

FROM THE PASTOR ...

Jesus Is the Life of the Party

"Life of the party" may suggest a tipsy wag with a lampshade over his head being foolish in the attempt to inject some "life" into what is in all aspects a boring get-together. Not what I am thinking about Jesus. Remember the wedding in Cana of Galilee when they ran out of wine? What a disaster! Jesus changed all that and to the degree that the Master of Ceremonies exclaimed, "You have saved the best wine until now." I am thinking that the party never really starts until Jesus is there, and He is the one who gives us life.

Israel's Feasts were meant to be feasts of celebration. The Israelites were told to celebrate to Me in the calendar year: "You shall keep the Feast of Unleavened Bread (Passover)...and the Feast of Harvest (Pentecost), the first fruits of your labors which you have sown in the field; and the Feast of Ingathering (Tabernacles), which is at the end of the year, when you have gathered in the fruit of your labors from the field." (Exodus 23: 15-16)

PASSOVER

This was a party/celebration of the deliverance from the Angel of Death that killed the first-born of the Egyptians when Israel was enslaved. Jesus is the fulfillment of our deliverance. The blood of Jesus has marked you for life and that is really something to celebrate.

For, indeed, Jesus is our Passover; He was sacrificed for us. "Therefore, let us keep the feast..."(I Corinthians 5: 7-8). Jesus is the one who enlivens this feast/party.

PENTECOST

Pentecost commemorates the giving of the Law to the Israelites 50 days after the first Passover. (Pentecost means fifty). Acts 2 tells us that 50 days after the crucifixion of Jesus (at Passover), the Holy Spirit descended upon the church in a fulfillment of the Feast of Pentecost, just as God had descended in fire upon the mountain to give His Law.

The promise of God was that He would put His laws in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts. (Jeremiah 31:33). This became a reality when the Holy Spirit descended on the 120 gathered in the upper room, filling them with power truly putting His Law in their hearts. These are only the "first-fruits." The party is just getting started. The best is still to come.

TABERNACLES

This harvest party was also called the "Feast of Ingathering." Deuteronomy 16: 13-15 tells the plan for the party. Everyone was invited, and it lasted 7 days. You will dwell in a booth for seven days so they would remember the days of tents when God brought them out of Egypt.

The Feast of Tabernacles is the key to God releasing His fullness and maturity into His Church. It is a feast/party of joy and release/Exodus. It is a party that celebrates humility, unity and inclusiveness. It represents the ingathering of many lost peoples. It is the celebration of the harvest.

God wants His people to rejoice and serve Him with gladness of heart.

- It is because of the redemptive work of Jesus that there is a party at all.
- It is Jesus who invites everyone to His celebration. It is a "come as you are party." (Just as I am without one plea...).
- It is a party that will not suffer party-poopers, nor will it fizzle out. It cannot, for you see . . . Jesus is the LIFE of the Party.

COMMITTEE REPORTS AND SESSION ACTIONS:

Congregational Life/Christian Education Committee Report: Jim Hockensmith

Wednesday night dinners and program are on hold until September 2. The choir will continue to rehearse on Wednesdays.

<u>Motion</u>: That the Session approve suspending Wednesday night dinners and program until September 2.

Evangelism, Worship, and Mission Committee Report:

The Session discussed the need to consider changing the FPC Mission Statement to enable the church to find someone suitable for our church/situation. The Session also discussed going with month to month arrangements.

Motion: That the Session approve changing the FPC Mission Statement.

Personnel Committee Report: None

Property Committee Report:

The Session appointed a Task Force consisting of Jim Smolenski, Jack Ready and Roger Best. They will explore different options regarding the future for First Presbyterian, e.g., partner with another church or sell the church building and grounds, etc.

Motion: That the Session approve the appointment of the Task Force members, and accept its report when presented.

Moved: Jim Hockensmith Seconded: Elizebette Kennedy Motion: Carried

The Session discussed the HVAC thermostat issue in the church and the increase in utility costs during the summer months. Doyle Bailey suggested that an energy efficiency study be conducted. The thermostat is programmable, but, if someone changes it, the whole program is voided and requires re-setting. The possibility of a lock box on the thermostat was also discussed.

Pastor's/Moderator Report:

The Session discussed salary for a part-time pastor of \$15,000 to \$20,000. The church may also need to pay in for medical and pension costs for this person. The Session discussed the need to state clearly the expectations for visitations, funerals, weddings, Wednesday night program and Sunday worship.

Old Business:

The Session discussed the possibility of selling the archery equipment, which cost the church around \$5,000 when purchased. Jim Smolenski agreed to look into selling the equipment.

Motion: That the Session approve selling the archery equipment at the best possible price.

Moved: Elizebette Kennedy Seconded: Jim Hockensmith Motion: Carried

Adjournment:

Motion: That the Session Meeting be adjourned.

The Stated Meeting of the Session adjourned with a closing prayer. The next Stated Meeting of the Session will be June 15, 2015.


