### A DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT. . .

### A SEASON OF THANKS By Kelly McFadden

All your words are true; all your righteous laws are eternal.

Psalms 119:160

This holiday season, you will most likely hear the song "My Favorite Things" from the Broadway musical *The Sound of Music.* To me this song has always felt out of place during the holidays, until recently. I have begun to hear it in a new light, recognizing the famous list of "favorite things" as a list of reasons to be thankful. The character, Maria, who sings this song, thinks about her list of favorite things when she seeks comfort.

Christians have a list as well. Found in the Bible are promises from our Lord - keepsakes we can cling to at all times including periods of worry, trouble, or despair. These promises urge Christ-followers not to be troubled or to feel alone. They are words offering great hope because they are not the words of mere men. They are inspired, never-changing words given to us from our Savior and Lord. Read through a few of these promises:

The Lord will give His people strength. Psalm 29:11 The Lord hears our cries. Psalm 34:17

The Lord will give you the desires of your heart. Psalm 37:4-5

The Lord will answer when you call to Him. Jeremiah 33:3

You need not be afraid. God is with you. Isaiah 41:13

The Lord had given us His Spirit to guide us. Acts 1:8

### **Property Committee Report: Jack Ready**

Jack Ready gave a brief update on air conditioner problems, and reported that a temporary fix had been made costing \$472.30. He then made the following motion:

Jack Ready noted that the glass doors need to be changed to decrease the risk for glass damage. He also pointed out that the wood on the doors is rotten, and all six doors need to be replaced. Jack Ready will get a price/quote for repairs and report back to the Session for approval.

### Pastor's/Moderator Report: Ron Sutto

Ron Sutto reported that he has had a conversation with Joel about part time work. He is still waiting for an email.

#### **Old Business:**

Supply Pastor: The Session will check with Jim Heath to fill the pulpit vacancies for October and November, 2015.

Budget Matters: Jim Smolenski reported that utilities are averaging \$758 per month. Property maintenance is on target. Total expenses year-to-date are under budget, and overall the budget is doing better than expected.

The Church is thankful for the many contributions made in memory of Doris Hockensmith. Doris touched the lives of many people, and she will be missed.

#### **New Business:**

Hope House needs cleaning supplies. Donation boxes will be put out for contributions. Hope House also needs playground equipment.

The Session discussed the closing of the Shepherd Center. This item will need to come off the budget. The Session approved separating the missions in the budget to keep a record of payments for each individual mission for future reference.


