# Dear Church Family,

A few weeks ago, three men from our Church Leadership Council traveled to Washington, D.C. to attend a "9Marks Weekender" conference. 9Marks is a ministry dedicated to building healthy churches, so the weekend was jam-packed with the opportunity for our leaders to participate in and observe an elders meeting, new members classes, worship services, ministry seminars, a members meeting, and staff meetings. The group came back with dozens of ideas for how we can improve ministry at Christ Community in the days ahead. As Grant Stauter was filling me in on the weekend, he commented that he was impressed

with many areas of the ministry at Capitol Hill Baptist Church, the home church of 9Marks, but there was one small take-away that stuck out to him: Though there were 950 members in the church, and hundreds in attendance at

the members' meeting and worship services, they all seemed to sure that your home is impeccably clean if you're hosting. Our know each other's names. It was a big church, yet it felt like a small family.

A close-knit family culture in a church of almost a thousand members doesn't happen coincidentally. Rather, the church has prioritized loving one another well and has intentionally sought to cultivate relationships over time. The elders of the church regularly visit with members and pray through their church directory, new members are introduced to the congregation through a variety of means, and church members frequently share meals together. Without intentionality, growing churches can easily become a place of drive-thru spirituality where individuals miss out on the richness of the fellowship of believers.

There are thousands of ways to invest in the church family, but there are two simple steps that each of us can take immediately to contribute to the health of the family at Christ Community. First, if you have not done so already, please consider getting your photo taken for the church directory. We've tried to make the directory as simple as possible by regularly having a camera set up in the west foyer for new additions. You can utilize the directory on a Sunday morning before church to learn a new name, after church to remember the name that you've forgotten, or as a means of praying for the church family. Simply access the directory at the church website using the password "\*\*\*\*\*\*\*." Most of all, as you learn the names of others, make an effort during coffee fellowship to branch out and form new friendships in the church family.

Secondly, I want to urge you to sign up for One Another Meals

At Home which will now be occurring quarterly in the homes of various church members. You can sign up at the table located in the main fover and you will be contacted once a quarter by a meal host. Then you'll gather together with eight to ten others from

# **Under Preschool Age**

JAM (Jesus and Me) is for preschool-age children. They meet every Sunday morning during the 9 a.m. worship service. JAM includes singing, Bible teaching, Scripture memory, and other activities intended to foster joyful worship among our children. Becky Roth serves as our JAM coordinator.

# **Kids & Adults**

Our **Sunday School** offers classes for all ages at 10:30. An adult early bird class at 8:30 meets periodically. Nursery is provided for children not yet in preschool. Sunday School follows the local school calendar and provides an opportunity to grow in knowledge of God's Word. Each Spring, we offer a 4-week book study for adults to read and discuss during School School.
