

FROM THE PASTOR . . .

Summer seems to already be upon us. We are not accustomed to these high temperatures so early in June, are we? Is there anything positive to be said for the heat we are encountering?

When we stop to think about it, we use the temperatures as metaphors for various actions. For example, we may speak of someone being given "the cold shoulder" to express a rather unfriendly and even rude reception. Or, we may refer to someone being "extremely warm" to express their friendly, kind, and accepting attitude.

When individuals are extremely zealous in their Christian faith, we may say of them that they are "on fire for God." Or if someone has drifted far from the Lord and has lost the joy of their salvation, we may speak of his/her "growing cold in their love for God."

Organizations, businesses, institutions, and churches also develop reputations and are often referred to with these temperature metaphors. For example, a church may be spoken of as warm and friendly or cold and distant. Much of this depends upon how people perceive their being welcomed or greeted by the people who make up the church. I would like to thank you for going out of your way to greet any visitors who come our way. We need to always make sure that they are welcomed by as many as possible and made to feel at home.

So, how do we read our spiritual temperature? Hot? Cold? Warm? Cool? Lukewarm?

And how do we read the spiritual temperature of our church?

What adjustments would we need to make to improve either our individual or our church's temperature?

Paul wrote these important words to Timothy: "For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline."

Could it be that we need to fan into flame the gift of God which is within us? If we do, then we might feel the spiritual air getting warmer in and around us! Maybe we need to get those fans going!




