"In Praise of the Absent Minded" Doyle L. Bailey

To be honest with you, I had originally intended to write about something else but I forgot what my subject was. I suppose I was as William James, the great psychologist and philosopher, said: I was "present-minded somewhere else".

All of us are capable of having "junior moments" as well as "senior moments." I you have a good memory, that is good. If you have good memories, that is really good. I actually devote time to improving my memory. There are three secrets to developing a mind with a "steel trap" capability to remember. Unfortunately, I do not remember what they are.

I also devote time to the art of forgetting. My major professor is the Apostle Paul. Here is his thesis:

"Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:13)

When you "mess up," ask God to forgive you and ask any person you have wronged to forgive you and move on with your life. This sin has been forgiven by God, so you should accept it with gratitude and move on from there. In other words, it should be absent from your mind and thinking. That is the best "absentmindedness" of all.

Mark Twain has the final word on absent-mindedness. In his later years he remarked: "When I was younger I could remember anything, whether it had happened or not; but my faculties are decaying now and soon I so shall be so I cannot remember anything but the things that never happened."

In God's forgiveness, He, too, has senior moments. After all, who has been around longer than the Eternal God? In His forgiveness, our sins are passed into oblivion never to be recalled. One thing we should always remember is that our Heavenly Father holds no grudges and treats us as if we had never sinned.

Doyle stated that the processional, recessional and his wearing of a robe during worship service have added to the worship experience. 
