


## Healing Conference

*The Healing Power of Jesus* four-session seminar with Dr. Stephen Seamands will be hosted Nov. 6-7 at Mooresville First United Methodist Church in Mooresville, Ind. Seamands currently serves as professor of Christian Doctrine at Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Ky. Prior to assuming a teaching position at the seminary in 1983, he was pastor of United Methodist churches in southern New Jersey for eleven years. He is the author of several books including *Ministry in the Image of God: The Trinitarian Shape of Christian Service* (InterVarsity Press, 2005), which received the 2006 *Christianity Today* "Award of Merit" for books in the area of church and pastoral leadership. In recent years, Seamands has developed a particular interest in the areas of emotional healing, spiritual warfare and intercessory prayer. His workshops, "The Healing Power of Forgiveness," and "Overcoming Barriers to Receiving God's Love," which he has presented at scores of churches and conferences, have ministered deeply to the brokenness in people's lives. He is regularly involved in what he describes as "a ministry of healing prayer" to seminary students.

## Life by the Spirit

### **Galatians 5:16-18:**

<sup>16</sup>So I say, live by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the sinful nature. <sup>17</sup>For the sinful nature desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the sinful nature. They are in conflict with each other, so that you do not do what you want. <sup>18</sup>But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under law.

### **And Vs. 22-23**

<sup>22</sup>But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup>gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. <sup>25</sup>Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. <sup>26</sup>Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.

In Galatians, Peter tells us that if we are living by the Spirit, then our life will show the fruit of the spirit, and any sinful desires will conflict with what the Spirit has put in

us. In other words – it should bother us to sin, or see others involved in a sinful act. Of course we're going to sin and fail, but Christ has redeemed us. So if we have accepted Christ as Savior, and made Him Lord of our lives, then our lives should reflect this by our 'fruit'.

In Chapter 6, Paul continues; <sup>8</sup>The one who sows to please his sinful nature, from that nature[a]will reap destruction; the one who sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. <sup>9</sup>Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. <sup>10</sup>Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

So as we examine our own lives, where are we sowing? What are we reaping? And what is our fruit? Let us prayerfully consider how our words, our actions and our time reflect our faith in the Risen Lord. **Peace be with you.**

## UMW Cookie Sale



## Parish Nurse Notes

### Note from Cheryl Howard

***“And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered.” Matthew 10:30***

This biblical reference was made to show how much God cares for us- interestingly, research is now showing that our hair reveals much about our health status.

The upcoming holiday season tends to increase levels of stress- and your hair can tell you how much stress you are experiencing. The hair on your head is dead but the follicle is alive. Cortisol is released into the blood stream and this seeps into the hair follicle from the skin of the scalp. As the hair grows, the cortisol gets trapped and it allows researchers to measure the hormone over time. Hair grows about 0.4 inches (1cm) per month so we have many months worth of records of cortisol! High levels of cortisol, the stress hormone, have been associated with


heart attacks. This simple measurement can show the varying levels of stress you have experienced- this is more reliable than our memories of how stressed we have felt over time.

Hair has been successfully used to measure drug toxicity in infants whose mothers used cocaine or heroin during pregnancy and to measure steroids in body builders. It was then discovered that cortisol levels could also be measured. Cortisol was even found in Peruvian mummies- 1500 years old! This may prove to be an inexpensive and easy tool to discuss chronic stress and its effects on your health. Stay tuned- more research is being conducted.

One of the most common phrases we say to one who is grieving is “How are you, I am so sorry...” however, this may not be helpful- grief hurts, no need to ask.

Decreasing sugar in the diet can lower your blood pressure. It can also lead to weight loss which in turn can decrease your blood pressure.

Flu shots are available- it’s important to all of us for you to get one! If you have any questions or concerns, please call me. If you are allergic to eggs- you cannot take the injectable. If you “typically feel sick” after the shot, ask for one without the preservatives.

Take some time at the Health Bulletin Board in the Hall between the restrooms and Fellowship Hall. Angie Mad-den changes the topics every month, new classes are posted and you can pick up a copy of Care Notes.

Blood Pressure Screenings will be held on the 3rd Sunday of each month from 9:30 until 11:00. The screenings will be done in the room across from the church office, room #144.
