

### FROM THE PASTOR . . .

Do you know that a well can go dry? I had always assumed that once a well of water was in place and was providing water, that it could always be counted on to do so.

But I learned recently that such is not necessarily the case. In <u>The Kingdom Within</u>, John A. Sanford tells about such a well. It was the source of water for a summer home in Massachusetts which he and his family visited when he was a young boy.

After his father was able to provide running water from a new well that was drilled, the old well was covered up and was not used any longer. After a few years, John decided to remove the cover from the old well that his family used to enjoy. He fully expected to see a pool of water at the bottom. However, he was shocked to see only a huge pile of dust.

Being confused by this turn of events, he began to inquire into what made the well which once provided such cool, clear, fresh drinking water completely dry up. He learned that this particular well depended upon many little rivulets in the earth beneath it. And as long as the water was taken out of the well, the little rivulets stayed open and the water flowed freely to provided a continuous source of water. But if the well were not used and the rivulets were not needed, then their openings closed up and over a period of time, the well would run bone dry. The well ran dry not because there was no water but because it was not being used.

In a similar manner, Sanford goes on to point out that the same thing can happen to our souls and to our churches. The water (a metaphor for God) may be present in great abundance. However, if we are not making use of the water, then our souls, and our churches will inevitably dry up.

So, how can we be sure that we are using the water and keeping the flow of God's life-giving Spirit running freely and not running the risk of drying up?

Well, we need to remind ourselves to keep on doing the basics of the Christian life: Corporate Worship, Bible Study, Prayer, Giving, Listening, Fellowshipping with God's People, Reading Spiritually Nurturing Materials, Remaining Open to the Spirit's Leadership, and Serving God by Serving Others!

May all of us commit ourselves to our Lord Jesus Christ and seek His Help in being sure we use the water both for ourselves as individual believers and together as the Body of Christ!

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS AND SESSION ACTIONS:**

### Congregational Life/Christian Education, Evangelism, Worship & Missions Committee Report

Pastor Jane Conerly explained the review of the minutes of Woodland Presbyterian, Pineville and First Presbyterian, Alexandria, to be in compliance with PSL guidelines. The review was conducted by Barbara Breedlove, Clerk of Woodland Presbyterian and Carolyn Sterne, Administrative Assistant of First Presbyterian, Alexandria.

### **Personnel Committee Report: By Bill Higgins**

The Session discussed the number of Northwestern Students in the choir and the limited FPC budget funds. Each student gets a scholarship of \$30 for a regular Sunday Service and \$40 for Special Music Concerts. The church enjoys the music program and does not want to limit the number of students, but will need to find additional funds if the scholarship program continues. Bill Higgins suggested "Adopt-A-Choir-Member" where congregational members give an offering to pay for a choir member for a particular Sunday. A special additional offering or a fund raiser might help offset the cost. Perhaps some budget cuts could be made, but the current FPC budget cannot continue to fund 8 choir members every Sunday.

In response to a need for more *Glory to God* Hymnals, Bill Higgins offered to donate 10 hymnals to help with the shortage. He will arrange to have them ordered through the church office.

### **Property Committee Report:**

The Session will check with Paul Cantrell about his estimate to repair the leaks around the hallway windows for \$1,032.00. This estimate was approved in the February Session Meeting.

### Pastor's/Moderator Report: By Dr. Jim Heath

Dr. Jim Heath reported a positive attitude and optimistic outlook in the membership along with a steadily improving attendance. The farewell luncheon for Liz Magee was a well received, with 42 in attendance. He thanked everyone who helped make it so successful. Two new ministries have begun: Lynn Pilcher is teaching Youth Sunday School and Kate Bladen started a Ladies' Prayer Ministry on Saturday mornings.

### **Old Business:**

The Session reviewed the Red River Bank Certificate of Deposit Renewal (a 12-month CD).

**Motion:** The Session approved the renewal of the Red River Bank Certificate of Deposit for an additional year.

#### **New Business:**

The Session discussed Easter Sunday activities. The Pastor's Advisory Committee is planning a brunch from 9:45 am to 10:45 am on Easter Sunday morning. FPC does not have enough small children for an Easter Egg Hunt.

The Session discussed ways to publicize the need to help Kylie LaPrairie, granddaughter of Dee Sutro, to attend the River Oaks Art Center Art Camp June 12-16 this summer. She needs some scholarship help from FPC members to pay the \$150 fee as well as transportation to and from the Art Camp.

Pastor Jane Conerly reported that she will be unable to attend the May 15, 2017 Session Meeting.




