

Happy Summer Everyone! It seems that as soon as summer starts schedules begin to change and new priorities set in. I have spoken with many school teachers over the years who look forward to their summer break to catch up on all the things that have been neglected during the rest of year. In general, life has a tendency to move at a slower pace during the summer – partly because of the heat, I'm sure!

Summer in the Church can be very similar. We are no longer celebrating Advent, or Lent, or Easter, or Pentecost – there is no major season to prepare for. We call this time in the Church "Ordinary Time." This can be a time to slow down a bit, and focus on *living* the Gospel. "Ordinary" does not mean uneventful or bland; instead "Ordinary" means living a daily life focused on Christ. It is a time in the Church when we are reminded that we don't always need to celebrate high, holy days (i.e. Christmas, Easter) to live as Christians.

This summer we are going to "shake up" Ordinary time, and do something exciting together as a church. On July 11th we will begin a church-wide study based on the book *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations* by Robert Schnase. This is a great study, and it will help us to understand who we are as church. This study will also challenge us to respond to the Gospel message and live out our faith in new ways as a congregation. I pray that you will feel called to participate in this adventure of faith, and allow God to transform you in the process. May God's great love overwhelm you this month as you seek to serve HIM!


