
First Presbyterian Church

MEET LIZ SMITH & LEON COODY

Have you had the opportunity to meet Liz Smith and Leon Coody? If not, you are in for a real treat. This couple has been together twenty-five years next month. They met on the dance floor. Liz tells the story this way. "I was celebrating my 26th birthday and Leon was out with some of his National Guard buddies celebrating the end of summer camp. The place was packed, but I realized that I wasn't being asked to dance, because Leon was standing behind my chair. I asked him, 'If you're not going to ask me to dance, would you please move?' His reply was, 'Nobody in here knows how to dance!' I said, 'Let me show you how to dance.' the rest is history. We have been waltzing ever since."

Liz's full name is Elizabeth Ann Smith. She was born in Leesville into a large family, 14 children, 7 brothers and 6 sisters. Liz was number 10. Just making an observation here---now, how in the world did her mother cook, feed, clean, wash clothes, shop, and manage the house and still have time to have 14 children? Kind of brings to mind Proverbs 31, "Who can find a virtuous woman?"

Liz received her ADN degree in 1981 and BSN from NSU, in 1995. When she was only 15 she started working in a hospital, a trend in her life that eventually led to her becoming an RN. She has been an RN for 29 years.

Leon was in the military for 3 years before joining the National Guard. He attended trade school as an office machines technician and worked full-time job in the National Guard, retiring in 1991 after 23 years. He attended LSUA where he received his ADN degree, then received his BSN degree from NSU. He has been an RN for 19 years.

They enjoy traveling. Liz was a traveling nurse. Once, on a 13-week assignment in Hawaii, she was persuaded to stay longer and work during the Christmas holidays. She told them she wanted to spend the holiday with her husband. The result was they flew Leon to Hawaii and treated him to the sites, plus golf, all for free while Liz was at work. She said, "Next time, he's going to work, and I'm going to have all the fun!"

They enjoy playing golf, reading, working in their yard, and playing with their rat terrier dogs, Lu Ann, 2, and Edie, 4, both are rescue dogs.

Neither Leon or Liz was born into the Presbyterian faith, but Leon "fell in love" with the Presbyterians philosophy and Liz converted when they were married. When I asked them how they felt they could add to or help the growth of this church, their answer was, "By being a good example to the community, and supporting and praying for the elders and our minister. Julia is great! We love her energy and devotion to being a Christ Child."

If you can catch up with this busy, vibrant couple, you will enjoy getting acquainted. They add so much vitality and energy to our congregation. Recently they opened their home to John Martin to live with them while he is recuperating from a broken hip. What a gracious thing to do for a fellow member!


