Luke 2:1-20 (King James Version)

- Donations are coming in for the new Glory to God Hymnals. Jim Hockensmith purchased 10 hymnals. Donations will continue to be accepted until enough hymnals are purchased.

Property Committee Report: Jack Ready

Jack Ready gave a brief update on property matters as follows:

- Playground equipment will be picked by Hope House when their van is repaired.
- Windows and air conditioner have been repaired.
- Plumber has been contacted about restroom repairs.
- Fiberglass doors will cost \$11,000 for two doors. Wood doors will be \$9,000 for all three, but they do not last as long as the fiberglass doors.




