

#### FROM THE PASTOR ...

In the great love chapter, I Corinthians 13, Paul concludes by saying: "So these three things continue forever: faith, hope, and love. And the greatest of these is love." (The Everyday Bible)

Let's think about each one of these virtues as it relates to our church.

Every Sunday, as a congregation, we stand and recite together as an affirmation of our faith "The Apostles Creed." It begins with the words: "I believe." The Creed goes on to enumerate the objects of our belief, namely, God the Father, Jesus Christ his only Son, and the Holy Ghost.

The word, "believe", for much of our society has to do with intellectual agreement or mental assent. But in the Bible, the word has to do most often with personal trust. So when we quote a verse like John 3:16, the word "believe" does not mean simply that we intellectually agree that Jesus is God's Son and the giver of eternal life. Rather, it means that we personally trust Jesus, God's only Son, as our Savior.

You, see, for there to be a meaningful ongoing relationship between us and God, we must daily place our personal trust in Jesus. There is a world of difference between just giving our mental assent to the truth that Jesus is God's Son and trusting Him as our personal Savior and Lord.

The second thing which Paul said continues forever is "hope." When we come together as a congregation to worship, we hope to truly encounter the living God. At the top of the front cover of each Sunday's bulletin, we see: "A Service for the Worship of God."

As we leave the worship service each Sunday, it is our hope that in the coming week we will be instruments of God's love as we live out our faith in our deeds, our words, and our relationships.

Also, we place our hope in our risen Lord to send new people our way to worship with us and to join us in being a community of faith, hope, and love. Even though our numbers may be small on some Sundays, we hope that God will help us to be faithful and that He will continue to assist us in being a lighthouse for Him in our community.

The third lasting value Paul enumerates is love. And he says that of the three, love is the greatest. When we worship as part of the Body of Christ on Sundays, we confess our love for God and for one another. We are a community of faith bound together with one another and with our Master, Jesus Christ. Our distinguishing mark is love.

We love Jesus Christ for the great love He showed in coming to this earth as God in the flesh to reveal who God really is and to give His life sacrificially for our salvation.

We love one another as fellow believers aware that Jesus said that the way the world will know that we belong to Him is by the fact that we love one another.

May the Holy Spirit help us in living out the faith, hope, and love which He has so freely imparted to us.

I would like to thank you for the vacation time which you allow me both in the fall and spring. I will be out for vacation September 2-15.






