# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR, CHRIS JOINER

Inspiring, Forming, Nurturing...Faith



Sometimes you need just the right word. Over the last year as our session has prayerfully deliberated revising our church's Mission Statement based on what we heard and discerned in a series of congregational gatherings, these three words have kept coming up. We are a church that sees its mission as inspiring faith, forming faith, and nurturing faith.

# Inspiring

When we speak of inspiration, we usually mean that something or someone has acted on us in such a way that we are "inspired." We talk about reading an

inspirational book, or watching an inspirational movie, or being inspired by another person's action. When my wife Kim had some medical issues a few years ago and completely changed her diet, she inspired me to do the same. I saw what a difference it made to her health and I wanted the same experience.

If we are a community that inspires faith, we are a place where all people, young and old, no matter their background, can find inspiration to live lives of faith in the world. That inspiration comes from so many places within the church, but I believe the primary source of inspiration we feel and seek to pass on is the Spirit of the risen Christ.

# Forming

Last Sunday we confirmed twenty sixth graders, reaffirming the baptismal vows of eighteen of them, and baptizing two. But in true First Presbyterian fashion, they participated actively in the service of worship in which they were confirmed. The students wrote and led the liturgy, led portions of the music, and served in a variety of ways in the service. I know of no better sign of the mission of this church to form faith than the sight of these thoughtful, engaged, faith-filled students leading us in worship.

Faith formation happens in everything we do – from Sunday morning classes, worship, Sunday night events, Wednesday Night Live, and so many others. Every ministry that we lead is an answer to the question, "How can we, by God's grace, form faith through this program?"

# Nurturing

The word "nurturing" conjures images of home for many people - a place where we hopefully feel safe, where we can be ourselves, ask hard questions, and do the sometimes hard work of loving one another. First Presbyterian seeks to create this kind of nurturing community, where faith can flourish. So many of our ministries are designed to create a nurturing space where people of all ages can come together in a safe place and learn what it means to love one another the way Christ loves us.

These are the right words to me. They describe our community. They challenge our community. First Presbyterian Church – Inspiring, forming, nurturing faith. Which one do you think best describes us? Or would you choose another?

Regardless of the words we use to name our mission, I feel blessed to be able to share in it with you.

# FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC, MICHAEL P. SNODDY TO CREATE - TO PRAY

I have recently been reading Daniel Wolpert's text entitled *Creating a Life with God*, and wanted to offer the following reflections regarding creativity and worship. In his text Wolpert writes:

Since prayer connects us to God, creativity, as it connects us to the creative power of God, becomes prayer. This is the nature of life with God. Our experience of the Holy naturally leads beyond ourselves as God seeks to use us to show the power of divine love to others. As we turn in prayer to God, the great Creator who made heaven and earth, we become vessels of creative energy and desire. We long to give expression to the gift we have received, and as we do so, the act of creation becomes a prayer in itself, a way to seek union with the One who sustains our very being.

The scriptures present God's ability to create the world out of nothing as a fundamental characteristic of God. We read about it first in the opening passages of Genesis and see the aspect of God lifted up again and again throughout our sacred texts. Creativity is a sign that God is God; no one else can create as God creates.

As we begin to understand creativity as prayer, we can bring our attention to the times when we are already creative, and we can notice God in many areas of our lives. Because the Word of God continues into infinity, we become fountains of living water once we tap into that boundless source of sustained creativity.

# **CONFIRMATION EMBLEM, CLASS OF 2014**

Every January, the Confirmands and their Covenant Partners gather for a retreat to learn about living as a disciple. One of the retreat activities involves the Confirmands working in small groups. They study scriptures about the disciples and discipleship, and then interpret those scriptures in the form of posters. The posters are typically deeply symbolic and display theological concepts in very creative ways.

The emblem on today's bulletin cover is a compilation of symbols from each group's poster. The symbols represent key concepts important to discipleship:

Encircling Hands—God continues to work actively in creation. We share in that work through faithful discipleship.

Water—Baptism is the sign of God's covenant with God's people.

World—The Gospel of Jesus Christ is for the whole world.

People—Discipleship is strengthened and nurtured in community with other believers.

Path—Faith and discipleship are life-long journeys.

Cross—We follow Jesus Christ, our Teacher, Lord and Savior. Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

Heart—Out of gratitude for God loving us, we act with love for others.


