Toy and Game Drive to Help Unaccompanied, Detained Children

350 unaccompanied girls and boys – mostly from Central America – are being detained along the México-United States border each day. Over the past 8 months, over 50,000 unaccompanied minors have been detained. The situation is now considered a humanitarian crisis within our nation's borders. With the hope that the Lutheran community will join in, First Trinity is collecting funds for games, toys, Spanish books and Bibles this Sunday for the unaccompanied Central American boys and girls aged 10-17 who are being detained as minors in Nogales Arizona.
