FROM THE PASTOR . . .

To understand the true meaning of Christmas, it seems to me that we have to be in touch with the spirit of giving. And that quickly takes us to the heart of God. "For God so loved the world that he gave . . . "

It was God's love that led Him to give to the world the greatest gift ever given, Jesus Christ. And if we want to be in touch with the true spirit of Christmas, we must have something of the same giving spirit as our Lord has. In the book of Acts, Paul quotes Jesus as having said: "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

There is no gift that can compare with the giving of God's Son. Only God could make that special gift in the form of a baby in a barn almost 2,000 years ago. But we can seek to imitate God's unparalleled generosity by giving more generously.

Such giving is not merely monetary in nature. The most important gift that we can give to God is the gift of ourselves. And the most important gift we can give to others is the gift of ourselves. Paul says of the Macedonian Christians in 2 Corinthians 8 that "they gave themselves first to the Lord." What a compliment to those early followers of Jesus!

To be sure, the giving of presents reflects something of the true giving associated with Christmas. But the giving of ourselves still outranks the materialistic gifts we may offer to others.

To give of ourselves is far more costly than gifts we can buy in stores.

To give of ourselves has to do with giving to another quality time, personal interest, true listening, and making ourselves available to help in any way possible. This requires the investment of time, energy, a willingness to be flexible, and a true desire to assist in tangible ways.

Maybe this Christmas, we could try (along with the presents we give) to give of ourselves in a more genuine and deeper way.

On that first Christmas night almost 2,000 years ago, God gave of Himself in a totally unselfish and generous way. Jesus Christ was truly God's "unspeakable gift." No words are adequate to describe that unique gift.

And throughout Jesus' earthly life and ministry, Jesus incarnated that unselfish, self-giving manner of living and investing in the lives of his disciples and the many individuals to whom he ministered in some way.

The model given to us in the greatest gift of all, Jesus Christ, is the model for us to follow as we relate to family members, friends, and to all with whom we come in contact.

When we follow His example, not only do we bless others more richly; we also enlarge ourselves by giving in a more Christlike manner.

May we strive this Christmas to follow the pattern Jesus gave us as we give to others more completely of ourselves--and not just our presents.


