

From our pastor . . . Happy New Year to all of you! 2012 has been a great year in the life of our congregation, and I have equally high hopes for the year that is now beginning. It is my prayer that 2013 will bring blessings of health, happiness, faith, hope and love to you and your family.

As we begin this new year together, we have much to anticipate as a community of faith. On December 11, 2012, the session unanimously voted to move forward with a capital campaign to prepare ourselves for a new era of ministry in Rocky Mount. For many years, our congregation has been a leader in Christian service and outreach throughout our city and beyond. Our mission, as we see it, is "to joyfully bring the community to the church and the church to the community." The successful pursuit of such a mission requires that we have a safe, welcoming and efficient headquarters for ministry — a place to which the community can joyfully be brought and a place from which we can go out in joyful service to that community. Our buildings, having been used for these purposes for many years, are aging. This capital campaign will allow us to complete much-needed repairs to those buildings to preserve them and upgrade them for continued outreach in our community. A key focus in this repair effort will be improvement of our existing heating and air conditioning system throughout our facility.

While these improvements are badly needed and are important to the future of our church, the session wanted to make it clear that something else is even more important. As they elected to move forward with this campaign, the elders chose to give top priority not to buildings, bricks and mortar, but to the reason we have buildings, bricks and mortar in the first place. As children of the living God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob have done for thousands of years, our elders voted to allocate the first ten percent of all funds raised in this campaign to mission and outreach. In other words, we will set aside a tithe from this campaign for active ministry in the name of Christ --money that will be used to feed the hungry, care for the sick, give shelter to the homeless, and nurture the children of God. A majority of this mission fund will be designated for local ministry.

The capital campaign is now in the planning stages and will unfold more completely in the coming months. I am thrilled to say that we are off to a great start, because Wicky Thorpe and John Turnage have agreed to serve as cochairs of the campaign. Randy and Sally Adams have also agreed to co-chair the communications committee, so you will be hearing more from them very soon. All of the wonderful work that has been completed thus far has been done under the wise and pastoral leadership of our campaign consultant, John Bush. Many of you have already spent some time with John in informational sessions, so you have experienced his warmth and expertise first hand. I am very comfortable with and confident in John's ability to run this campaign efficiently and effectively, and that is a blessing for all of us.

I expect great things to come to fruition in this new year. We have come a long way as a church in this community over the years, but there is still much work to be done. As it is written in the epistle of 2nd Timothy, may we continue in what we have learned and firmly believed, remembering from whom we have learned it. May God continue to train us in righteousness and equip us for every good work. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, may we continue to proclaim the message, being persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable. And in all of this, may God richly bless this community of faith.

IN THE SESSION

Here is a sampling of the business that came before your session in December:

- New officers read their faith statements, were examined by the session, and were approved for active service with enthusiasm and appreciation. Ordination and installation is set for January 6, 2013.
- John Bush, our capital campaign consultant, reported on the results of his preliminary interviews with members of the congregation. His findings were very positive and supportive.
- The Administration Committee moved that the church proceed with a \$900,000 capital campaign, which would prioritize heating and air conditioning needs and provide for a tithe of 10% for mission and outreach. After making one amendment, the session unanimously approved this recommendation. The capital campaign will begin in earnest this month.
- The Administration Committee also moved the approval of a new family leave policy and certain corresponding changes to the existing maternity/ paternity leave policy. These changes, with one amendment, were unanimously approved.
- The request of the Outreach Committee that First Sunday offerings in June and July of 2013 would benefit the United Community Ministries shelter was approved.
- A fundraising lunch by the Boy Scouts following Scout Sunday on February 10, 2013, was approved.
- A request from Presbyterian Women to hold a blanket drive and fundraiser to support the work of Church World Service this month was approved.
- The session elected to close the church office on Monday, December 31st as a holiday gift to the staff.
