

FROM THE PASTOR . . .

On Wednesday, March I, we will observe Ash Wednesday. We will have two services here at our church: one at noon and one at 6:00 P.M. A light meal consisting of soup, salad, and dessert will be served along with bread or crackers, tea, and coffee.

As we begin the Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday, it gives us a unique opportunity to reflect upon our mortality. When the ashes are applied to our foreheads in the shape of the cross and we hear the words: "From dust you have come--and to dust you shall return"--each of us is reminded of the biblical truth that one day we shall die.

As Christians, we are not morbid. But we are realists. We do not deny the reality of our mortality. Ash Wednesday is a powerful reminder that our time on earth is limited.


Part of our acknowledging that we are made of dust is also to admit that we are sinful, that we miss the mark, that we mess up, and are in need of a Saviour. And so the days of Lent help us to face up in a more disciplined way our tendencies to wander away from our Lord of love and to insist on living our lives according to our selfish inclinations.

However, as we move steadily toward the somber mood of Good Friday, that day on which the innocent and perfect Lamb of God took upon Himself the full weight of all of our sins, failures, betrayals, selfishness, pride, lust, hypocrisy, and every other thing we: have done/ are doing/ or will do which breaks the heart of a totally loving and holy God, we begin to sense how serious our sinfulness is in the eyes of God.

It seems to me that while repentance, confession, and other spiritual disciplines are especially emphasized during the Lenten Season, the brilliant light of the Resurrection Morning is never too far removed from our vision. For the climax of all the fasting, facing our mortality, confessing our sins, and even going with Jesus to the cross at Calvary is to celebrate the wonderful and unspeakable joy that on the third day which we call Easter Sunday, we experience a RISEN AND LIVING SAVIOUR. HE LIVES!!! HE LIVES!!! AND BECAUSE HE LIVES, WE TOO SHALL LIVE--even AFTER **RETURNING TO THE DUST!!!**

Please pray with me and with one another that this Lenten Season will be a season of unparalleled renewal for all of us in First Presbyterian Church!


