Glorious is the Sky" even when it's the darkest time of year. We too easily take the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus for granted. Now is the time to renew our awe for what God has done, is doing and promises to do for us and through us. May God bless every Epiphany you are called to throughout 2010.






