

Be Intentional with a “White Tissue Gift!”

In celebration of First Presbyterian Church's 150th birthday, we will revisit the 1940's tradition of giving "white gifts" as a part of this year's Intentional Christmas. Canned goods and other supplies were wrapped in white tissue paper, brought to the front of the sanctuary on Christmas Eve and then given to local charities. This year the "white gifts" tradition will be celebrated in two ways, both benefitting the Salina Area Emergency Aid/Food Bank:



1. Donate a "white gift." Wrap items in white tissue paper and bring to the front of the sanctuary during Advent.. Children will come forward during the 5:00 pm Christmas Eve service with their "white tissue gifts."
2. Contribute monetarily and help FPC reach a \$5,000 goal towards giving hope to those in crisis. As of the today, **FPC has surpassed the \$5,000 goal! \$5,120 has been contributed to the Emergency Aid/Food Bank, but let's keep going!**

Mid & Senior High Christmas Service Project!

Hope that you saw the FPC youth group mentioned in the Salina Journal for our Christmas Service Project. The youth group joined forces with the Take Charge Challenge and put together 250 weatherization kits (reusable bags provided by Westar & supplies were purchased at a discount from True Value) to be distributed at no cost to low-income neighborhoods around Salina.

Almost **30 youth** came together on Wednesday night and assembled the kits full of energy-saving tools like caulk to seal drafty windows and CFL bulbs to replace old, inefficient light bulbs.

This is a great opportunity for the youth to help out our neighbors, especially those who are struggling to pay their energy bills this season.

Salina is competing against Quinter, Merriam, Mount Hope/Haven, Wellington and Kinsley in the Take Charge Challenge – a friendly competition to reduce their electricity use over one year, beginning this month. The town that wins the Take Charge Challenge will receive a Wind for Schools turbine, solar panels for a civic building or cash to complete a civic energy efficiency project.

The youth were also able to view a documentary called "Renewal" which offers a comprehensive overview of what different religious communities are doing about the devastation of the Earth's life systems. It has great stories about the religious-environmental movement and explains how energy issues are social justice issues as well. 

Wednesday programs and WOW resume on January 6, 2010!

International Mission**News** by Shannon Rayl

Deaf and orphaned children at Humble Hearts School in Nairobi, Kenya, moved out of their grossly over-crowded, leaky, tin building last month and into a brand new "Angel Cottage." First Presbyterian Church has donated \$5,000.00 this year towards the project as a part of our support of International Mission.

Construction of the new Angel Cottage began in 2007, but a drastic increase in construction costs and the falling value of the dollar slowed its progress. The new home will provide 80 children with a family environment and an opportunity to learn and grow into self-sufficient adults.

The first Angel Cottage was built in 2005. It provided a home for orphans and deaf students who attend Humble Hearts School. In Kenya, special education for deaf orphans and children living in extreme poverty is frequently impossible. Humble Hearts was founded by an organization called Angel Covers to provide deaf children in Nairobi an opportunity to attend school.

Former Salinan Kari Fillmore, daughter of First Presbyterian members Norm and Kristy Yenkey, is one of the original founders of Angel Covers and currently serves as executive director of the organization. Kari recently answered questions about Angel Covers.



Question: How has the money that First Presbyterian Church donated made a difference in the lives of children?

The money that FPC has donated to Angel Covers has made an amazing difference. Primarily, these funds have been used to supplement the nutrition program at Humble Hearts. These kids are getting healthy food (fruit, Ensure, rice, beans, and vegetables) on a consistent basis. Money from FPC has also been used to help the Huabei nutrition program (Huabei Social Welfare Institute is an orphanage in China). These children have received surgeries and overall have been healthier because of the extra rice cereal and formula they receive from this program.

Question: How has attending Humble Hearts School changed the lives of the children who attend?

Many of the deaf children attending HH were never allowed to attend school. They were considered not educable and were sometimes even locked in a room so as not to scare others. These children are now learning a language and dreaming of becoming whatever they want to be. Stereotypes about the deaf are being changed because these children are returning home and telling family, friends and neighbors about all that is happening at the school. There is a waiting list of hearing children who want into this free school, and hearing children are learning sign language as well.

Question: What are Angel Covers most urgent needs?

Angel Covers is always looking for sponsors in our Mama's Wish program and the Huabei nutrition program. Both of these projects are in China.

Mama's Wish sends girls to high school and college. Currently, there are 100 girls in this program. The Huabei nutrition program provides supplemental food to children in the Huabei, Anhui Orphanage in China. Formula and rice cereal provided to these children makes a huge difference in their health.

This program needs approximately \$25 per child per month.

The Old and New Testaments, which together bear witness to God's self-revelation in history and the creation of a people to tell the Story of God to the world.

ON THE 3RD DAY OF CHRISTMAS MY TRUE LOVE GAVE TO ME... THREE FRENCH HENS

The Three Theological Virtues: 1) Faith, 2) Hope, and 3) Love (1 Corinthians 13:13)

ON THE 4TH DAY OF CHRISTMAS MY TRUE LOVE GAVE TO ME... FOUR CALLING BIRDS

The Four Gospels: 1) Matthew, 2) Mark, 3) Luke, and 4) John, which proclaim the Good News of God's reconciliation of the world to Godself in Jesus Christ.

ON THE 5TH DAY OF CHRISTMAS MY TRUE LOVE GAVE TO ME... FIVE GOLD RINGS

The first Five Books of the Old Testament, known as the Torah or the Pentateuch: 1) Genesis, 2) Exodus, 3) Leviticus, 4) Numbers, and 5) Deuteronomy, which gives the history of humanity's sinful failure and God's response of grace in the creation of a people to be a light to the world.

ON THE 6TH DAY OF CHRISTMAS MY TRUE LOVE GAVE TO ME... SIX GESE A-LAYING

The six days of creation that confesses God as Creator and Sustainer of the world (Genesis 1).

The eight Beatitudes: 1) Blessed are the poor in spirit, 2) those who mourn, 3) the meek, 4) those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, 5) the merciful, 6) the pure in heart, 7) the peacemakers, 8) those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake. (Matthew 5:3-10)

ON THE 9TH DAY OF CHRISTMAS MY TRUE LOVE GAVE TO ME... NINE LADIES DANCING

The nine Fruit of the Holy Spirit: 1) love, 2) joy, 3) peace, 4) patience, 5) kindness, 6) generosity, 7) faithfulness, 8) gentleness, and 9) self-control. (Galatians 5:22)

ON THE 10TH DAY OF CHRISTMAS MY TRUE LOVE GAVE TO ME... TEN LORDS A-LEAPING

The ten commandments: 1) You shall have no other gods before me; 2) Do not make an idol; 3) Do not take God's name in vain; 4) Remember the Sabbath Day; 5) Honor your father and mother; 6) Do not murder; 7) Do not commit adultery; 8) Do not steal; 9) Do not bear false witness; 10) Do not covet. 




These Days is a devotional that is printed quarterly and can be found on the information table in the hallway on the first floor.
